A Typical Day

Students are streamed into the classroom and get ready for the day (change shoes, unpack communication book, lunch bag, water bottle etc). Each child signs in each day. Morning announcements O 'Canada and Prayer.

Children choose an activity or read a book. When O Canada begins the children stand up to sing and say prayers. All areas of the classroom are open for the morning.

Guided reading, writing or math take place throughout the morning while the children continue to explore.

Clean up, morning meeting before lunch.

After lunch, creative movement then free choice of Literacy and Math based activities. One day per week the group is divided. One group goes to gym and the other remains in the classroom for guided instruction.

•Near the end of the day, clean up, afternoon meeting. Teacher read aloud.

Pack up, say prayers, dismissal.
