Last year, we were unable to celebrate Holy Week ceremonies publicly. The parish spent over \$200. on palms that went to waste and were burned to provide ashes for this past Ash Wednesday. I did not order palms this year as it was, and still is, unclear whether or not we will be on lockdown for Holy Week. Therefore, for Palm Sunday this year, everyone is asked to BYOB! Bring your own branch – of any sort, tropical plant, evergreen. It is not necessary to have palm branches. Even the instructions of the Mass say that palms, or some other branch, are to be blessed at the beginning of Mass. Italians often use olive tree branches; Eastern Rite Catholics use pussy willows. Bring something; it will be blessed at Mass and should be treated with the same respect that palms normally receive in your house.
