The Feast of the Holy Family is celebrated on Saturday and Sunday December 26, and 27. (The mass times are the regular weekend mass times : 5 (Saturday afternoon); 9&11 Sunday morning.

New Year's Day, the celebration of Mary, the Mother of God, in Canada is a <u>holy day of obligation</u>. Masses on Thursday, Dec. 31 is at 5 p.m. and Friday, January '1 at 9 & 11 a.m. **Epiphan**y (the visit of the Magi) is celebrated on Saturday and Sunday (2 and 3 January 2021) at the regular weekend hours.

The Baptism of Jesus is celebrated on Saturday and Sunday 9 and 10 January 2021 at the regular hours.

On December 8, 2020, Pope Francis issued an Apostolic Letter "Patris Corde" (With a Father's Heart) to mark the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being named the Patron Saint of the Universal Church. He established a 'Year of St. Joseph' in order to celebrate this anniversary. In the letter the Holy Father describes this great saint as a beloved Father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father, a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows who always focuses on Mary and Jesus. This Year of St. Joseph is a gift to the Church during these difficult days. The Holy Father writes that it is his hope that, "Each of us can discover in Joseph -- the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence -- an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble," St. Joseph provides an excellent role model for us, especially for husbands and fathers. He ended his Apostolic Letter with a prayer: "Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen." The Holy Father has also granted certain indulgences to mark the year.
