#### D. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- 1) **Catholic School Council Fundraising Financial Report** Mr. Forte shared the Catholic School Council Financial Reports as of 07/03/2023.
- 2) <u>St. John Catholic School Google Website</u> The site continues to be a readily accessible tool containing information pertaining to the school.
- 3) Bus Pick-Up/Drop-Off Sidewalk Barrier Fence The school continues to work with the Board's Facilities Services Department to have a barrier fence installed between the sidewalk and ditch as an added safety measure.
- 4) **King Street Sidewalk** The Town of Lincoln and the Board's Facilities Services Department continue to work together to finalize construction of the sidewalk along King Street and connect it to the existing walkway on school property.
- 5) Lenten & Easter Food Drive Our Lenten & Easter Food Drive for the *Grimsby Benevolent Fund* will run from *February 22 April 6*.
- 6) Paul Davis Internet Safety Parent Presentation Mr. Paul Davis (Internet and Social Media Safety Specialist) was booked for a parent presentation for the evening of *Wednesday, March* 1 at <u>6:30 pm</u>. The presentation was open for all parents in the Blessed Trinity Catholic Family of Schools to attend.
- Internet Safety & School Devices IT services is investigating instances of unsafe browsing on school devices brought forward throughout the Board to determine a need to enhance firewalls and security on devices.
- 8) Anti-Black Racism Student Workshops Students in Grades 3-8 participated in workshops led by the *Get REAL Movement* on February 15. Students learned about what racism is, and how we all have a role to play in building accepting and supportive communities for all.
- 9) Anti-Black Racism Parent Presentation As a follow-up to the student workshops, the school is considering a parent presentation to take place at the school, pending availability.
- 10) March Break March Break across Niagara Catholic will take place from *March 13 March 17*. Students will return to school on Monday, March 20.
- 11) **Kindergarten Open House -** Our Kindergarten Open House took place on *February 16* and was a tremendous success.
- 12) Kids Helping Kids From February 13 24, students and staff at St. John Catholic Elementary School participated in the annual Kids Helping Kids Campaign in support of the Niagara Children's Centre and the Niagara Foundation for Catholic Education. Classes participated in a variety of activities throughout the campaign. Through donations made via 'SchoolCash' Online, St. John raised <u>\$461.50</u> to support the cause.
- 13) Shrove Tuesday On February 21, students received a pancake snack, prepared by the Knights of Columbus. Through donations made via 'SchoolCash' Online, St. John raised <u>\$554.00</u> to support various local charitable causes in our community through the Knights of Columbus.
- 14) World Down Syndrome Day St. John will be participating in *"Rock Your Socks"* on *Tuesday, March 21* in recognition of World Down Syndrome Day. Staff and students are encouraged to come to school wearing their most colourful socks.

- 15) Sparkle Day: Feast of the Annunciation Saturday, March 25 is the Feast of the Annunciation. To celebrate the Feast of the Annunciation we will be having Sparkle Day at St. John on Friday, March 24. Students and staff are encouraged to come to school wearing sparkly clothing/accessories and/or their favourite white shirt or sweater.
- 16) Epilepsy Awareness Day St. John will be participating in "Epilepsy Awareness Day" or "Purple Day" on Monday, March 27. Students and staff are encouraged to wear the colour purple in an effort to create awareness of epilepsy as a brain disorder and to eliminate any fear and stigma surrounding it.

## 17) School Fundraising:

- ✓ M&M School Shop Day Fundraisers The school raised just under \$500 for general school funds to be put towards the purchase of additional technology and other materials to support student learning and engagement.
- ✓ Dance-a-Thons The school is planning to run a final Dance-a-Thon fundraisers for <u>St.</u> <u>Patrick's Day</u>. Families will be invited to make a small donation through 'SchoolCash' Online to support each fundraiser.

1) **Students Demonstrating Symptoms of Illness** - Parents and guardians of ill children continue to be encouraged to follow the most current guidelines provided by Niagara Public Health.

#### 2) Practice Fire & Lockdown Drills:

- ✓ Fire drills Fire drills are to be conducted at a minimum of <u>six</u> times throughout the duration of the school year (three per term), all at various times of the day. St. John has completed <u>three</u> of its <u>six</u> required fire drills this year.
- ✓ Lockdown drills Lockdown drills are to be conducted at a minimum of <u>two</u> times throughout the duration of the school year (two per term). St. John has completed <u>one</u> of its <u>two</u> required fire drills this year.
- 3) **Visitors to the School** School visitors will continue to be restricted out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health, safety, and privacy of students and school staff.
- Student Absences & Late Arrivals It is essential that all student absences and late arrivals are called into the Safe Arrival Program by <u>8:30 am</u> via phone (1-844-287-6287), website or app.
- 5) **'SchoolMessenger'** The school will continue to use the 'SchoolMessenger' platform to update the parent community with essential information pertaining to the school.
- 6) **'SchoolCash' Online** The use of this platform to make payments for school related expenses is highly encouraged.
