- To achieve the goal of 100% certification of all elementary and secondary schools in the Provincial EcoSchool Program.
- To initiate a comprehensive plan for school ground greening initiatives in all elementary and secondary schools as part of our Green Niagara Catholic Program.
- To develop and implement a Niagara Catholic Energy Saving Program to reduce energy consumption as part of our Green Niagara Catholic Program.
- To design a revised Emergency Response Plan for all schools and Board sites.

process will be followed to focus on the issue:
COMPLAINANTANDEMPLOYEE CONCERNED
The complainant is to contact the employee involved to discuss the concern and attempt to

resolve the matter. If not satisfactorily resolved, then:
COMPLAINANT AND THE EMPLOYEES IMMEDIATE SUPERVISOR
The complainant will be referred to the employee's immediate supervisor to discuss the

concernand attempt to resolve the matter. If not satisfact only resolved, then COMPLAINANT AND SUPERINTENDENT/CONTROLLER OF PLANT. The complainant will be referred to the appropriate Superintendent or Controller of Plant to discuss the concernand attempt to resolve the matter. If not satisfactorily resolved, then:
COMPLAINANTANDDIRECTOR OF EDUCATION
The complainant will be referred to the Director of Education for consideration of the complaint


and the decisions made by supervisory staff of the Board. If not satisfactorily resolved, then APPEALTO THE BOARD

Acomplainant may submit a written request to the Chairperson of the Board to delegate to the In Camera Meeting of the Board if not satisfied with the decision of the Director of Education. 

## MENTAL HEALTH LEADERS TO SUPPORT SCHOOL MENTAL HEALTH ASSIST

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

As part of the Ministry of Education's commitment to the Ontario Mental Health and Addictions Strategy, district school boards have received funding to support the position of Mental Health Leaders through a three year roll out plan. The role of the Mental Health Leader is to provide leadership and coordination within Niagara Catholic and its community in the area of school mental health, with particular focus on:

- the development / refinement, and implementation of the board mental health strategy;
- the delivery of educator mental health literacy resources amongst school staff.

Mental Health Leaders will serve as the liaison with the provincial School Mental Health *ASSIST* team, under the leadership of its director, Dr. Kathy Short, Ph.D., C.Psych. The purpose of School Mental Health *ASSIST* is to help Ontario district school boards create conditions for promoting positive student mental health and well-being and for supporting students who struggle with mental health and addictions problems, through a focus on leadership, educator capacity building, and implementation support.

Mental Health Leaders will provide input into the materials that the School Mental Health ASSIST team develops and selects, and will tailor them to the needs of their board. In addition, Mental Health Leaders will monitor and share board implementation progress and learning with the ASSIST team, and will facilitate the administration of outcome measures, as part of Ministry reporting requirements.

During the Committee of the Whole meeting, Andrea Bozza, Mental Health Lead for Niagara Catholic, will provide a brief overview of her role and how it will support Niagara Catholic's 2013-2014 Enabling Strategies that focus on providing supports for student success in the area of Mental Health and Addictions.

#### RAISE ME UP 2013

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

In June of 2012, Niagara Catholic along with The City of Welland started discussions about the possibility of working together to utilize City owned 'infill lots' allowing students to complete full home builds.

For the past several years, the City of Welland had been trying to sell eight municipal 'infill' lots located approximately 250 meters from Notre Dame College School on Dufferin Street. As discussions took place, it became clear this development was not only a construction project, but truly a multi-sector Specialist High Skills Major Program. As details came together, Toscani Developments from Mount Hope, who has worked with the City of Welland and throughout the Niagara Region on several residential projects, came forward eager to work with both the City of Welland and Niagara Catholic. A proposal was put forward to Welland City Council that Toscani Developments purchase the eight building lots from the City with Niagara Catholic retaining an interest in four of the eight lots. These four lots will become our 'living classroom'. A new program was developed for Lakeshore Catholic High School and Notre Dame College School where students can take a full day course focused on construction; two credits issued will be construction and two credits will be cooperative education. This course is delivered on these sites.

In June 2013, Welland City Council formally approved the sale to Toscani Developments with Niagara Catholic as a key partner.

RAISE ME UP 2013 will see our students construct a one thousand, two hundred square foot (1,200) home from start to finish alongside qualified and certified local trades. As students work with local industry leaders, they will also have the opportunity to be registered as apprentices under the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program. To date, this program has brought together several partners including the City of Welland, Freeman Contracting, DunRite Aluminum, Fonthill Building Supply, Home Depot, Doig Excavating, Silver Creek Cabinets, Welland Plumbing, Feenstra Electric, Welland Equipment, Superior Drywall, Ballagio Painting, Parent Roofing, Nauta Home Designs, Atech Mechanical, Studio Tile and Star Tile. Along with our construction sector partners, we also have Flett Beccarrio Law Office, ReMax, Caisse Populaire Welland, Mathews Cameron Surveyors, the Business Education Council, Apprenticesearch.com, Liuna Training, and Costello Consulting. Caisse Populaire Credit Union will provide our Business SHSM students financial resources needed when planning, building, purchasing and financing this home. They will work together with REMAX to develop sales and costing proposals, processes and legalities in buying, building and selling a home. Together with Nauta Design and Cameron Mathews, students will learn engineering and surveying concepts (i.e. what it takes to develop a parcel of property, the severance process and when can you begin digging a foundation).

All proceeds from the sale of each home will be donated to the Niagara Catholic Foundation for Education which in turn will support local charities helping families in need.

RAISE ME UP 2013 will prove to be an exciting educational experience where students can learn, and give to their community.

A ground breaking ceremony will be held in September, 2013 with the project to commence following the ceremony.

