H. AGENDA ITEMS BROUGHT FORWARD

1. Can we see the schools financial report? What do we have in the bank? Profit from fundraising?

- Fundraising vs. board budget – last year's report – St. Mark started in the hole because of items needing to be purchased. Chromebooks and an interactive flat panel have been purchased. Parent engagement funding allows \$500, so Paul Davis spoke to our community and this money went towards that. Technology for the kinder rooms is a priority.

Money earned from ice-cream sales goes directly towards graduation fees. Last year the price was \$3500 – or around there – this year Club Roma price will be going up.

Discussion around Club Roma – students deserve a good evening and even though prices have gone up, but because it's outside, pictures are beautiful and the doors open up for families to take pictures. There are many positives with Club Roma - supervision, safety etc.

The date for graduation is June 20th

Mrs. Manchuk mentioned that our school will be offering a shawarma lunch in the future.

Question – is there a way to supplement/fundraise for pricing of class trips. From the fundraising, we can allocate money to assist with this. Bussing has been expensive in previous years. It was stated that rather than fundraising money for school trips that would work out to \$2 or \$3 per student being subsidized for bussing, that money would be better spent on updating technology in the school.

DFS fundraising made \$3400, and last year the dance-a-thon made \$14,000. Fielding wine fundraiser will be put on hold. This year we will do a car show with a vendor fair – Saturday, June 8th.

Reading supports for primary and junior grades

• HD Word from Really Great Reading – rollout has started in grades 4 and 5. Grade 6 will start in January. Great resource to teach junior students' phonemic awareness and phonics as part of the new Language Arts curriculum rollout

• Additional Lexia Licenses have been given to all grade 3 students, and professional development for staff has started

• Reading Intervention Groups – every afternoon, Mrs. Zamfir works with small groups of students on reading intervention. Both Empower and RGR are being utilized as the resource of choice. Empower students visit every day for up to one hour until mid-May. RGR groups visit each day and students rotate in based on need and progress

• Numeracy Intervention Groups – Mrs. Duffy has started our Numeracy Intervention Groups with select grade 6 students. Each group works with Mrs. Duffy for 30 intensive intervention lessons. The groups are rotated after the 30 lessons with follow up activities for the classroom teacher to utilize in the classroom

Mental Health and Well-Being

• CYW support – continued support for all K to 8 classes – Abby Vanderlee is our CYW and visits St. Mark on day 1 and 2 of the 5 day cycle

• Social Worker support – Steven Johnston is our social worker for this school year. Referrals are submitted by the school after conversations with families

• St. Mark staff and students recognized the importance of raising awareness for Mental Health by wearing plaid on Thursday November 23rd

Technology in the Classroom

• As we raise more money, technology will be purchased – Chromebooks to accommodate the grade 3 students using Lexia and to replace old Chromebooks that have been recycled.

School Climate
