PILGRIMAGE 2014

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On Sunday, October 26th, 2014, approximately 4000 Niagara Catholic students, staff, administrators, trustees, alumni, parents and community members took to the overcast streets of the Niagara region, becoming the body of Christ in the world today. This Niagara Catholic tradition which began in 1975 at Notre Dame College School in Welland promotes the virtues and charisms of Niagara Catholic and truly demonstrates how we *WITNESS* our faith to the world.

This year, in solidarity, the eight secondary schools raised over \$168,000.00 to support the many diverse projects that the schools partner with in a variety of developing countries throughout the world.

This annual Niagara Catholic Pilgrimage, with its long history, best exemplifies the vision of the Catholic student "called to bear witness to Jesus Christ...and reverence Him in the poor, the lowly and the marginalized (This Moment of Promise)". The millions of dollars in pilgrimage funds that have been raised since its inception fund the construction of schools, medical clinics, wells and orphanages.

21st Century Social Media captures this year's Pilgrimage

As Niagara Catholic embraces the call to the New Evangelization, Pilgrimage Committees from each secondary school made deliberate attempts this year to capture the spirit and service of the pilgrimage through Twitter and other social media platforms. Selfies, on-route reflections, and tweets of support from the international communities which benefit from the funds raised were some examples of how this social justice experience has adapted to the time and culture of today's high school students to proclaim and be authentic witnesses of Christ's mission in the world today.

School Summaries

Blessed Trinity Catholic High School

With the theme 'We are One', 500 members of the Blessed Trinity Catholic community, including participants from their elementary associate schools, walked through the streets of Grimsby for the children of the Dominican Republic knowing that that their efforts are changing lives. The \$18,000.00 raised will support a variety of projects in Las Pajas, Dominican Republic including the provision of post-secondary scholarships and improvements to homes and basic quality of life through the work of the Dominican Canadian Community Development (DCCD) Group. The day began with Mass celebrated by Rev. Richard Kowalchuk, Pastor of St. Joseph's Parish and members of this church community.

St. Catharines

Over 1000 pilgrims from the three St. Catharine's area Catholic high schools – Holy Cross, Denis Morris, and Saint. Francis – met downtown at the Market Square to participate in this year's Pilgrimage Mass celebrated by Bishop Bergie, assisted by Deacon Brian Prieur. This year, the music ministry was provided by the talented students and staff of Saint Francis Catholic High School.

Holy Cross Catholic High School

Inspired by this year's theme, 'See the Face of Christ, Be the Face of Christ,' the Holy Cross Catholic school community was represented by approximately 350 pilgrims. \$15,000.00 was raised to support the hard work of the Holy Cross Brothers and Sisters in the villages of Thibeau, Cap Haitian and Milot, as well as surrounding areas in northern Haiti.

Saint Francis Catholic High School

Celebrating their highest participation ever, more than 480 students, staff members, and parents walked through the streets of northern St. Catharines to raise over \$40,000.00. Inspired by the Hedley song, this year's theme of *Got Love* fueled the "purple machine" to enjoy reaching their participation goal which resulted in the shaving of the head of teacher, Pat O'Leary. The donations will be distributed and shared among three different organizations: St. Marc School in Haiti run by the Holy Cross Sisters, Fogquest, an organization which uses run off tarps to collect condensation in foggy areas where water is scarce, in Guatemala, and the Dominican Canadian Community Development Group (DCCD) which supports grassroots projects in the Dominican Republic.

Denis Morris Catholic High School

Over 480 students, staff and members of the Denis Morris Catholic School Council proved their theme of "Real Champions in the Service of Love" as they walked to the market square and raised \$13,000.00. These proceeds will be shared between the Holy Cross Sister's Ecole Imaculee Conception in Pilate, Haiti and the Wells of Hope Projects in Guatemala.

Niagara Falls

The Pilgrimage committees of Saint Paul and Saint Michael take turns hosting and organizing the mass and pilgrimage route through the streets of Niagara Falls. This year, Saint Paul hosted and all pilgrims began the day with a liturgy, celebrated by Fr. William DeRousie. In his homily, he reminded those present that if in their participation they recognized the image and likeness of God in those they were seeking to serve, then their participation was fuelled by the right intention.

