## Morning Drop-off/End of Day Pick-up



Just a reminder to parents that these are busy times and we will do our very best to move traffic along. Please be patient and remember to always drop off and pick up your child close to the curb so that they are not crossing traffic unless you are walking with them. You will also notice that there are additional parking spaces by the kindergarten area which you are more than welcome to use. We have a total of two entrances and exit areas from the back of the school: the one large entrance gate going into the back field which is located right by the play equipment and the small gate by the gym.

## **Busing and Parent Pick-up and Drop-off**

Please contact the school first about any address changes or bus situations. We work closely with the transportation department and most changes to the bus have to be entered into the Edsebli system at school. Please be patient with bus times for pick up and drop off for the first two weeks.

At the beginning of the day, parents can drive up to the front doors of the school to drop off their child(ren). An adult will be there to direct them.



Parents that are getting out of their vehicle to walk their child to the kindergarten area for drop-off will need to park in the side parking lot. Buses will be pulling in and dropping off students at the front of the main entrance. Please do not park in this area so that buses can enter and leave for their next run.

At the end of the day, parents can pick up their child(ren) from the front of the school by parking in the main parking lot and meeting them at the front of the school. Pick-ups will be dismissed at 2:45 pm along with all of the other students in the school. At this time all bus students and walkers will be dismissed. Please make sure you do not block the buses from entering the front of the school.

## **Nutrition and Water Bottle Policy**



A healthy school environment enhances student learning and success, and enhances students' social and emotional well-being. In order to establish this environment and reduce the risks for all students who suffer severe, life threatening allergic reactions (anaphylaxis) to certain foods, Principals and staff must follow the Administrative Guidelines as outlined in the Anaphylaxis Policy 302.1 of the Niagara Catholic District School Board. Therefore, as a reminder to all families that there should be no food items brought to the school for birthdays or holidays (Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day, etc). Any special classroom events will be organized by the teacher.

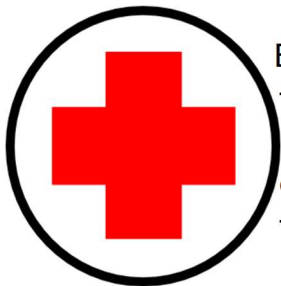

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, I would like to remind you of the new regulations regarding cell phone use that have been implemented in Ontario schools.

To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during instructional time when they are being used for educational purposes as directed by the teacher. Outside of these times, students are expected to keep their phones turned off and stored away unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements. We kindly ask for your support in reinforcing this policy with your children and encouraging them to focus on their studies during school hours.

## **Field Trips**

As we plan and prepare for field trips we remind all families that:

All activities have an inherent risk of injury; this includes activities students take part in on educational field trips. One very important part of effective planning requires that parents be informed of the risks associated with the proposed activity and give permission for their child to participate. This is accomplished by using a Permission/Informed Consent form provided by Niagara Catholic. The purpose of Informed Consent is to demonstrate that the school board acts as “a reasonable and prudent person” in informing the participant and his/her parents that there are inherent risks associated with specific activities, and that certain injuries may result if the student participated. Common risks that are inherent to activities include but are not limited to:

- Collision with natural or man-made objects or other persons; hard surfaces; flying objects;
- physical agility including rapid movements and quick turns and stops;
- Physical exertion;
- Exposure to weather conditions;
- Exposure to vegetation, insects and wildlife;
- Site conditions, e.g., heights, water, equipment, and materials;
- Modes of transportation;
- Failure to remain within designated areas and supervised activities.



Injuries may occur as a result of participating in activities (including recess) that are inherent in the aforementioned risks. Injuries can include but are not limited to bruises, cuts, scrapes, sprains, strains, broken bones, dental injuries, concussions, back and spinal injuries, sunburn, insect bites/stings, serious injury. The risk of sustaining these types of injuries result from the nature of the activity and can occur without any fault of either the student, or the school board, its employees/agents or the facility where the activity is taking place. By choosing to take part in this activity, you are accepting the risk that you/your child may be injured. The chance of an injury occurring can be reduced by carefully following instructions at all times while engaged in the activity. If you choose to attend this field trip /educational activity or recess times, you must understand that you bear the responsibility for any injury that might occur. The Niagara Catholic District School Board does not provide accidental death, disability, dismemberment or medical expense insurance on behalf of the students participating in this activity.
