REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING FEBRUARY 8, 2022

ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL YEAR CALENDARS: 2022-2023

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The *Education Act, Regulation 304 - School Year Calendar, Professional Activity Days* outlines the requirements and timelines for preparing and submission of school year calendars to the Ministry of Education for approval.

For the 2022-2023 school year calendars, there are 195 possible school days between September 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023. Within this total, elementary and secondary schools must have a minimum of 194 school days, of which seven (7) days must be designated as professional activity days. Secondary schools may have a maximum of ten (10) instructional days set as examination days. The remaining school days shall be instructional days.

The 2022-2023 School Year Calendar Committee met to discuss and review the draft calendar and the consultation process.

1. Elementary Principals – Susy Walsh

- Susy Walsh shared with the group that Student Support Services continues to serve students, often being required to think outside the box, when it comes to offering students a variety of learning opportunities during an ongoing pandemic. Literacy Program Update

 A Student Support Memorandum is being issued tentatively next week for the launch of Lexia Learning. This memorandum will provide directions to school staff on how to initiate the Lexia Literacy program for selected students. Program Resource Teachers will be providing optional virtual tutorials for staff who wish to participate and receive further support in rolling out the initiative. We wish to acknowledge the support of Niagara Catholic's IT department and the immense efforts of our Program Resource Teachers: Tania Barrick, Diane Bishop, and Ann Marie Criddle. The PRTs were key players to get Lexia up and running at Niagara Catholic. As well, a special thank you to Danny Giancola for his leadership in bringing Lexia to Niagara Catholic.

BMS Annual Refresher for Educational Assistants, ECEs, CYWs, and Secondary ERTs and Special Education Classroom Teachers

- Student Support staff who serve as Behaviour Management Systems Trainers (who are a member of our ABA team) will be delivering a series of virtual training sessions for Educational Assistants, ECEs, CYWs, and Secondary ERTs and Special Education Classroom Teachers on January 20th (for elementary-based staff) and February 2nd (for secondary-based staff). These sessions will conclude the annual refreshers for employee groups who require BMS training. The sessions continue to be virtual, and a review of the schedule for the 2022-2023 school year is underway to determine a timely and safe way to resume in-person training if possible.
- Student Support staff are also undertaking a review of the process for reporting incidents of physical interventions where school staff employ a containment on students. The outcome of the review will be a clear workflow of the steps schools will take in reporting the incident, the follow-up that Board BMS trainers will undertake in response to an incident, and how training and capacity building fit into the workflow.

Gifted Education Module

 An upcoming virtual gifted education module called CSI: 101 - Part 1. This will be held on Monday, January 24th and Thursday, January 27th for students identified as exceptional. Students will have the opportunity to explore Crime Scene Investigation techniques through an introduction to DNA and Forensic Science. Students will conduct an experiment that takes a closer look at the scientific method and DNA extraction. We are looking forward to running this module.