Saint Paul Catholic High School

More than 500 Saint Paul Catholic students, staff, and associate elementary school students walked together to raise \$18,600.00 making this the most successful pilgrimage in the school's history. The school's theme was "It's a Love Haiti Relationship", reminding those who walked that they were making a difference for the students of Immaculate Conception School in Milot, Haiti to which the pilgrimage funds are donated. Tweeting encouragements from Sr. Doreen Cloutier in Haiti proved to be the community's greatest supporter.

Saint Michael Catholic High School

Over 350 students, staff and Saint Michael Catholic Family members from Saint Michael Catholic participated in this year's annual Pilgrimage that was themed, "Hope Lives Here." Saint Michael students raised \$16,500.00 for the Hope for Rwanda's Children Fund. The staff is extremely proud of their students' dedication to this great cause because the genocide that occurred in Rwanda must never be forgotten.

Notre Dame College High School

Approximately 650 students, staff, parents, and alumni walked 14 kilometers from Notre Dame College to the Forkes Road Bridge in Dain City and back to participate in the 39th Pilgrimage of the school's history. \$35,000.00 was raised and will be distributed to Development and Peace, Yancana Huasy in Lima Peru, and the Dominican Canadian Community Development Group. In the spring of this year, the school was recognized by the Ontario Chapter of the Catholic Organization for Development and Peace for its years of outstanding service.

Lakeshore Catholic High School

Over 400 staff, students, alumni and community members took part in Lakeshore Catholic High School's annual Gator Walk, a social justice initiative benefitting communities in Dominica. Participants of this year's 'Walk of Life' began the morning with a celebration of the Eucharist followed by the 10 km walk through Port Colborne. The \$13,000.00 that was raised will be delivered by a group of students and staff who will be travelling to Dominica later this month to foster the many partnerships and friendships there.

As part of this report, students from each school will share a reflection on Pilgrimage 2014 along with a visual presentation to capture the spirit and images of this year's Pilgrimage 2014.

THE POPE FRANCIS CENTRE

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The 2014-2015 System Priority to "provide supports for success through the design of a Pathway to Care program" is achieved through the opening of the Board's new Pope Francis Centre in September 2014.

The mandate of the Niagara Catholic Pope Francis Centre is to provide selected students with an alternative – a school connected place to learn with individually designed programs, experiences and support within our new Pathway to Care Program.

The Pope Francis Centre motto is "A Place Where all are Welcome". Believing that all students learn differently, the Centre offers a different environment to assist in achieving academic and personal success. This alternative education program provides students who may struggle with learning in a traditional school setting, a supported learning environment where they can work on independently selected programming while receiving individualized support and counseling as required.

This program and the accompanying supports provide an alternative opportunity for elementary and secondary students in Grade 6 to Grade 12 to:

- Understand that they are valued members of a caring Niagara Catholic Faith Community;
- Demonstrate the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations;
- Develop the skills and attitudes to be successful in school, work and the larger community;
- Progress academically through curriculum/credit attainment; and to
- Contribute to the community through service learning activities.

The Pope Francis Centre provides four over-arching programs and supports:

- 1. Fresh Start an alternative suspension and expulsion program.
- 2. Jump Start to support students with high absenteeism.
- 3. Parent Support for female or male students with an infant.
- 4. Mental Health and Addictions a support program for students.

These programs and supports are integrated with the following opportunities:

Independent Learning: With the guidance and support of staff, students work on and complete their course of study.

Community Involvement: Students participate in community service activities.

Healthy Living: Students participate in Healthy Living activities including physical education activities, drug addiction and mental health guest speakers.

Nutrition for Learning: Providing healthy breakfasts, lunches and snacks for students to help them be ready to learn.

Pathways Planning: Career planning, Co-op, trips to Niagara College, connections with Job Gym and experiential learning activities.

Personal Life Management – regular meetings with the CYWs to discuss personal socio-emotional and behavioral issues and to develop the skills necessary to more effectively problem solve.

Goal Setting – to develop goals related to the successful reintegration of the home school.
