4. **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

- 1. School Activities
 - a. Jr. Basketball Oct 28, 30
 -Junior Girls Basketball will be held on the 28th and Junior Boys on the 30th at St. Paul. Grade 4's are excited as this is their first opportunity to be a part of a school team.

5. STAFF REPORT

- 1. T. Dellaventura Go Girls, PD Day
- PD Day: J. Lafontaine led the staff in discussion about our Board and School Improvement Plans. We discussed goals for Literacy, Numeracy, Faith, Culture and Pathways. We reviewed the Safe School Incident Reporting process.
- Go Girls: Go Girls is a program run by the Big Brother/Big Sister Organization. All Grade 8 girls will be participating in the program one day a week during their lunch, beginning Wednesday, October 30th for 7 weeks. 2 mentors will come in each week and help to organize activities in the gym and group discussion over lunch and snacks.
- 2. S. Orsini Halloween
- S. Orsini Halloween activities will take place in the morning. Students are to come to school dressed in their costumes. Students will parade two times around the school at 9:15. Weather permitting it will be outdoors and if it is raining students will walk through the main floor of the school. K-6 students can wear costumes or orange/black if they prefer, and Grade 7s and 8s can wear orange/black. No weapons are allowed as part of the costumes. No snacks are allowed to come to the school. Anything that is sent to the school to be shared, will be sent home with the students to ensure safety for our students with allergies. Teachers will be planning curriculum-based activities in the classroom.
- J. Lafontaine Some Grade 7 and 8 students have expressed an interest in wearing costumes this year. I suggested that they bring this to the attention of our student council as an opportunity for our council to take on some leadership. It will be reviewed and discussed, and a decision will be made.
- 3. K. Zahn Big Box Fundraiser
- K. Zahn Our Big Box Fundraiser was extremely successful. We sold 347 boxes at \$11.00 profit/box = \$3800.00 in profit for the school. There are 24 boxes still to be returned. We have to wait for all boxes to be returned before we can deliver the orders. Draws for winners will take place after all items have been cleared up.

Spirituality Committee

- To provide opening prayers before meetings.

- To assist with the Soup Kitchen.
- J. Nolan Students are at mass most weeks. Just a gentle reminder to teachers to remind their students to show honour and respect to Jesus who is always in the Tabernacle .
- J. Nolan We are continuing with our Rosary Group on Tuesdays. It is a small group, but we are hopeful that over time it will grow again.
- J. Nolan The soup kitchen will be starting again soon. Mrs. Vacca is the teacher in charge of this program. This year we are going to include dates until May, and if funding is not provided to allow the soup kitchen to run that long, then we will cancel them at that time. We will create a list for volunteers to assist with picking up and delivering the soup. Please include your emails so that Mrs. Dolan can send out reminders.
 - L. Rosano This year we are asking for more involvement from the kids again have the teachers make the soup with the students. Mrs. Vacca will advise the staff.
- J. Nolan We are getting ready for Confirmation. We will be helping to create their Stoles. Confirmation will be held on February 20th, 2020. For those that have not had the opportunity to attend a Confirmation, it is a very nice ceremony, Bishop Bergie is there and he is very engaging with the students.
- J. Nolan We have started the Samaritan's Purse campaign. Mrs. Dolan delivered 2 boxes to each of the classrooms and they are asked to fill the boxes with school supplies such as pencils, pens, erasers, etc. The campaign will run for two weeks.
- J. Nolan We will be starting an Ongoing Food Drive. We will be delivering a bin to the school which will be decorated by the students. Food Drive can be ongoing. Anytime there is an event at the school such as a Christmas Concert, a Public Speaker event, etc. parents can donate food. All donations will go to the 250 families currently being served by the local St. Vincent de Paul Society.

Garden/ECO Committee

- A. Holmes Came in a few weeks ago and pulled some weeds (with the help of her husband). Hope to come back in the next week or so to pick up garbage and tidy things up before the snow falls. A. Holmes and family also decorated our front entrance. Thanks goes to the family.

We could spread them out over the year for different events.

- R. Lyachovics Some other dates include; April 2nd for Pasta Night and June 9th for the End of the Year Fair.
- J. Lafontaine We have five fundraisers in November; we have the food drive, the Samaritan's Purse campaign, the baskets, mittens and hats donations and dance-a-thon, and we are finishing up the Card fundraiser. We have to keep in mind how much we are asking for at the same time.
