### SAFE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

As we continue to assess areas of concern surrounding student safety, we would like to offer the following reminders.

### SAFETY REMINDERS at ST. PATRICK CATHOLIC

**RIDING BIKES** — With the warmer weather approaching, a number or students are riding their bikes to school. Students are reminded to bring a lock for their bikes to keep them from being stolen.

For safety reasons, students must wear a helmet and walk the bike on school property avoiding the driveways. Do not bring scooters to school. We have nowhere safe to store them.

**ANAPHYLAXIS** – We have some students with Anaphylaxis: a life threatening condition caused by an allergic reaction to certain foods, insect stings, medications, products, etc. It can lead to a loss of life in as little time as five minutes, if not responded to immediately.

If a child has an allergic reaction he/she must be given a needle injection (Epi-pen) immediately and rushed to hospital. As spring approaches, we remind our students that snacks are not permitted outside, so as not to attract bees. Also, we encourage students to keep our school **peanut-safe.** 

We do not allow snacks to be shared between students.

We do not allow snacks or drinks outside at recess.

Niagara Catholic Accessibility; An Evening Event in Support of Accessibility Awareness The Niagara Catholic District School Board and the Accessibility Planning Committee are pleased to invite parents, guardians, staff and community partners to a motivational evening featuring Niagara Catholic

graduate, public speaker, and activist, Michael Jacques and disability advocate Charlene VanderGriendt, from The Rick Hansen Foundation. Public speaker, activist, and author Michael Jaques, has written and selfpublished his book Can't Read, Can't Write, Here's My Book using speech-to-text technology. Michael is diagnosed with autism and an intellectual disability and shares his life experiences to help audiences understand accepting and belonging. Disability advocate, Charlene VanderGriendt, from The Rick Hansen Foundation will discuss how to speak and interact inclusively. Students with disabilities will share their perspectives on building a culture of acceptance through taped video interviews. The words we use carry meaning and power. This exciting free event will take place on Monday, April 15th from 6:00-8:00 pm at The Holiday Inn and Conference Centre (327 Ontario Street, St. Catharines) and includes light snacks, refreshments and door prizes.

### EQAO: Provincial Assessment-Grade 3 and Grade 6 MAY and JUNE 2024

Students in Grades 3 & 6 will participate in the Provincial Assessment during the time period of May – June. Dates and times will be determined. This annual testing provides the school board and school an overview of how students are mastering skills and understanding concepts in language and math.

Please refrain from taking any vacation during this time if your child is participating in EQAO.

School results and other data are used for school improvement planning. The assessment is conducted in a very low-key manner and our experience has shown that it does not cause undue stress on children. Please do not hesitate to call the school, should you have any questions or concerns. This testing will be on-line this school year.

### **Top 10 Things to Help the Environment**

- 1. Smart Shopping Buy what you need, not what you want. Buy used items.
- 2. Simple Savers- weather strip windows and doors, use aerators on faucets, replace incandescent light bulbs with fluorescent ones
- 3. Transportation Alternatives Walk, cycle, car pool and use public transportation. Reduce idling

- 4. Food Choices- choose local and organic foods, eat less meat
- 5. Washing and Drying Wash full loads of clothes in cold water and hang to dry
- 6. Heating and Cooling For summer air conditioning, set your thermostat to 24°C or 25°C. For winter heating, set your thermostat to 19°C or 20°C. Install ceiling fans and programmable thermostats
- 7. Close to Home Vacation, travel and work as close to home as possible
- 8. Bathroom Basics Take short showers instead of baths, close water taps while brushing your teeth
- 9. Careful Cleaning Choose natural, non-toxic cleaning products; make simple, natural cleaners with ingredients like vinegar, baking soda and water
- 10. Don't Discard Donate, reuse and recycle items before throwing them into the trash. Harmful materials like chemicals, batteries, electronics, etc. should be taken to local hazardous waste depots or recyclers.

Niagara Region Public Health will be returning to our school on May 27th to vaccinate students in grades 7 with a previously submitted consent form for the following routine school vaccine(s):

· Meningococcal

Single dose required for school attendance under the Immunization of School Pupils Act:

· Hepatitis B (HB)

2 or 3 dose series – depending on age and health history

· Human Papillomavirus (HPV)

2 or 3 dose series – depending on age and health history

On clinic day, please remind your child to:

(7) Eat breakfast or a snack

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Bring a distraction (book, music, phone) as a comfort measure (optional)

If your child feels nervous and anxious about vaccination, learn about the CARD System to help improve the vaccination experience.
