Student Achievement

New Language Curriculum:

Effective the beginning of this school year, the Ministry of Education launched a new Language Curriculum document. There are many changes to the curriculum as opposed to previous versions including new strand that have been implemented and there are also reporting differences that you will notice on the Term One and Term Two report cards. As a staff we have already used time during our September staff meeting as well as divisional meetings for more specified and detailed discussion.

In addition to a focus on Language, recent changes to both the Mathematics and Science curriculum continue to be areas of importance and focus as we develop school wide goals for our Annual School Improvement and Equity Plan (SIEP). We also continue to emphasize our continued use of the MathUP classroom resource to help facilitate numeracy instruction. The upcoming PA Day in October will have time devoted to it regarding instructional practices in both Literacy and Numeracy as well as laying the foundation for our SIEP.

School Climate

Kindergarten Play Structure and Outdoor Learning Environment

We have some very excited Kinders who are waiting patiently for their new Recess Play area and Outdoor Learning Environment to be completed. Exact timelines are always hard to adhere to when it comes to construction projects but the work thus far has been moving along quite nicely and we remain cautiously optimistic of a late fall - early winter timeframe to be able to access that area.
