• Niagara Nutrition Partners – Thank you to our support staff that are running the program. They prepare the snacks, prepare the bins, drop them off and recollect at the end of the day. We had "Pie in the Face" fundraiser to help raise funds for this program. The funds are low so they are relying on school communities to help support this endeavour.

• Confirmation and First Holy Communion – (Communion Tea, Rosaries, Stoles) – First Communion starts the week after Easter. Parents can choose one out of 5 weekends. Some of the families coordinated dates. The Church asked for volunteers to bring up the gifts and read. All of our students volunteered. They received their readings today. Thank you to Mrs. Rosano for helping make rosaries. Father Michael was here last week and he blessed the rosaries. The students went to the church for a workshop. They are ready and excited to go.

For Confirmation we are also making Rosaries and decorating stoles.