Trustees are invited to view the progress of the RAISE ME UP project throughout the year.



#### INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENTS

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

In alignment with Niagara Catholic's System Priority 2013-2014 "to enhance social justice experiences and global citizenship for elementary and secondary students and staff through local, national and international experiences" and with the endorsement and encouragement of the Director of Education and the Superintendent of Education for Continuing Education, over the last three years our Niagara Catholic International Program staff have actively engaged potential international partners to design agreements for student and staff exchanges, program and service delivery, staff training and professional development opportunities.

In the fall of 2010, the Supervisor of International Education traveled to South Korea to initiate dialogue with Salesio Catholic Elementary School, located in the southern province of Jeonla-Do. Discussions took place on a variety of possible opportunities for South Korean students to enroll in programs offered by the Niagara Catholic District School Board, including short-term integration at our elementary and secondary schools; ESL programs through Continuing Education; full year visa programs; and teacher training program for Korean English teachers.

Following the initial contact and discussions in South Korea, Sister Yonghee Park, Principal of Salesio Catholic School, traveled to Niagara Catholic in late January 2011 to accompany her first three students attending a Niagara Catholic winter program and to meet with Senior Administration at the Catholic Education Centre. As reported to the Board in February 2011, a Memorandum of Understanding was signed by Director of Education John Crocco and Sister Park for Salesio Catholic Elementary School outlining a common desire to develop programs for students and teachers both within Niagara Catholic and Salesio Catholic in South Korea. Since that date, Niagara Catholic has welcomed 40 students and two teachers from Salesio Catholic for short-term programs as well as one full year visa student, with another group of students and staff attending Niagara Catholic in January 2014.

Similar to the partnership above, and also through direct contact in South Korea, the Niagara Catholic District School Board has also developed strong ties with a provincially funded foundation in Jeollabuk-Do province. The Jeollabuk-Do Human Resources Development Foundation "envisions the development of students through government scholarships in order to best prepare local youth for leadership roles in that country in decades to come." Following the Supervisor of International Education's visit to the Foundation in January 2011, senior administrators from South Korea travelled to Niagara Catholic to meet directly with the Director of Education and staff. The meeting provided the foundation for one hundred and twenty nine (129) middle school students from Jeollabuk-Do traveling to Niagara Catholic to participate in short-term integration programs within our Board. As we begin the 2013-2014 school year, forty nine (49) students from Jeollabuk-Do are currently studying in Niagara Catholic schools.

A non-binding cooperation agreement in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding was signed by Director Crocco and Mr. Young-Deok Lee, Secretary General of the Jeollabuk-Do Foundation, leading towards the pursuit of various education opportunities for Niagara Catholic and Jeollabuk-Do students and staff.

In addition to Southeast Asia, over the last three years Niagara Catholic has developed a meaningful relationship with various South American countries through the Asociación de Colegios Del Norte (A.C.N.), an association of private primary and secondary Catholic schools based in Bogota, Colombia. Through earlier long distance dialogue and subsequent visits by the Principal of Continuing Education and the Supervisor of International Education in 2009 and 2010 for presentations at various schools in Colombia, Niagara Catholic schools have received four hundred and sixty-two (462) Colombian students and over thirty (36) teachers and visiting principals to participate in our short-term integration program. In addition, a number of Columbian high school visa students have also joined Niagara Catholic for a full semester or full year of academic studies in our Catholic secondary schools. Final preparations are currently underway for Niagara Catholic to welcome another eighty-five (85) students from Colombia during the week of September 15, 2013 as well as twenty (20) students from Lima, Peru in October for an enriching education experience within our Niagara Catholic schools.

The presence of international students and staff in our Catholic schools brings immeasurable benefits to our learning communities, including a better understanding between cultures, opportunities for local and global community development and stronger intercultural relationships.

Over the last three years we have continued to nurture opportunities to further enhance our international educational experiences and presence by hosting administrative, business and government delegations from China and South Korea. Recognized for the strength and opportunities provided by Niagara Catholic's exceptional staff, programs and services, within the last few months four educational organizations have agreed to enter into formalized partnership agreements with Niagara Catholic to deliver short-term programs in Niagara; teacher exchanges, teacher training, Ontario Secondary School Diploma credits and professional development in partnered schools in China and South Korea.

To finalize the four partnership agreements with the English Language Center, Guangzhou City, China; Country Garden School in Foshan City, China; Bokja Catholic School, Chun An City, South Korea; Salesio Catholic Elementary School, Gwangiu Province, and the Jeollabuk-Do Foundation, South Korea, Chinese and South Korean senior administrators have invited a delegation from Niagara Catholic to their schools to officially sign partnership agreements and to participate in the 2013 Scholarship Student Graduation at the Jeollabuk-Do Foundation Assembly. While in Gwangiu Province, the opening ceremony of the new Niagara Catholic – Salesio English Training Centre will take place. A delegation from Niagara Catholic will travel to these locations to sign the partnership agreements and formalize the delivery of programs and services by Niagara Catholic staff.

We will continue to inform the Board on the progress of these partnership agreements and the development of new international education partnership agreements as we create international experiences and opportunities for students and staff and position Niagara Catholic as a recognized international destination for Catholic educational experiences.





Mario has agreed to assist us through the transition period of the appointment of a new Superintendent of Education in September. A celebration to honour Mario's contributions to Catholic education will be held in October with an announcement on the date and time forthcoming.

This past summer, our Facilities Services department was busy completing or commencing approximately \$34 million dollars on a variety of new construction, energy efficiency, full day kindergarten classrooms and major renovation projects throughout the system. 


