PRESENTATION BACKGROUND

ST. DENIS CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SAINTS IN MOTION ROBOTICS TEAM

The First Lego League Robotics Program at St. Denis Catholic School was established last school year. The program involved a team of 10 intermediate students working together to complete various components including building a game board, constructing a functioning robot using lego Mindstorms, programming the robot to complete various missions and conducting an extensive research project that connected with the year's theme. Last year, the team qualified for the provincials after winning the project award, receiving recognition in the teamwork category. In its second year, St. Denis formed the 2009-2010 team "Saints in Motion". This year, the theme focussed on transportation and the team chose to highlight what was unique to our community in the research category: the St. Lawrence Seaway's Welland Canal.

St. Denis Catholic School was once again recognized for its outstanding project as well as second place in the robot performance at the Niagara Regional Qualifier in December, 2009 which sent the team to the Provincial Championship in Oshawa in January, 2010. At the provincial championships, the "Saints in Motion" were named Champions in the Teamwork Category, one of the top 5 awards presented in a competition that featured 40 teams from all over the province.

Shortly after the team's trip to the Provincial Championships, our "Saints in Motion" were extended an amazing opportunity from the Ontario First Lego League. The team was nominated as a Core Values team to attend the World Championships in Atlanta, Georgia. We believe that this honour was bestowed on us due to our commitment to the Gospel Values that we hold so important in our daily lives. The children were gracious ambassadors for not only our school but for Niagara Catholic as they interacted with judges, referees and their competitors. In February, it was announced that our team was selected from the World Judges to attend the First Lego League World Festival in Atlanta, Georgia. We were one of only 14 teams selected from around the world to attend as a Core Values Team and the first team from the Niagara Region to attend. With much gratitude to our Niagara Catholic School Board and countless sponsors and supporters, the team was able to make the journey to Atlanta for this once in a lifetime opportunity. The team competed in the Georgia Dome alongside teams that spanned the globe and were quite excited about finishing in the top half of over 90 teams.

The First Lego League program is an excellent way for our students to experience the excitement of technical creativity and gain insights in the possibility of technical careers. The students participating on our First Lego League team had endless fun and it taught them many transferrable skills including mechanical design and computer programming as well as teamwork and an attitude of gracious professionalism. The St. Denis Catholic School community is very proud of the team's accomplishments and the enhancements it has made in the area of technological studies.

Niagara Catholic District School Board

In May and June of 2009, the EQAO Primary and Junior Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics were administered. The results of these provincial assessments were released in September 2009. Students who have achieved a Level 3 or 4 on an EQAO Assessment have achieved the Provincial Standard as established by the Ontario Government.

The Niagara Catholic District School Board is celebrating the achievement of students in Grades 3 and 6 for exceeding the provincial averages in the EQAO Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Our commitment to quality Catholic Education, and to the achievement of each individual child, has been demonstrated by the participation of 99% of all Grade 3 and Grade 6 students in the EQAO Primary and Junior Assessments.

The Niagara Catholic District School Board continues to facilitate Student Achievement on the EQAO Assessments through the dedicated and coordinated efforts of its staff through continuous School and Board Improvement Planning initiatives.

EQAO Background Information

The Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) tests students' skills in reading, writing and mathematics at key points in their elementary-school education. Students are tested twice:

- at the end of Grade 3, to assess what they've learned throughout the Primary Division (Grades 1–3)
- at the end of Grade 6, to assess what they've learned throughout the Junior Division (Grades 4-6).

Why does Ontario conduct province-wide tests of reading, writing and mathematics?

In 1995, Ontario's Royal Commission on Learning recommended such tests for Ontario students. The Commission made this recommendation after consulting with parents, educators, students and others who wanted greater accountability and assurances of quality in the publicly funded education system.

What do EQAO results tell me about my child?


EQAO test results provide a snapshot of your child's achievement in relation to the provincial standard. Students meeting or exceeding the standard (Levels 3 and 4) have demonstrated most or all of the required reading, writing and mathematics knowledge and skills expected at this stage in their education. However, no single test can offer a complete or definitive picture of what your child has learned. In the end, no one better understands the true measure of your child's abilities and knowledge—or is in a better position to assess them—than his or her classroom teacher. When used together, the results of EQAO and classroom tests provide a more complete picture of your child's knowledge.


