Classroom Spotlight Grade Seven

In Grade 7, our students prepared for the Stations of the Cross, where they reflected on an important tradition in our Catholic faith and its significance.

In addition, students have been diving into exciting new topics across all subjects. In Math, students just completed a unit on fractions and integers, and will be focusing on financial literacy next. As well, the class has studied infographics, which is based on their Science unit, Heat and the Environment. Meanwhile, our literature unit has students reading and examining various writing forms, in order to enhance their comprehension and writing skills. Our history lessons have taken us on a journey through the Ontario history curriculum, examining the impact of early Indigenous cultures, the arrival of European explorers, and the development of early settlements in Canada. This exploration helps them connect past events to the present and understand the diverse cultural heritage of our nation. In gym class, our students are showcasing their teamwork and creativity through group fitness presentations. They are developing their own fitness routines, which promotes not only physical health but also collaboration and public speaking skills.

We are proud of their hard work and enthusiasm, and we look forward to seeing their achievements!

Students who share the classroom with our student with a dairy allergy have been informed and know that they are to wash their hands after lunches and snacks that contain dairy items. Please ensure that your child has thoroughly washed their hands after eating peanuts, peanut products or dairy products for breakfast/lunch at home. We must make every effort to ensure we do not contaminate our learning environment for these students. Please respect the safety of all students.
