1. Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee Report

### **Principal's Report**

#### **Catholicity**

Sacraments and Mass: Fr. Krys is communicating directly with the parish in regards to making up the sacraments of Communion and Confirmation from last year. We have been told that attending Mass is not allowed at this time, so Fr. Krys and I will be working out a schedule for him to conduct Mass in our school Gymnasium for some of our students. Further, Fr. Krys is working on the sacramental preparation with our grade two and eight students for this year.

*Mini-Retreats:* From December 1<sup>st</sup> -10<sup>th</sup>, 2020, our new Champlain, Diane Conidi, will visit our school and facilitate two classroom spiritual retreats per day - one in the a.m. and p.m. The themes of the retreat will be Prayer for primary classes, Love for junior classes, and Discipleship for the intermediate classes!

#### **Student Achievement**

**Math UP:** St. Mark Catholic Elementary School has been selected to participate to be a MathUP school. This unique program offers a robust set of focused tools to help build capacity in teaching mathematics through professional learning for both teachers and administrators to benefit student learning! In addition, all grades three to six classroom teachers have received a license for MathUP Classroom to support the programming within the classrooms. Staff received a training session in the MathUP program initiative at the P.A. Day on November 18, 2020. We look forward to watching the growth in our students' mathematical thinking throughout this school year.

**Progress Reports:** Progress Report Cards are now available in the Parent Portal, and the corresponding parent-teacher interviews will take place with virtual or telephone meetings at the request of the parent or teacher. Each teacher will be sending out correspondence to allow families the opportunity to request an interview date and time. I encourage all parents to discuss the report cards with their children and schedule an appointment with their children's teachers.

#### **School Climate**
