NIAGARA CATHOLIC THEOLOGICAL THEME 2021-2022

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Rooted in the Mission Statement, Vision and Values of the Niagara Catholic District School Board and in compliance with the Board's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan, one of the Board's two Strategic Directions is to *"Build Strong Catholic Identity and Community to Nurture the Distinctiveness of Catholic Education"*.

As we approach the conclusion of the current three year theological theme, a system level committee was formed to design a new one year theological theme for Niagara Catholic for 2021-2022. A complete three year theological theme will be selected next year for 2022-2025 to align with the Board's next Strategic Plan and Directions.

Development of the Theological Theme

Early conversations emphasized the importance of recognizing the challenges we have faced in education and throughout the world throughout the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Key themes which emerged from these discussions were a desire to focus on how we have and will continue to overcome obstacles together as a community of faith.

The theme will explore the importance of recognizing our individual faith journeys, the diverse experiences, challenges, and strengths we carry with us, as well as the significance of journeying together.

Theological Theme – 2021-2022

Through prayer, reflection, sharing and with the endorsement of Bishop Bergie, there was consensus on the following theme to guide Niagara Catholic through the next school year:

Climbing Mountains Together in Faith

Scriptural Foundation and Connections for the Theme

Psalm 120-134

The Psalms of Ascent: Songs for the Journey

This collection of 15 psalms speak about the journey of the Jewish people as they climbed the mountains on their way to Jerusalem. It highlights both the physical nature of climbing a mountain, as well as the spiritual metaphor of our journey towards Heaven.

As a community of faith, this calls us to reflect upon the both the joy and challenges of our daily lives. This past year has taught us the importance of adversity, perseverance, and patience. There are days when the challenges we face may seem overwhelming and to some impossible. And yet, we continue on, day after day, seeking to grow and journey together not only as individuals but as a whole community.

Psalm 121:1-2

I lift up my eyes to the mountains— where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth.

We, much like the Jewish people of the time, are all at different stages of our journey. Some of us stand at the base of the mountain looking upward with hope and anticipation of all that is to come when we reach our destination; others stare at the mountain in fear of the unknown; while many more find themselves at different heights an

d on all different sides of the mountain. None of us stand in the exact same location.

Our theological theme will also help us to explore and celebrate the diversity of our Niagara Catholic community, while also recognizing the challenges of equity and inclusivity.

System Implementation 2021-2022

Our theological theme will once again direct such elements as the daily prayer and resource package forwarded to all schools; Adult Faith Formation sessions; school and system faith-centered events; the Journey Retreat program focus; grade level retreats, prayer services, daily prayers, resources for all Administrators, Chaplaincy Leaders, Faith Ambassadors and faith connections for all staff through *myNiagaraCatholic* and the *Virtual Chapel*.

With the engagement of a new theological theme, *Climbing Mountains Together in Faith* may we all grow together on this great journey of faith, more deeply preparing ourselves to always meet the expectations of our Board's mission:

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Niagara Catholic District School Board will be providing a report on remote learning as per Policy/Program Memorandum (PPM) No.164 for the 2020-2021 school year to the Ministry of Education by July 31, 2021. A requirement of this report on remote learning is to seek feedback from students, parents/guardians and staff about their remote learning experiences.

The first report included feedback from parents/guardians and educators presented at the Committee of the Whole meeting on March 9, 2021. This second report includes feedback from parents/guardians, students and educators collected from December 2020 until April 2021.

PPM No.164 requires school boards to monitor and evaluate experiences with remote learning, gather feedback from students, parents/guardians and staff, and develop and implement a process for data collection related to:

- areas in which educators require additional support in implementing remote learning, including providing student and educator access to technology and the Internet;
- strategies to provide training related to the identified areas of need, including learning and well-being;
- details of implementation progress and monitoring activities, including the number of exemptions from synchronous learning and what alternative approaches were used;
- parent and student feedback on the impact of remote learning, including:
 - level of student engagement in learning;
 - ease of online learning participation;
 - \circ access to teachers;
 - o ease and access to technology; and
- information on how parent and student feedback is being taken into account in the delivery of remote learning.

Based on the feedback collected throughout the school year, school boards are expected to make adjustments to their implementation of the requirements in PPM No. 164.
