Elmo demonstration: (Mrs. MacKenzie) This new tool, purchased for the Junior division was demonstrated by Mrs. MacKenzie. It was used to project the minutes for the meeting on to the wall screen. It is a very versatile teaching and learning tool.

Financial Report: (Mrs. MacKenzie)

- The March (month end) balance for the Hot Lunch Account was \$932.02. The total hot lunch expenses for the month were \$272.12.
- The April balance of the Hot Lunch Account was \$977.71. The total hot lunch expenses for the month were \$251.61. Items purchased for the month included:
 - Bookmarks for First Communion and crosses for Confirmation.
- The expenses to the Bingo account were discussed. The total amount spent in March \$1530.31 Expenses included:
 - o ELMO
 - o Gr. 6 -Trip-Warplane Museum
 - o Gr. 3/4 Science in the Classroom

Total amount spent in April \$539.14 Expenses included:

- The Bingo sales are down. The estimated income to date was supposed to be \$7200. We are currently at \$5300. Two factors contributed to this, a water main break and two incidences where volunteers did not show up. This left us with three lost Bingos. Mr. Gallo said that school staff would cover if volunteers were needed in a pinch.

- Nevada tickets sales are higher than expected, approximately \$200 more than projected as of this month.
- Magazine sales yielded a profit of just over \$2000 \$2057.83. These funds were used for the purchase / installation / training associated with the new white board. Our school acquired this \$5000 unit through a cost-sharing partnership at a discounted price, \$2414.15. Therefore school funds were used to supplement the difference in monies required.
- Pasta dinner proceeds: This fundraiser was a good first effort. Funds raised were divided between the teachers for resources and are to be spent by the end of May.

 Grade 6s will sing and present puppet plays which they wrote.
- The board bus tour to various education sites was cancelled due to lack of interest. It may be rescheduled in the fall.

- Year End Barbecue was discussed. The majority agreed that the Catholic School Council should host the event again this year. Last year, 105 families attended, (a total of 395 people). The cost for food alone was approximately \$625. After donations it was approximately \$400. It was discussed that in September the Council should revisit the idea of the barbecue for 2011. The event's budget for 2010 is \$500 the amount given to schools by the board. Therefore we will need to solicit donations.
- Proposed project: Water fountains converted to water refilling /hydration stations. This idea was brought to Council's attention. This project cost is \$2500 per filling station. Apparently grants are available. The water is not cooled. It just makes water bottle refills easier. A Council member asked why not just put a new tap with a gooseneck in each bathroom? It would be cheaper.

Other topics of interest were eating and exercise, water stations, track and field, additions to hot lunches, and a morning breakfast program.

Parent Education: (Antoinette Bortolon). The group is looking into hosting guest speaker Samantha Pelligrino.

Spirituality committee: (Antoinette Bortolon) the Resurrection eggs Project went very well. The crowning of Mary will take place on May 3. The grade twos will soon have their culminating activity for their Deepening the Roots Program. A May date is being set for the Brown Scapular Enrollment (grade 3 students).

Social Committee: (Dina Argenta) several condolence cards were sent out.

Gardening Committee: (Jen Biamonte) On Earth Day the Orange Team and JKs helped to clean up the Peace Garden. Mrs. Biamonte contributed several bags of mulch to the garden.