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EQAO Primary Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics Results

All Students (including Exempted and No-Data Students)




Participating Students (excluding Exempted and No-Data Students)




EQAO Junior Assessments of Reading, Writing and Mathematics Results

Pathways:

Improved student achievement is at the forefront with the development of three teaching-learning critical pathways (TCLP) in the areas of literacy & numeracy throughout the school year. 2. <u>Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan</u>

Director Crocco presented the report on the Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan, which represents and culminates two years of prayer, dialogue and listening to over 4,700 participants which included Trustees, staff and a wide representation of the Catholic community. The plan and recommendations have set the path of the Niagara Catholic School Board for the next ten years.

Director Crocco informed Trustees that with the approval of the Strategic Plan, the Board will enter "Stage 4 – Vision 2020 Strategic Plan Implementation – June 2010 to June 2020". This Stage involves the development of the System Priorities for 2010-2011 which will be presented at the May 25, 2010 Board Meeting. The Annual Indicators will align with the approved Vision 2020 Strategic Plan and presented to the Board annually for the next ten (10) years. The draft Mission Statement will be vetted with all eighty (80) Vision 2020 Strategic Planning Summit participants, administrators, Catholic School Councils, Regional Catholic School Council / CPIC, SEAC and the Diocese of St. Catharines for input and recommendations for presentation at the June 15, 2010 Board Meeting.

Chairperson Burtnik recommended a word change to the School in Community Vision Statement. Director Crocco provided a recommendation that was agreed upon by all Trustees.

NIAGARA CATHOLIC VISION 2020 STRATEGIC PLAN

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In the fall of 2008, the Director of Education presented to the Board a four stage strategy to design an inaugural strategic plan for the Niagara Catholic District School Board. Entitled *"Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan"*, the Board approved the following four stages and timelines;

- Stage 1 Niagara Catholic Staff Consultation September 2008 to May 2009
- Stage 2 Data Analysis April 2009 to August 2009
- Stage 3 Strategic Plan Development and Approval September 2009 to May 2010
- Stage 4 Vision 2020 Strategic Plan Implementation June 2010 to June 2020

Throughout the first three stages, regular updates and feedback were provided to Trustees.

Stage 1 – Niagara Catholic Staff Consultation – September 2008 to April 2009

On September 1st, 2008, all Niagara Catholic staff received a letter from the Director of Education inviting participation in an on-line Director's Survey. Three weeks were provided to complete the survey with an invitation to meet with the Director to provide personal feedback. Forty-three percent (43%) of Niagara Catholic employees responded to the electronic survey, with 144 staff requesting a personal conversation with the Director.

Between October and December 2008, the results of the survey were collated, analyzed and categorized based on frequency of response. Commencing in January 2009, the Director met with all 144 staff who had requested a personal meeting as part of the staff consultation process. The meetings averaged between thirty (30) minutes and two (2) hours in length and were concluded in April 2009.

Stage 2 – Data Analysis – April 2009 to August 2009

As part of the consultation process, between April 6th and May 13th, 2009, the Director shared the common themes and feedback from the survey through presentations to staff. The schedule included presentations to Trustees, Senior Administrative Council, Principals, Vice-Principals, Managers, academic and support staff. The presentations provided an additional opportunity to dialogue with employees on the results of the survey and to receive additional feedback and recommendations as part of the consultation and data analysis stage.

In June 2009, the Board approved the request for proposal process to select a facilitator for Stage Three of the design of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan and funding was approved in the 2009-2010 Niagara Catholic Annual Budget.

Throughout the spring of 2009, the Director of Education continued his consultation with various individuals seeking recommendations for individuals or companies with prior experience facilitating the design of strategic plans with Catholic organizations. Over the summer of 2009, the Director contacted recommended companies and dialogued, either in person or through telephone conversations, extending an invitation to present a request for proposal to Senior Administrative Council to facilitate the design of Niagara Catholic's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan.

Four companies accepted the invitation to present a request for proposal, three (3) presented on August 31st, 2009 and one (1) presented on September 14th, 2009. Following the four presentations, Senior Staff discussed each presentation according to a pre-designed appraisal format towards a recommendation to the September 2009 Committee of the Whole.

