Just a reminder to parents that these are busy times and we will do our very best to move traffic along. Please be patient and remember to always drop off and pick up your child close to the curb so that they are not crossing traffic.

Busing and Parent Pick-up and Drop-off

Please contact the school first about any address changes or bus situations. We work closely with the transportation department and most changes to the bus have to be entered into the Maplewood system at school. Please be patient with bus times for pick up and drop off for the first two weeks.

At the beginning of the day, parents can drive up to the front doors of the school to drop off their child(ren). An adult will be there to direct them. Parents that are getting out of their vehicle to walk their child to the kindergarten area for drop-off will need to park in the parking lot. Please note that we have limited spaces. Buses will be pulling in and dropping off students at the front of the YMCA entrance. Please do not park in this area so that buses can enter and leave for their next run.







At the end of the day, parents can pick up their child(ren) from the front of the school by parking in the parking lot and meeting them at the front of the school. Pick-ups will be dismissed at 2:45 pm before the buses arrive at 2:55 pm. At this time all bus students and walkers will be dismissed. Please make sure you do not block the buses from entering the front of the school and the YMCA entrance.

PPM 128 - Student Cell Phones

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, I would like to remind you of the new regulations regarding cell phone use that have been implemented in Ontario schools.

To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during instructional time when they are being used for educational purposes as directed by the teacher. Outside of these times, students are expected to keep their phones turned off and stored away unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements. We kindly ask for your support in reinforcing this policy with your children and encouraging them to focus on their studies during school hours.

Your cooperation is essential in helping us maintain a healthy and respectful school environment. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these rules, please do not hesitate to contact the school. Thank you for your understanding and support.

Nutrition and Water Bottle Policy

A healthy school environment enhances student learning and success, and enhances students' social and emotional well-being. In order to establish this environment and reduce the risks for all students who suffer severe, life threatening allergic reactions (anaphylaxis) to certain foods, Principals and staff must follow the Administrative Guidelines as outlined in the Anaphylaxis Policy 302.1 of the Niagara Catholic District School Board and the Nutrition Tools for Schools encourages healthy eating choices and encourages non-food choices as rewards.

Therefore, as a reminder to all families that there should be no food items brought to the school for birthdays or holidays (Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day, etc). Any special classroom events will be organized by the teacher.

ECO Schools - St. Ann Received a Gold for Eco-Initiatives

Niagara Catholic District School Board commit to beginning conversations with cafeteria suppliers at all board sites before their next contract renewal in order to transition from the use of food and beverages packaged in plastic containers, and discontinue the use of single-use plastic utensils and straws at all board sites by September 2023; and

And Niagara Catholic District School Board bans all single-use plastics from all board sites and encourages staff and students to use reusable food and drink containers beginning in September 2022.

As we begin to prepare for the upcoming school year, when the current supply of single-use plastics runs out, no replacements will be ordered. Let's make a difference this year!!







Battery Recycling will continue at the school. All used batteries can be brought to the main office.

<u>Litterless Lunches</u> - When considering packing snacks and lunches, reusable containers are used to reduce the amount of garbage being collected at the school.

<u>Field Trips -</u> As we plan and prepare for field trips we remind all families that: All activities have an inherent risk of injury; this includes activities students take part in on educational field trips. One very important part of effective planning requires that parents be informed of the risks associated with the proposed activity and give permission for their child to participate. This is accomplished by using a Permission/Informed Consent form provided by Niagara Catholic. The purpose of Informed Consent is to demonstrate that the school board acts as "a reasonable and prudent person" in informing the participant and his/her parents that there are inherent risks associated with specific activities, and that certain injuries may result if the student participated. Common risks that are inherent to activities include but are not limited to:

- Collision with natural or man-made objects or other persons; hard surfaces;
- flying objects;
- physical agility including rapid movements and quick turns and stops;
- Physical exertion;
- Exposure to weather conditions;
- Exposure to vegetation, insects and wildlife;
- Site conditions, e.g., heights, water, equipment, and materials;
- Modes of transportation;
- Failure to remain within designated areas and supervised activities.

Injuries may occur as a result of participating in activities that are inherent in the aforementioned risks. Injuries can include but are not limited to bruises, cuts, scrapes, sprains, strains, broken bones, dental injuries, concussions, back and spinal injuries, sunburn, insect bites/stings, serious injury. The risk of sustaining these types of injuries result from the nature of the activity and can occur without any fault of either the student, or the school board, its employees/agents or the facility where the activity is taking place. By choosing to take part in this activity, you are accepting the risk that you/your child may be injured. The chance of an injury occurring







can be reduced by carefully following instructions at all times while engaged in the activity. If you choose to attend this field trip /educational activity, you must understand that you bear the responsibility for any injury that might occur. The Niagara Catholic District School Board does not provide accidental death, disability, dismemberment or medical expense insurance on behalf of the students participating in this activity.

ORANGE SHIRT DAY 2025 – Tuesday, September 30, 2025

Orange Shirt Day is the story of Phyllis Webstad, an Indigenous woman who shared her experience at an Indian Residential School through the children's book, The Orange Shirt Story. By participating in Orange Shirt Day, we recognize the harm done to generations of children by the Indian Residential School system in Canada. The







first Orange Shirt Day occurred on September 30th, 2013 as Chief Fred Robbins saw Phyllis' story as a way of bringing together Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. Since that time, Orange Shirt Day has grown into a national awareness among schools, businesses, and communities.

In June 2021, the Federal Government of Canada designated September 30th as the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation. While this addresses Call to Action #80 of the Truth and Reconciliation 94 Calls to Action, it coincides with an established day that was created by Survivors of Indian Residential Schools. As a Board we can acknowledge the Federal statutory day, but for school and student activities, for the present time, it remains "Orange Shirt Day" as a way of respecting the grass root Indigenous movement.
