Master of Religious Education (MRE)

The MRE equips persons for professional leadership in educational ministry within the Catholic ecclesial tradition. The areas of study in this Tradition include biblical, historical, pastoral, systematic and moral theology.

The MRE assists students:

- To build on the understanding of the educational, social and behavioural sciences that ground educational practice.
- To develop the capacity for critical and constructive theological reflection regarding the content and processes of Catholic educational practice.
- To enrich and strengthen the theological understanding and leadership skills necessary to be effective educators in the Catholic faith.



Master Of Theological Studies (MTS)

The MTS Program at St. Augustine's Seminary provides the opportunity for students to deepen their faith as they acquire greater understanding of the key elements of the Catholic theological tradition. The areas of study in this Tradition include biblical, historical, pastoral, systematic and moral theology, with an opportunity for specialization.

The MTS assists students:

• To respond effectively to the call of the Second Vatican Council to discover God active in the world and to infuse the world with Gospel values.

• To develop the intellectual and pastoral resources necessary for various forms of service and leadership within contemporary ecclesial and diverse cultural contexts.

Diploma In Theological Studies (DTS)

The DTS assists theology students in developing their faith by course content and through interaction in a structured learning situation.

Diploma In Lay Ministry (DLM)

The DLM Program offers to those already serving or hoping to serve as Lay Ministers the chance to enhance their ministry through theological education. This is not a certification program but rather a coordinated combination of introductory courses.
