Optional School Supplies

Every summer parents/guardians reach out and ask what they need for the students in September. The list below are recommendations for families who wish to purchase some school supplies.

Your child will receive paper, notebooks, crayons/pencil crayons (basic colours) to share with other, pencils, erasers, glue sticks to share with others, dry eraser markers to share with others. If you prefer for your child to have there own personal supplies, you may wish to consider purchasing items from the list below.

All grades - Kindergarten to Grade 8 students need these items:

- * lunch bag with lunch & 2 snacks (no nuts or nut products)
- * refillable water bottle
- * indoor shoes if possible (Velcro or slip in unless you child can tie their own shoes)
- * backpack

* Change of clothes Kindergarten to Grade 1(shirt, underwear, socks, shorts/pants etc) label everything - please send in on the first day - best to send in inside ziplock bag (to store at the school)

* containers your child can open for lunch/snacks (kindergarten students do receive help)

Kindergarten:

- * personalized hand sanitizer if you wish
- * box of kleenex to share (help build inventory in the class we go through a lot of kleenex)
- * dry eraser marker

Grades 1 - 3:

- * Pencil Case
- * backpack
- * dry erase markers
- * box of kleenex to help build classroom inventory
- * crayons/markers/pencil crayons

Grade 4 - 6:

- * pencil case
- * backpack
- * lunch bag, refillable water bottle
- * calculator

2023 BACK TO SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

On Monday, **August 21, 2023** Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) will post preliminary back to school transportation arrangements for each student enrolled, if they meet policy eligibility for transportation, including bus route numbers, stop locations and times. Finalized Transportation information will be available on **Thursday, August 31, 2023**.

Please visit <u>www.nsts.ca</u> and sign-in to the secure parent portal to get your child's student transportation information. To sign-in to the portal you will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) which can be found on their report card. While signed in, please subscribe to the

delay and cancellation module for direct and timely emails regarding student transportation that impacts your child's bus route.

Please complete the Opt-In to Transportation form in the parent portal to notify NSTS if you intend to have your child(ren) ride the bus. **If you have Opted-In your child(ren) for student transportation this school year (2022/23), there is no need to Opt-In again for the new school year (2023/24).** You can also Opt-Out of Transportation if you do not intend to have your child(ren) ride the bus.

Eligibility information is also available through the portal, including pedestrian directions if your child lives within the non-transported zone of the school and is not eligible for bus service.

Changes to home, pick-up or drop-off addresses must be made through your child's school. During the summer you may notify NSTS of address changes so we can ensure a bus stop is available for your child to start the school year; however, NSTS is not authorized to change student address information.

With the availability of the secure parent portal, *NSTS will not mail student transportation notices* (except for kindergarten students or new students to the system who do not have an OEN to signin to the portal).

KISS N RIDE - stay in vehicles if using kiss n ride drive thru lanes

Parents/guardians or the adult using the Kiss n Ride drive thru area **are asked to stay in their vehicle**. When the driver gets out it causes a lot of hazards and slows down the drop off area. **At drop off - Kiss N Ride Drive through 1 lane**

- Drive to the exit of the drop of area student exit there near the sidewalk
- Do not cut across the grass area to get to cross walk please use

the sidewalks

- ensure backpacks are ready to go with the child and not stowed in a trunk.
- Students exit the right side of the vehicle.

At Dismissal Kiss N Ride Drive through - 2 lanes

- Remain in your vehicle until your child is brought out to the Kiss N Ride area, this will help if we need you to drive around.
- if you are FIRST in the Kiss N Ride be prepared to "go around" to allow the cars behind you who have already received their child to exit the Kiss N Ride.
- Use caution when exiting the Kiss N Ride area
- Adhere to the one-way signs.
- if you do not want to drive around another car to exit the Kiss N Ride please use one of the parking spots. You can then get out of your car and greet your child in the grass area.

Educational staff's primary focus is the students they are dismissing, if you have a message for the school, please call or email the classroom teacher. Staff on duty in the Kiss N Ride area are unable to relay messages.

Staff have been directed by the City of Niagara Falls that they are not to act as crossing guards. It is important that vehicles follow the pedestrian crosswalk arrows and not enter the crosswalk area until people have crossed the road safely.

Drivers who choose to ignore this safety rule may be ticketed. Ticketing is now done electronically – your license plate will be scanned and your will receive a ticket in the mail. There is some parking across from the school, the Kiss N Ride for drop off and the side street.

Allergy Aware School



ALLERGY AWARE SCHOOL - NUT SAFE - ANAPHYLAXES

Within our school community, there are several students who have a life-threatening allergy (anaphylaxis) to foods, predominantly to peanuts and tree nuts (e.g. almond, cashew, hazelnut, pistachio).

We feel the best way to reduce the risk of accidental exposure to these students is to respectfully ask for the co-operation of the parents/guardians within this school community to avoid sending peanut butter or products with peanuts listed in the ingredients. There is a wide range of nutritious foods available to pack for your child. Visit <u>www.eatrightontario.ca</u> for suggestions. For more information on anaphylaxis, visit <u>www.anaphylaxis.ca</u> or <u>www.aaia.ca</u> We are working hard at preventing accidental exposure. It is also important that we have common routines throughout the entire school. <u>There are many shared areas (washrooms, fountains, gym, library, computers, etc.)</u> <u>students could come in contact with allergens.</u> The teachers will explain the importance of the following health and safety routines to the students in their classrooms:

- 1. Wash your hands with soap and water before and after eating.
- 2. Do not bring food that contains peanuts/tree nuts.
- 3. Do not accept food from other students especially if you have food allergies.
- 4. Snacks are not permitted outside in the schoolyard.
- 5. Dispose of all food waste properly.