Stage 3 – Strategic Plan Development and Approval – September 2009 to May 2010

At the September 29th, 2009 Board Meeting, the Niagara Catholic District School Board approved Maria Sanchez-Keane of the Centre for Organizational Effectiveness as the facilitator for the Strategic Plan Development Stage Three of the design of Niagara Catholic's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan.

The objective of the strategic planning development process was to provide opportunities for trustees, priests, administrators, staff, students, parents and the various partners in Catholic education within Niagara to participate in facilitated dialogue through discovery sessions.

Commencing November 12th, 2009 through February 29th, 2010, one-hundred and sixty (160) Discovery Sessions were held involving over 3,300 participants. (Appendix A)

Following the analysis of the data during March 2010, a Vision 2020 Discovery Report was issued during the first week of April 2010. On April 14th, 2010, eighty (80) participants accepted an invitation to attend the Vision 2020 Strategic Planning Summit. Based on the Vision 2020 Discovery Report, through prayer and rich dialogue, Summit participants discerned recommendations for the future of Niagara Catholic.

Stage 3 – Strategic Plan Development and Approval – September 2009 to May 2010 - continued

The input from the Director's Survey, Discovery Sessions and the Vision 2020 Strategic Planning Summit would formulate a Vision 2020 Strategic Plan Report. The report provides recommendations for Vision Statements, a revised Board Mission Statement and Strategic Directions for the next ten (10) years of Niagara Catholic. A Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan would be presented to the Committee of the Whole on May 11th, 2010 for consideration.

The Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan would be divided into three (3) major parts; the Vision Statements, Mission Statement and Strategic Direction as defined;

- *Mission Statement* the primary purpose of the organization; what good for what people.
- *Strategic Directions* statements that articulate the direct focus of an organization which are aligned to the Vision and Mission Statement.
- *Enabling Strategies* key focus areas which support the Strategic Directions and will enable the Vision to be achieved

Stage 4 – Vision 2020 Strategic Plan Implementation – June 2010 to June 2020

Respecting the valued input, conversations, language and recommendations from over 4,700 individuals representing the Catholic communities served by Niagara Catholic who actively participated in the two year Vision 2020 Strategic Planning process, the following schedule will be implemented;

System Priorities 2010-2011

With the approval of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan by the Board, Senior Administrative Staff will design aligned System Priorities for 2010-2011 for presentation to the May 25th, 2010 Board Meeting. Annual System Priorities will align with the approved Vision 2020 Strategic Plan and presented to the Board annually for the next ten (10) years.

Draft Mission Statement

With the approval of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan by the Board, the draft Mission Statement will be vetted with all eighty (80) Vision 2020 Strategic Planning Summit participants, administrators, Catholic School Councils, Regional Catholic School Council / CPIC and SEAC for input and recommendations. A recommendation for a revised Niagara Catholic Mission Statement will be presented at the June 15th, 2010 Board Meeting.

Implementation of Vision 2020 Strategic Plan

At the September 1st, 2010 Niagara Catholic Professional Activity day, the Board approved Vision 2020 Strategic Plan would be shared with all employees of Niagara Catholic.

Vision Statements – captures imagination for the future; states the key organizational achievements in the next ten (10) years.

In the fall of 2010, Senior Administrative Staff would commence the design of an implementation process to achieve the specific recommendations of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan. The Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan Implementation Process would be presented to the Board for consideration.

Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan

STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Niagara Catholic District School Board recognizes its primary responsibility to support the achievement and safety of students, and its authority to make decisions regarding its school facilities and the use of its facilities that are consistent with its Mission, Vision and Values.

The Niagara Catholic District School Board also recognizes its responsibility to provide, operate and maintain school facilities as effectively and efficiently as possible, while taking into account the best education of students, as well as recognizing the value of Catholic schools in fostering a spirit of cooperation between the home, the school and the church.

Where opportunities exist to form partnerships that complement Catholic Education or the union of home, school and church, the Niagara Catholic District School Board may enter into licence or joint use agreements for unused space in open and operating facilities during school hours, or may co-build a new school or addition with such partners.

The Director of Education will issue Administrative Guidelines in support of this policy.

ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES

BACKGROUND

The *Facility Partnerships Policy and Administrative Guidelines* implements the *Facility Partnerships Guideline* released by the Ministry of Education on February 11, 2010. A copy of the Policy and Guidelines as well as a list of available space and/or co-building opportunities will be posted on the Niagara Catholic District School Board website and made available, through the Plant Department, at the Catholic Education Centre, 427 Rice Road, Welland, Ontario.

