Meet the Teacher Night - was on Thursday, September 15th and we had a wonderful turnout of families visiting the classrooms!

We had an assembly to learn about Terry Fox's legacy and how students can help others in their everyday lives. Students also participated in grade appropriate lessons about Terry Fox's perseverance and courage. The walk was scheduled for today, but due the rain it will be rescheduled.

Rowan's Law Day - concussion awareness/safety day. "A Bump on the head or body can hurt - so tell an adult right away." On Wednesday, September 28th, Students are encouraged to wear purple clothing and accessories to recognize this concussion awareness day.

Orange Shirt Day - Wear orange clothing and accessories on Friday, September 30th. Orange Shirt Day is the story of Phyllis Webstad an Indigenous woman who shared her experience at a Residential School

through the children's book, The Orange Shirt Story. Resources have been provided to teachers to present age appropriate lessons about this day of Truth and Reconciliation.

On September 22nd - many classes participated in a virtual meet with Grandmother Renee Thomas-Hill who is a Grandmother, Elder, and Indigenous Knowledge Keeper from the Six Nations reserve. She is a water protector who has addressed the UN General Assembly about the importance of water on Turtle Island. She is a speaker on spirituality and mental health. This meet was organized by the Indigenous team at Niagara Catholic. The students at Canadian Martyrs School had an opportunity to listen and learn about her teachings.

Scholastic Book Fair - Mrs. Penner the librarian will be running a book fair during the week of October 3-7th. This is a great opportunity for students to purchase books and part of the proceeds will go back into buying books for the library.
