Confessions: during the lockdown, by request.

Baptisms: Usually Sunday by prior arrangement

Weddings, funerals, masses and baptisms are restricted to 10 persons. Wedding preparations should be booked at least 6 months prior to the celebration.

Anointing of the Sick: There is a priest on call at the hospitals. Please ask a nurse to contact him. If anyone is seriously ill at home, please call the parish. Anointing is given only when someone is in danger of death. It should not be delayed until a person's last hours.

Funerals: when a loved one has died, a funeral mass in the presence of the body should be arranged with Fr. Stuart in consultation with the funeral home. For cemetery questions, please call Mike Collee 905-384-2505 or Paul Brunning 905-382-2927.

If you are feeling ill or have developed a cough, runny nose, headache or general malaise, please stay at home. When wearing the masks in the Church the nose, mouth and chin must be covered by the mask. Many people are letting the mask rest on the upper lip, and not covering their nose: this is not acceptable. Also, the

corona virus is now becoming air borne, so as Bishop Bergie has requested, please receive communion on the hands. When the priest is distributing communion on the tongue, one may inadvertently breathe on the hands of the priest, and if you have the new air borne Covid-19 virus, you may infect others, through breath. When you come to communion, please respond Amen, then remove the mask and extend your hands out towards the priest, keep the hands flat, palms upward please and do not curl your fingers. Let the priest place communion on your hands, and then place communion in your mouth. In this way we ensure no-one will be passing on the virus to another.

<u>Income Tax receipts for 2020</u> Receipts will be issued in February.

The province-wide COVID-19 lockdown limits maximum capacity to 10 people. The 10-person capacity includes all involved in ministry (priest, cantor, etc.), as well as the staff member/volunteer who manages contact tracing and disinfection protocols, if they remain during the church service.
