#### SCHOOL CASH ONLINE

School Cash Online is a convenient and secure way to pay for school events for your children. It is easy to register and takes less than 5 minutes! Please go to

Registered parents can see their payment history, print receipts and receive email notifications whenever new student fees are posted. Things such as food days, class trips and fundraisers are some examples of items that you can conveniently pay for on School Cash Online, as cash and cheques are not accepted as payment. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

#### **ST. PETER OPEN HOUSE**

Be sure to mark **Tuesday, September 26th** on your calendar, as a time to meet as a community and become familiar with your child's classroom. We will be holding an Open House from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm. This is a great opportunity for students, parents and staff to get to know each other and then allow parents/guardians to familiarize themselves with the expectations of their child's academic/social program for the current year. ## SCHOOL ENTRY

In compliance with the Safe Schools Act, a security card access system is installed. All entry doors are locked.

Students arriving after the entry bell are considered late and must enter through the main office entrance and receive a late slip.

We ask that you please consider scheduling your child(ren)'s appointments (ie. medical, etc.) before or after school if possible, in order to minimize classroom interruptions. Often times, the same classroom is interrupted several times in one day.

If you must pick up your child for an earlier dismissal – please report to the office. For attendance and safety purposes, you will be asked to sign your child out. We will notify the classroom teacher to send your child to the office. Students will not be dismissed from the classroom for earlier dismissal without notification from the office that the parent is waiting

in the office (not in the car). Always send a note to the teacher to inform them when they can expect you.

If you are delivering anything for your child (books, lunch etc.) please label it and leave it at the office and it will be delivered for you. If you let your child know to expect a lunch, he/she can pick it up at the office at the lunch bell.

End of the day dismissal is a very busy time. The safety of all our children is important and we need to monitor people within the school. Adults who are picking up children at the end of the day are not to wait in the halls to meet their children. Please wait for the child(ren) outside of the school at the exit doors. If you must see your child's teacher please wait until the halls have cleared after signing in at the office.

Students are dismissed at the end of the day from their assigned exit doors. For safety reasons, students who do not take the bus are reminded to walk home immediately following dismissal and not remain playing in the yard after school.

Be prepared as a family, make plans for rainy day procedures. Students do not call home to get a ride.

Students who are not regular bus students may not take a bus home to visit a friend after school. Students *may not* change the bus they take home to go to another destination.

#### NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION: ORANGE SHIRT DAY-SEPTEMBER 29TH

Orange Shirt Day is the story of Phyllis Webstad, an Indigenous woman who shared her experience at an Indian Residential School through the children's book, The Orange Shirt Story. By participating in Orange Shirt Day, we recognize the harm done to generations of children by the Indian Residential School system in Canada. The first Orange Shirt Day occurred on September 30th, 2013 as Chief Fred Robbins saw Phyllis' story as a way of bringing together Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. Since that time, Orange Shirt Day has grown into a national awareness among schools, businesses, and communities. In June 2021, the Federal Government of Canada designated September 30th as the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation. While this addresses Call to Action #80 of the Truth and Reconciliations 94 Calls to Action, it coincides with an established day that was created by Survivors of Indian Residential Schools. As a Board we can acknowledge the Federal statutory day, but for school and student activities, for the present time, it remains "Orange Shirt Day" as a way of respecting the grass root Indigenous movement.

#### NCVLE

Please note that classroom teachers will also be spending time reviewing this concept with students during the first few weeks of school. Students and families are also reminded of the importance of accessing assistance through the <u>student</u> and <u>parent</u> support hub pages. # HEAD LICE

Head lice continues to be an ongoing issue, especially in school-aged children. Anyone can get head lice. It has nothing to do with whether you have clean or dirty hair, or the cleanliness of your home.

Check your child weekly. Look for:

Lice: - adult is 1/8" (1-3 mm.) long

- brown or black or gray

- on or close to the scalp

Eggs: - tiny, dark coloured or white (darker coloured eggs are (Nits) especially likely to be alive)

- oval shape

- glued to hair shaft (especially near to the scalp),

behind ears, back of head and under bangs

If you find lice or nits:

· Call the school so a head lice notice can be sent home with classmates.

· Check everyone in the house.

 $\cdot$  Talk with your doctor if someone is pregnant, breast-feeding, is under the age of 2 or has asthma, allergies or seizure disorder.

