




The Kindergarten Program

- Offered to all children that are 3.8 to 6 years of age
- A two year program
- A program for Year 1 and Year 2 students to learn together
- Taught by a Catholic Certified Elementary Teacher and a Registered Early Childhood Educator





Our Kindergarten Program is rooted in our Faith and centred on "Where Is God" in all that we say, do, learn, and feel









In Kindergarten, children learn through:

Exploration - Children explore their environment through play-based learning. Play is a vehicle for learning in the areas of problem solving, language acquisition, literacy, numeracy and social skills.

Inquiry - Children are naturally curious. They have an interest in exploring and investigating how things work and why things happen.

Real-Life Contexts - Children grasp ideas more easily and effectively when they connect their learning to their lives and the world around them.

Explicit Instruction - Educators provide explicit and systematic teaching and modeling of specific skills and strategies, especially in literacy and mathematics skills.
