6. Director of Education's Annual Report 2013

Director Crocco presented the Report on the Director's Annual Report 2013 and a copy of the Director's Annual Report 2013. He informed Trustees that the Annual Report 2013 is in compliance with the requirements of the Education Act and the Minister of Education regarding the submission of Directors Annual Reports.

Director Crocco thanked the members of Senior Administrative Council for their submissions and Jennifer Brailey, Manager of Corporate Services & Communications, and the Print Shop staff for their work in the preparation of the impressive Director's Annual Report 2013.

7. Revised Budget for the Year 2013-2014

Director Crocco presented the Report on the Revised Annual Budget for the Year 2013-2014.

Director Crocco stated that Senior Administrative reviewed and updated the revenue and expenditures of the Board based on new information including the revised Average Daily Enrolment (ADE) and the unexpected loss of the Board's annual utility rebate of approximately \$600,000. Based on their review, the risk assessment plan and the latest adjustments to the anticipated Ministry revenue, a potential in-year deficit of \$600,000 is projected for the 2013-2014.

He advised that he and Superintendent Vetrone will continue to update the Board throughout the year on the status of the in-year deficit.

Senior Administrative Council continues to review all sources of revenue and expenditures aggressively to reduce the cost structure and achieve a balanced budget without the use of reserves. Director Crocco pointed out that in order to meet the System Priorities for 2013-2014 the Board may need to draw on its reserves to balance the budget for 2013-2014.

Superintendent Vetrone, highlighted key areas of the Revised Board Budget 2013-2014, under Appendix A and Appendix B and answered Trustees' questions.

Director Crocco advised that he and Superintendent Vetrone will continue to update the Board throughout the year on the status of the in-year deficit.

NIAGARA CATHOLIC INTERNATIONAL COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM (NCICE) DOMINICA 2013

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In alignment with the Board's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan and the System Priority 2013-2014 to "*To* enhance social justice experiences and global citizenship for elementary and secondary students and staff through local, national and international experiences", all Niagara Catholic secondary school students were invited during the 2013-2014 course selection process to apply to the second Niagara Catholic International Cooperative Education Program in Dominica taking place in the fall of 2013. Following an extensive application and selection process, on September 29th, 2013 eleven (11) Niagara Catholic District School Board students and two (2) classroom teachers embarked on the three month placement portion of the Niagara Catholic International Cooperative Education Program in Dominica.

Lead by Niagara Catholic staff Jason Benoit (Lakeshore Catholic High School) and Amber Benoit (Saint Michael Catholic High School), the eleven students who spent from September 29th to December 20th, 2013 in Dominica were: Shawna Hopper, Emily Madronich, Sam Macsai, Amy Hoad-Owen, Alex Salway and Taya Sorge of Lakeshore Catholic High School; Emily Burkholder of Denis Morris Catholic High School; Milana D'Intino of Saint Francis Catholic Secondary School; Emily Boudreau and Haley Lambourne of Saint Michael Catholic High School; and Mackenzie Chow of Notre Dame College School.

As the coordinating school for the 2013 Niagara Catholic International Cooperative Education Program, Lakeshore Catholic High School students and staff have raised funds through their annual Pilgrimages and have visited Dominica for fifteen years. Every February, students and staff travel to the Caribbean island of Dominica, which is the second poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere next to Haiti to work with the community to improve their level of education and their standard of living.

The students and staff participating in this year's Niagara Catholic International Cooperative Education Program 2013 lived for the three months in Portsmouth, Dominica. In Dominica, students worked at four cooperative education placements. The first placement was at St John's Catholic Elementary School assisting classroom teachers in preparing, delivering, and assessing curriculum. The second placement was at the Northern District Home for the Aged "The Grange" which is the local seniors' home. Students assisted registered nurses Mariette and Lucille in the daily care of the residents. A third placement was at the Portsmouth Library. Students helped to organize and administer the day to day duties under the supervision of librarian, Monique Matthew. The students also organized and volunteered at a literacy club at the library. The fourth and final cooperative education placement was at the Centre where Adolescents Learn to Love and Serve. This is an alternative placement where students worked with Sister Betty Rae and Mrs. Douglas to teach life skills to the students of the centre.

In addition to our Niagara Catholic students earning four (4) cooperative education credits, all students were enrolled in three (3) academic credits as part of the seven (7) total NCICE credit program. Mr. Benoit, Program Chair of Religious Education at Lakeshore Catholic High School delivered the curriculum for the Philosophy of Religion course (HZT 4U) and Mrs. Benoit a Science teacher at Saint Michael Catholic High School, delivered the curriculum for Grades 11 and 12 Biology (SBI 3U/SBI 4U).

Finally, Mr. and Mrs. Benoit, who were both collegiate athletes and are actively involved in their schools' co-curricular athletics program, jointly delivered the curriculum for the Grade 12 Physical Education course (PAI 4Os).

Students and staff returned safely to Canada on Thursday, December 19th, 2013 and have shared their exceptional experiential learning experience in Dominica with both their secondary school communities and the elementary schools within their respective Family of Schools.

A presentation by students and staff at the January Board Meeting will highlight the remarkable social justice experiences from the Niagara Catholic International Cooperative Education (NCICE) Dominica 2013 program.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

At the May 28th, 2013 meeting of the Niagara Catholic District School Board, the following motion was approved;

THAT the Niagara Catholic District School Board approve the Niagara Catholic Strategic Directions System Priorities 2013-2014, as amended. (Appendix A)

The Niagara Catholic Strategic Directions Priority Indicators 2013-2014 are designed to provide the annual focus for the system towards achieving the outcomes of the Niagara Catholic Vision 2020 Strategic Plan. Within the two (2) Strategic Directions and the seven (7) Enabling Strategies are the approved system priority indicators which provide the specific framework to measure the achievement of each direction and strategy within our multi-year strategic plan.