The Board will continue to follow Ontario Regulation 444/98 – *Disposition of Surplus Real Property* regarding the lease or sale of surplus assets, to co-build facilities with other entities, and to enter into a variety of facility partnerships through a licence or a joint use agreement.

FACILITY PARTNERSHIPS AND BOARD PLANNING

The Controller of Plant shall report annually to the Director of Education identifying facilities that may be suitable for facility partnerships with respect to new construction and unused space in open and operating schools and administrative buildings. The information will be provided to potential partners through the notification process outlined below.

Facility partnership information will also be included in school information profiles when the Board is undertaking accommodation review processes.

SUITABILITY OF FACILITY PARTNERSHIPS

The suitability of facility partners shall be determined by criteria including the following:

- the use of facilities is in compliance with the *Education Act* and Board policy;
- the use of facilities is consistent with the Board Mission, Vision and Values;
- the partnership adds value for Niagara Catholic students and staff;
- the health and safety of students is protected;
- the partnership is appropriate for a school setting;
- the partnership does not compromise the student achievement strategy; the partner does not provide competing education services.

NOTIFICATION PROCESS

Facilities

The Controller of Plant will post information on the Board website, under the *Facilities* tab, regarding the intention to build new schools and to undertake significant renovations, as well as information regarding unused space in open and operating facilities that is available for facility partnerships. This information will be updated at least once per year in the case of space in existing facilities, and as needed in the case of co-building opportunities. The name and contact information of the staff member who will respond to questions regarding facility partnerships throughout the year will also be posted.

Potential Partners

The Controller of Plant will create a notification list of Potential Partners who will be notified when information about facility partnership opportunities is updated on the Board website. This list, at a minimum, will reflect the potential listed in Ontario Regulation 444/98 – *Disposition of Surplus Real Property*. If childcare operators and government-funded agencies request it, they will be added to the notification list.

Public Meeting

The Controller of Plant will coordinate a public meeting once per year to discuss potential facility partnership opportunities with the community and/or to listen to what needs or plans community partners may have. The potential partners on the notification list and the general public will be notified about the meetings through the Board website and three (3) local newspapers: the *St. Catharines Standard*, the *Niagara Falls Review*, and the *Welland Tribune*.

CO-BUILDING WITH COMMUNITY PARTNERS

When considering building a new school or undertaking a significant addition or renovation, the Controller of Plant will inform Potential Partners on the notification list one (1) to three (3) years prior to the potential construction start date. The notification must be supported by a Board approved motion. An identified source of funding or Ministry approval is not required at this point. Administrative Council will receive and evaluate expressions of interest from select partners.

Approval by the Minister of Education may be required depending on the provision under the *Education Act* authorizing the transaction. Partnership agreements cannot be finalized until the Board and the partner/s have an approved source of funding. Prior to receiving Ministry approval to proceed with new construction or major renovation projects, the Board will be required to demonstrate that potential partnerships have been considered.

SHARING UNUSED EXISTING SPACE WITH COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Underutilized open and operating school and administrative facilities will be reviewed for their suitability for partnership based on the following criteria:

- space needs of existing educational programming and initiatives has been taken into consideration;
- student safety will not be compromised;
- student achievement strategy will not be compromised;
- pupil accommodation strategy has been taken into consideration;
- the partnership will be in compliance with zoning and site use restrictions;
- facility condition is suitable, or will be addressed at the partner's cost;
- configuration of existing space is suitable or will be altered at the partner's cost; and
- there is an ability to separate the student space from the partner space.

PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENTS

The Board should not incur additional costs to support facility partnerships. On a cost-recovery basis, the fees charged to partners should cover the operations, administrative and capital cost to the Board of the space occupied by the partner. Additional costs to perform minor renovations to protect student safety, provide appropriate washrooms, and otherwise make the space suitable for use by facility partners should be borne by the partners.

In co-building, partners will be required to pay for and finance their share of construction, including a proportional share of joint-use or shared space. Construction is required to be within Ministry funding and space benchmarks for the Board portion of the facility.

The Director of Education shall ensure the provision of proper legal agreements to potential partners that respect the *Education Act* and protect the rights of the Board.

