

Catholic Education Week "We Are Called to Love"

The theme for Catholic Education Week 2024 was inspired by the following considerations:

- With joyful anticipation of the Jubilee Year of 2025, we are inspired by Pope Francis announcing the theme of "Pilgrims of Hope." With open hearts of love, we can continue to "fan the flame of hope" for a bright future.
- On the fifth anniversary of Renewing the Promise, we celebrate that Catholic Education is centred on our Christian call to love. Educational Field Trips

"21st Century Learning" and the Use of Classroom Learning Tools (incl. cell phones)

21st Century learning refers to developing learning, literacy and life skills in our students as part of the classroom experience. In order to fully prepare them for modern work environments, critical thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication skills will be emphasized during classroom activities. Teachers will ensure that students have all the required learning tools necessary for them to be successful each and every day. Our Electronic Communications Systems Policy will be updated for next school year.

As currently stated in the Electronic Communications Systems Policy, all school and personal electronic devices are permitted in Niagara Catholic elementary and secondary school classrooms for instructional purposes only. The expectation is that students will use NCDSB's electronic communications systems for educational purposes. Students who carry cell phones when travelling to and from school, for safety reasons, are reminded they are not allowed to use their cell phones to call home or text message once they are on school property. All cell phones <u>must remain off</u> and <u>put away</u> during the school day unless noted by the classroom teacher! Students are asked to please use the <u>student phone in the office</u> if they are not feeling well or wish to contact home.

Emergency Medical Protocols

At Notre Dame, we work cooperatively with families in order to provide a safe, inclusive, and healthy educational environment for all students. We recognize that students who are at risk because of medical concerns such as **allergic reactions**, **diabetes**, **epilepsy**, **intolerances**, **asthma and/or seizures** require an intervention plan for their needs to be met and to reach their full potential at school.

If your child requires a specific plan of care, please contact the school at your earliest convenience so we can ensure his or her safety while in our care.

As activities and educational field trips are being scheduled for your children, we ask that parents sign up for our convenient payment program, SCHOOL CASH ONLINE. This is an excellent way to pay for student activities without sending money to school.

<u>School Messenger - Safe Arrival</u>

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely to school each and every day. School Messenger allows parents to report their child's absence quickly and conveniently using the **mobile app**, a **website**, or an **interactive toll-free phone line** to report an absence, late arrival or early departure, in advance. This process allows the school to verify student attendance and notify parents of an unreported student absence efficiently.

If your child is marked absent and the absence hasn't been explained in advance, our SafeArrival system will contact you to get a reason for the absence. Calls will continue until you choose an option to explain your child's absence. **PLEASE** using the the following information to report your child's absence: mobile app, online: https://go.schoolmessenger.ca/#/home or by calling 1-844-287-6287. It is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
