- Math continues to be a focus of PD for staff.
- New Literacy curriculum is being unpack by staff. Lots to look and review. Parents will notice 1 grade on report cards. A newer document The Science of Reading is what driving these changes.
- PA Day on Friday has 3 sessions. 1 is Literacy, 2 is Math, and 3 is working on our school improvement plan.
- EQAO results are in. Can't share with public until they do, but we will be using the data to drive our improvement plan.
