Renewing the Promise Faith Formation for Catholic School Councils

- o C. Morrison suggested we have the outside morning prayers and invite parents.
- Have different grades/ages reading so parents/grandparents are encouraged to attend

Lisa explained that our atmosphere was very calm and students felt safe. Lisa provided some insight into the information sharing process between the school, board and local police. Lisa commends the St. Joseph Staff for handling the situation very well by remaining calm and focusing on student safety.