The Board approved Strategic Directions Priority Indicators 2013-2014 were posted on the Niagara Catholic website and copies were provided to Bishop Bergie, the Diocese of St. Catharines, Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC), Catholic School Council Chairs and the Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee (NCPIC). In addition, a poster size copy of the Niagara Catholic Strategic Direction Priority Indicators 2013-2014 were displayed in public locations in all schools, Board sites and the Catholic Education Centre for review by students, staff, parents and guests to Niagara Catholic.

As we reach the approximate mid-point of the 2013-2014 academic year, Senior Administrative Council conducted its annual mid-year review of the progress in achieving the indicators of success within each Strategic Direction and Enabling Strategy. The results of the mid-year review were collated and reviewed by Senior Administrative Council, administrators and Board staff as a measurement of our success to date in achieving each priority indicator by the conclusion of the academic year. Principals will conduct similar discussions with staff on the implementation of system priorities and the measurements of success following a presentation to Principals at the February 2014 Director's Meeting.

Attached to this report (Appendix B) is a copy of the Mid-Year Progress Review of the Niagara Catholic System Priorities for 2013-2014. Within each Strategic Direction and Enabling Strategy is the indicator of success and comments on the measurables to determine the achievement of either *Action Required, On Target or Completed.*

With the majority of indicators directly linked to final achievement results at the conclusion of the 2013-2014 school year, members of Senior Administrative Council, administrators and Board staff will collate, analyze and review all data gathered for the 2013-2014 school year and present a final report to the Board and to all stakeholders at the September 2014 Board Meeting.

The annual final report will provide evidenced based information on the achievement of the Board's annual system priorities and the achievement of specific expectations within Niagara Catholic's multi-year strategic plan, Vision 2020.

Niagara Catholic Signs International Partnership Agreements With South Korean School

For the past three years, International Program staff with Niagara Catholic have actively engaged potential partners overseas to design agreements for students and staff exchanges, program and service delivery and staff training and professional d e v e l o p m e n t opportunities.

Niagara Catholic welcomed 92 elementary students from South Korea into our schools on January 6th, 2014.

Approximately half of the students currently attending Niagara Catholic schools are visiting through the Jeollabuk-Do Foundation, which Niagara Catholic signed a partnership agreement with last year. Twenty-eight visiting students attend Bokja Catholic Girls' Middle School. Sister Angela Bang, the school's Principal, and three others are travelling with them in. An agreement between Niagara Cathoilc and Bokja Cathoic Girls Middle School was signed last fall.

Other visiting students also attend the Salesio and Soha Catholic Elementary Schools. Among those accompanying the students from Salesio and Sopha schools is Sister Insuk Pak, from Soha Elementary School, which signed an arrangement with Niagara Catholic similar to the one signed by Salesio Catholic Elementary School Principal and Director Crocco in Jaunary, 2011.

Niagara Catholic Introduces Attendance Support Program

As part of the Vision 2020 Strategic Plan, in 2012-2013 the Board's Human Resources Department initiated the development of the Attendance Support Policy and Program for all Niagara Catholic staff. This Policy was approved by the Board in November, 2012.

As a part of this plan, Niagara Catholic realigned the Human Resources Department, formalizing the Coordinator of WSIB/Health and Safety with a new title of Coordinator of Staff Wellness, and creating a Coordinator of Attendance Support. In their positions, Gina Sattin and Lana Pasto will focus their efforts on addressing staff wellness, attendance and support.

Working in partnership with staff, the Coordinator of Staff Wellness and the Coordinator of Attendance Support will monitor staff wellness and attendance and, as required, will work to facilitate a supportive return to work as efficiently as possible.

The implementation of Niagara Catholic's Attendance Support Program is currently being reviewed by administrators and will be shared with staff later this year.

Niagara Catholic's First Raise Me Up Home Nearing Completion

Last fall, Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) students from Lakeshore Catholic High School and Notre Dame College School began the process of building a new home on a previously unused parcel of land adjacent to Notre Dame College as part of the Board's Raise Me Up Program.

The program is a partnership between Niagara Catholic, Toscani Developments and many other government and community partners, and offers students in two distinct Specialist High Skills Major Programs - Construction and Business, the opportunity to learn the homebuilding industry, literally from the ground up.

The students had the opportunity to learn about engineering and design concepts, surveying and also about framing, plumbing, wiring and other construction tasks associated with building a house.

While students in the Construction SHSM built the home, students in the Business SHSM learned about the behind the scenes work which goes into homebuilding, including planning, purchasing, and financing. They also learned about the municipal rules which govern homebuilding.

Students in the Environmental SHSM have reviewed the benefits of building homes on in-fill lots in neighbourhoods, rather than expanding the urban boundary. They have also examined the advantages of using existing infrastructure such as roads, sewer and hydro, rather than building in new areas, which requires the expansion of an existing system.

Facilities Services has been instructed to design a plan to renovate available space in elementary schools, where possible, into a Chapel.

It will utilize the experience and knowledge gained through the creation of Chapels at each of our eight Catholic secondary schools. Bishop Bergie, Parish Priests, Catholic School Councils and staff will also provide insight into this project.