REPORT TO THE BOARD MEETING MAY 25, 2010

EARLY LEARNING EXTENDED DAY PROGRAM

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On April 27, 2010, Bill 242, "The Full Day Early Learning Statute Law Amendment Act, 2010", was passed in the Legislature. As well as new core Early Learning Program obligations, the amendments to the *Education Act* create an obligation for boards to operate an integrated Extended Day Program for four and five year old students on instructional days, for periods before and after school.

The Niagara Catholic District School Board has received approval for funding from the Ministry of Education to implement the operation of the Early Learning and Extended Day Program at eight (8) school sites in the 2010-2011 school year. Under Bill 242, boards are responsible for setting fees for the Extended Day Program, and the Ministry of Education has stated that the following general principles should be applied:

- Fees are intended to recover incremental costs associated with the Extended Day Program;
- Fees must reflect a reasonable connection to the operating cost of the program;
- Extended day fees are not to be subsidized by other board revenues;
- Fees are not to be designed to raise additional resources to supplement other board revenues or offset school day costs; and
- Fee setting is to be transparent.

Also, the following key process requirements apply to the setting of fees:

- Boards are required to set fees annually and approve them through a regular, open meeting of the Board;
- Boards are required to publish fees for Extended Day Programs on the Board website;
- Prior to final approval, boards are required to disclose proposed daily fees and fee calculations to the Ministry and their coterminous boards.

For children that will be 4 to12 years old in 2010-2011 at the eight approved schools, a survey was sent to parents and guardians asking for expressions of interest in the Extended Day Program. An approximate fee of \$8.00 per day before school and \$12.00 per day after school was proposed. These fees have been calculated as indicated in Appendix A, and are similar to the fees suggested by the Ministry.

Appendix B provides a calculation of profit or loss at the eight Early Learning Program school sites, based on the calculated proposed fee and the number of pupils determined by the expressions of interest received to date. Appendix B assumes that the existing daycares at Holy Name, Our Lady of Fatima, St. Joseph and St. Mary would provide the before and after school care for 6-12 year olds. Appendix C provides the profit or loss calculation at the eight sites assuming that Niagara Catholic includes all children aged 4-12 in the Extended Day Program.

The calculations based on interest expressed to date indicate the need to include 6-12 year olds in the Extended Day Program at the proposed fee to make the program viable. As well, principals and parents have generally expressed a preference for only one "before and after" service provider per school.

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Niagara Catholic District School Board approve a fee for the Extended Day Program for the 2010-2011 school year of \$8.00 per day before school and \$12.00 per day after school.

THAT the Niagara Catholic District School Board approve, if required for financial viability, the inclusion of 6 to 12 year olds in the Extended Day Program for the 2010-2011 school year.



In the fall of 2008, the Niagara Catholic District School Board embarked on a strategic planning process. On Tuesday, May 11th, 2010, following two years of prayer, dialogue and active listening, Niagara Catholic's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan was presented to the Committee of the Whole for consideration.

Inspired by more than 3,300 dreams and more than 4,700 voices representing our Niagara Catholic community, the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan was recommended by the Committee of the Whole to the Board Meeting on May 25th, 2010.

The strategic plan was divided into three (3) major parts; the Vision Statements, a draft Mission Statement and Strategic Directions. The Vision Statements captured the future of Niagara Catholic through key organizational achievements in the next ten (10) years. The Strategic Directions articulated the key focus of Niagara Catholic which are aligned to the Vision and Mission Statement.

The Mission Statement articulates the primary purpose of Niagara Catholic; what good for what people.

Throughout the two year Vision 2020 process, discussions took place regarding the current Mission Statement of the Board and whether it continued to define the primary purpose of Niagara Catholic, or whether it required revision. At the Vision 2020 Summit on April 14th, 2010, the vast majority of the eighty (80) participants recommended that the mission statement be revised. Through a discernment process, key words, phrases, thoughts, insights and recommendations were provided in drafting a new Mission Statement for Niagara Catholic.

Draft Mission Statement

Listening to the voices and recommendations from the Summit, a new and draft Niagara Catholic Mission Statement was included within the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan report. The draft Mission Statement as presented to the Committee of the Whole is as follows;

Within the context of Niagara Catholic's charisms of faith, social justice, support and leadership, we provide an enriching Catholic learning community for all students to reach their full potential and become living witnesses of Christ.

