## Seeking to talk with God...

"...prayer should accompany the reading of sacred scripture, so that God and man may talk together...we speak to Him when we pray; we hear Him when we read the divine sayings."

#### Dei Verbum



## Four (sometimes five) Steps...

John of the Cross: "Seek in reading and you will find in meditation; Knock in prayer and it will be opened to you in contemplation."



## 1<sup>st</sup> Reading ~ Lectio

- Silence
- What word or phrase chooses you?
- Share name but no discussion



### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading ~ *Meditatio*

- Silence
- What questions emerge?
- What do you think the text is trying to say?
- Share thoughts name but no discussion



### 3<sup>rd</sup> Reading ~ prayer ~ oratio

- Silence
- Do I see things differently?
- Is God calling me in any way?
- If comfortable, name your prayer aloud



# 4<sup>th</sup> Reading – Contemplation ~ *contemplatio*A time of silent reflection Be still and know that I am God



## Step 5: Incarnatio
