- Look at data to improve our instructional practice
 - School and board average (provincial standards (1-4 scale) Scale: 1-2 low; 3- met standards; 4- exceeds standards - a sliding scale is used.
- EQAO dates last week of May early June

□ To support the critical linkage between mental health and well-being and student success

- Work with our Board social worker
- 8-10 visits at school (private to families and school)
- Families and children will maintain confidentiality
- □ To improve support for children and youth with special education needs and their families
- The new portable houses special needs equipment for our students
- □ To provide support for students to be successful in de-streamed learning environments.
- The Ministry has eliminated the math levels (academic/applied) from the grade 9 levels; all are combined, De-streamed programs for grade 9 students.
- AP classes are being offered at Blessed Trinity (Advanced Placement)
- □ To ensure that all young learners receive the necessary foundational

skills and early interventions in reading that are critical to future success

- New Language Curriculum explicit for teachers to help students learn how to read, a modified version of phonics and sound instructions
