DOORS / PROMPT ARRIVAL

As you are aware, the school has a Safe Arrival protocol that requires students, parents and visitors to sign in upon arrival. Our secure door procedures are working well, however, we ask for your assistance to ensure smooth transitions at important parts of the day.

We ask that students arrive on time so that the door buzzers are not interrupting announcements and start of the school day. We also ask for your patience when you are ringing the buzzer. We are unable to immediately respond to you when we are on the phone with another call.

BULLYING AWARENESS AND PREVENTION WEEK

Ontario has designated the week beginning on the third Sunday of **November 18-22** as Bullying Awareness and Prevention Week. During the week, students and school staff and parents/guardians are encouraged to learn more about bullying and its effect on student learning and well-being.

Bullying is defined as a form of REPEATED, persistent and aggressive behavior directed at an individual or individuals that is intended to cause (or should be known to cause) fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is a real or perceived power imbalance.

At St. Augustine Catholic Elementary School, we have implemented within our School Improvement Plan, a School Bullying Prevention and Intervention Plan which promotes a whole-school approach to ensuring a safe, accepting, equitable and inclusive environment, free of bullying, harassment and discrimination.

COLDER WEATHER

November means a time of cold weather and perhaps our first snowfall. Students are asked to remember to dress appropriately for the weather.

ALERT: ANAPHYLAXIS

At the beginning of every school year, we remind all students and parents/guardians of our Board's Anaphylaxis Policy.

At St. Augustine we have Emergency Guidelines, which clearly state what medical procedures must occur for those students who have various life-threatening medical conditions.

We are reminding all students and parents/guardians that we have students in our school who are known to have a potentially life-threatening allergy called Anaphylaxis.

Anaphylaxis is a **severe life threatening form of allergic reaction**. It may begin with severe itching of the eyes or face; a sense of constriction in the throat, then other symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhea and difficulty with breathing may develop. This may lead to coma and **death**.

Foods such as peanuts, other nuts, fish, shellfish, eggs, milk, and wheat as well as insect stings from bees and wasps, latex products and medication, are the most common allergies that produce anaphylaxis.

Anaphylaxis requires **immediate** first aid response and **immediate** medical intervention. If you require any further information contact Mr. Moccia at the school.

SCHOOL SECURITY/SIGN-IN PROCEDURES

As mandated by the Ontario Government Code of Conduct, all schools under the Safe Schools Act are to have Sign-In Procedures in place. The Act also requires school boards to ensure that no one, other than regular school staff and students be allowed to enter a school building without signing in at the Main Office.

For the continued safety of all students, the Niagara Catholic District School Board requires that all elementary school entrances be kept locked during the school day. A card access system was installed by the Board, which will enable staff on outdoor supervision to access the building through the front, rear or side doors. All visitors must use the main entrance, which is now equipped with a video camera, a voice intercom/doorbell panel, and a door release mechanism. All exterior doors at St. Ann will be locked at all times.

All students are required to enter and exit via their assigned doors. If your child arrives after 8:35 a.m., due to an appointment, please have them use the front door to enter the school.

UPCOMING DENTAL SCREENINGS-NOVEMBER 13 REMINDER

As previously communicated, Niagara Public Health Dental program will provide mandatory dental screenings for students in **Kindergarten**, **Grade 2**, **4 and 7 on November 13**.

SAFETY TIPS

Safety Tips to keep our kids safe on the journey to school

Back to school means more children walking or biking to school and bus stops. We thank parents for being mindful of active travelers and obeying the speed limit.

Here are some tips for the safe walk to school:

- Children under 10 years old should cross the street with an adult. Every child is different, but developmentally, it can be hard for kids to judge speed and distance of cars until age 10.
- Talk to your kids about how to be safe and aware while walking.
- Tell kids to look left, right and left again when crossing the street. Teach them to never run or dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
- Remind kids to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them and to watch out for cars that are turning or backing up.
- It's always best to walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Cross streets at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Most injuries happen mid-block or someplace other than intersections.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR ECO TEAM:

Waste-Free Lunch Day - Wednesday, November 6th, 2024

School lunches can generate lots of waste. Our friends at Recycling Council of Ontario state that the average student's lunch generates a total of approximately 66 pounds of waste per school year.

On Wednesday, November 6th, we are having our first WASTE-FREE Lunch Day at school, and are asking you to pack a lunch for your child that does not generate unnecessary waste! A wastefree lunch may include reusable food and drink containers, washable cutlery, and cloth napkins, instead of prepackaged foods, single-use plastic baggies, juice boxes and pouches, paper napkins, aluminum foil, and disposable utensils. When you go wastefree, you are helping to reduce the environmental impacts caused from the unnecessary transportation, production, and disposal of packaging products. Take action by tackling the first of the 5 Rs by reducing the amount of waste generated at our school!

- Tips for Waste-Less Lunches
- Have a lunch kit or bag that is reusable.
- Pack food and drinks in reusable containers.
- Use cloth napkins and reusable cutlery.
- Make your own <u>granola bars</u>, <u>cookies</u>, <u>chips</u> or <u>fruit snacks</u> and pack them in <u>reusable</u> containers.

- Buy bulk instead of single servings.
 Buy a large yogurt and put smaller portions in reusable containers.
- Give children responsibility. Children can learn food preparation by helping to make lunches and help clean reusable containers.