The word "charism" is a word unique to our Catholic faith and tradition. It has its roots in Romans 12:6 and speaks to the power whose source is the Holy Spirit; the gift of grace.

Feedback on Draft Mission Statement

With the recommendation of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan, it's Vision Statements and Strategic Directions approved by the Committee of the Whole to the Board, a process was pre-designed to invite input and recommendations on the draft Mission Statement portion of the strategic plan given the draft Mission Statement was not discussed in its finalized form with Summit participants.

Our pre-designed process is to vet the draft Mission Statement with all eighty (80) Vision 2020 Strategic Planning Summit participants, Trustees, administrators, staff, Catholic School Councils, Regional Catholic School Council / CPIC and SEAC and invite input, comments and/or recommendations by Thursday, June 10th, 2010 at 4.00 p.m.

Niagara Catholic administrators will engage school staff and members of their Catholic School Councils for feedback, while Chairs of various Board committees are requested to discuss the draft Mission Statement with their committee and provide a response as part of our vetting process.

We are inviting your input and recommendations on the draft Mission Statement by June 10th, 2010 to Linda Marconi, Executive Assistant at <u>linda.marconi@ncdsb.com</u>

Senior Administrative Council will review all input and recommendations and submit a final Niagara Catholic Mission Statement to the June 15th, 2010 Board Meeting for consideration.

Once the Board approves the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan and the draft Mission Statement, our plan is to share the complete Vision 2020 Strategic Plan with all staff and members of the Niagara Catholic community.

Niagara Catholic Trustees Get First Look at Vision 2020 Strategic Plan

Niagara Catholic Trustees had their first look at the Board's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan at the May 11th meeting of the Committee of the Whole.

Director of Education John Crocco presented a 50-minute overview of the Plan, which is the culmination of two years of meetings and consultation to chart Niagara Catholic's course for the coming decade.

Mr. Crocco provided a history of the process the Board and Facilitator Maria Sanchez-Keane followed to create the final report. Mr. Crocco explained the steps taken during the first three stages of the Vision 2020 process to ensure all Niagara Catholic stakeholders were given the opportunity to provide input into the future of Niagara Catholic through 2020.

He also shared plans for the fourth stage of the Vision 2020 plan, which will run from May 2010 through June 2020.

! Among the highlights of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan is a change to Niagara Catholic's Mission Statement. A draft version of a new Niagara Catholic Mission Statement, which reflects the current priorities and goals for Niagara Catholic, was introduced in the Strategic Plan, and will be vetted by the 80 Vision 2020 Summit

participants, administrators, Catholic School Councils, Regional Catholic School Council/CPIC and SEAC for input and recommendations. A final recommendation for a revised Niagara Catholic Mission Statement will be presented at the June 15th Board meeting.

With the approval of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan by the Board, Senior Staff will design aligned 2010-2011 System Priorities, which will be presented at the May 25th Board meeting. Annual System Priorities will be consistent with the approved Strategic Plan and presented to the Board annually through 2020.

On September 1, the Board-approved Vision 2020 Strategic Plan will be shared with all Niagara Catholic staff. In the fall, Senior Staff will begin designing an implementation process to achieve specific recommendations in the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan. The

Intensive French Program Expands to Four Schools

The Ministry of Education has granted Niagara Catholic additional funds to expand the Intensive French Grade 6 program to an additional two schools.

Now in its third year at Monsignor Clancy Catholic Elementary School in Thorold and St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Elementary School in Niagara Falls, the Intensive French program offers students in Grade 6 the chance to study in French for 70 per cent of the school day from September through January, allowing students to receive three to four times the amount of French instruction normally devoted to French. The remaining 30 per cent of the day, students learn Mathematics, Religion, Music and Physical Education in English.

Students who have completed the Intensive French program continue to follow the post-Intensive French program in Grade 7 and 8. Post-Intensive French students at Monsignor Clancy study History and Geography in French, making them eligible for additional funding through the Extended French program.


Recruitment of students has taken place for the coming school year, but the location of the additional sites has yet to be determined. Elementary school administrators have been invited to consider offering the Grade 6 Intensive French program in 2010-2011.

Status Quo for Trustees

Niagara Catholic supporters will have the opportunity to cast ballots for eight trustees in six jurisdictions in the 2010 municipal election.

The jurisdictions and Trustee allocations are as follows:
