# **Catholic Faith and Community**

During the month of February, we celebrated Kids Helping Kids month through a variety of out of dress code days, and a variety of activities within the classroom. All money raised was donated to the Niagara Children's Centre and the Niagara Foundation for Catholic Education. Our Easter mass schedule began and kindergarten to grade 8 students attended mass at St. Helen celebrating the Easter Season. The month of May brought Catholic Education Week and many different activities celebrating our faith in action. Our focus on incorporating Catholic Graduate Expectations will continue through the month of June.

# Student Achievement

Student Achievement continued to be a strong force with our students participating in many different activities. St. Mark hosted our very first Vex Robotics Tournament during Catholic Education week, where students demonstrated complex problem solving skills by building and competing in a tournament where their robot had to complete activities to gain points. Our Junior and Intermediate teams displayed sportsmanship and a strong understanding of technology and robotics.

Staff continued with professional development in Structured Literacy and piloting new reading assessment resources. These assessments will help us better understand where our students are at with their understanding of phonological skills and phonemic awareness.

# Mental Health, Well-Being and Engagement

Mrs. Dekoe, Child and Youth Worker continued to work with all classrooms on social skills and programming. Class trips that incorporated physical activity and wellness have been planned for various classes throughout the school and will be taking place in late May, early June. Track and Field is being revamped and students from grades 4 to 8 will be trying out for Track and Field. In the past our student have tried out during class, however this year class will be for practice and official tryouts will take place on May 26. Students will sign up for events prior to the day, all events will take place on school property and at the park, and a concession stand will be set up for student to purchase snacks. Our much anticipated Basket Raffle will be taking place in early June and staff are hard at work completing our First St. Mark yearbook to celebrate our year together.