- · Be sure to follow directions carefully. Do a second treatment as advised.
- · Remove all eggs or some may hatch and the problem will continue and spread to others.
- $\cdot$  Good lighting an a fine tooth comb are needed.

Vacuum your house and wash clothing and bedding used the last 3 days. Remind your children not to share combs, brushes, hats, head-bands etc.

#### SCHOOL DRESS CODE

#### **ELECTRONIC DEVICES/PROCEDURES**

As life seems to get busier by the day for families, we realize that plans change and there may be a need to communicate these changes. We also feel it is important to remind everyone that personal cell phones, digital assistants (PDAs), audio or video recorders and players, or other personal electronic devices are prohibited for use by students in all Niagara Catholic elementary and secondary schools unless specifically approved by staff for instructional or co-instructional purposes. Students are NOT to have cell phones out in class unless under the DIRECT supervision of their teacher. Students are not allowed to have their cell phones out at recess, in the hallways, or in any other areas of the school. If students need to contact their parents at any time, they are ALWAYS allowed to call from the office. If you need to reach your child during the school day to notify them of a change in a plan, we ask that you contact the attendance). For those students who bring a cell phone to school, the Board assumes no responsibility for the safety and security, loss, recovery, repair, or replacement of a personal electronic device when carried on to Board premises.

## **STUDENT INFORMATION FORMS**

#### **IMPORTANT!**

Each September we send home student information forms in the first few days of school and ask them to be returned with updated information; e.g. address, telephone, email changes. The forms this year will be a distinct orange colour. These forms are critical in making sure we have updated contact information for all students which allows clear communication and helps our safety protocol.

#### SCHOOL MASSES

To strengthen our faith and meet as a community our students gather several times each year to celebrate the Eucharist. Please check the monthly calendar for the dates and locations of the school masses. Our opening mass will be held on Tuesday,



September 12th at 10 am. Parents/guardians/grandparents/family are always welcome to attend. Our opening mass will be held at St. Julia's church. St. Julia's has also scheduled grade-specific masses on certain weekends where St. Peter students will help with different parts of the mass. We hope you are able to join us on these occasions.

## **VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL**

All visitors / volunteers to our school **MUST** sign in at the office and sign out when leaving. Visitors (including parents) in the halls will be asked by staff to report to the office. We ask for your co-operation with this routine for the safety of all the children.



#### SUPERVISION OF STUDENTS

Please be aware that the supervision of students in the yard begins at 8:25 a.m. Students arriving prior to this time will remain in the yard without supervision.

#### **BUS TRANSPORTATION**

We ask for your patience during the first weeks of school as wrinkles will be worked out as soon as possible.

#### **PUBLIC HEALTH REMINDER**

It's back to school time again. Is your child's immunization up to date? The Immunization of School Pupils Act is a law to protect the entire community. Changes have been made to this law to improve the health and safety of Ontario's school children. To attend school, your child is now required to be immunized for:

- · Varicella (Chicken Pox)
- · Pertussis (Whooping Cough)
- · Meningococcal Disease

Dose requirements and the time between shots have also been updated for the following:

- · Tetanus
- · Diphtheria
- · Polio
- · Mumps

The requirements for measles and rubella have not changed. For parents of children under the age of 18,

REPORT YOUR CHILD'S VACCINATION ON TIME!

1. **LOCATE** your child's immunization record. If it is missing, contact your child's family doctor or other health care provider who has immunized your child.

2. Have your doctor **CHECK** your child's immunization record and give any immunizations that are missing or book an appointment at a Niagara Region Public Health immunization clinic.

3. **REPORT** any immunizations your child receives to Public Health.

#### **ANAPHYLAXIS ALERT**

As you are aware, the Niagara Catholic District School Board has in place a policy concerning ANAPHYLAXIS – i.e. life-threatening allergies. We have children in our school who suffer extreme allergic reactions to bee stings and certain foods (all nuts and nut products as well as sesame products as well as other foods). Specifically, we have several students in our school who will begin to suffer an extreme reaction by ingesting these products. Our community is encouraged to be sensitive to the real threat that products containing **nuts and nut** products pose to these children. While there is no Board wide ban on peanuts or peanut butter, we would appreciate your cooperation in not sending peanut products in lunches and snacks with your children. We look for your support in making our school environment safe for all of our children.
