· When they get home, check all treats carefully. Throw out any treats that aren't wrapped.

Shirts

 \cdot Navy blue or white oxford-style long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt.

- · Navy blue or white polo-style long-sleeved or short- sleeved shirt.
- · School-designed spirit wear including shirts, sweaters or hoodies.
- · All sweaters must by navy blue or white.

Pants / Skirts

- · Navy blue sweat-pants for students in Kindergarten to Grade 3.
- · Navy blue pants Dress, Cargo, Denim, Kobe, Corduroy style.
- · Navy blue skorts or dresses length must be appropriate and modest.

 \cdot Navy blue walking shorts or capris or Grade 8 students have the option of wearing grey secondary uniform pants.

Shoes

• In an effort to limit student traffic in hallways and keep students and staff safe, families are advised that students will not require a pair of indoor shoes to start the school year. We ask that parents/ guardians please ensure that students come to school each day wearing appropriate and comfortable closed-toe footwear (i.e. running shoes with proper ankle support) that they can remain in throughout the duration of the school day. We also ask that if your child is still learning to tie laces that you send slip-on or Velcro shoes.
