

Student safety is our first priority. Please keep the following procedures in mind:

- · Morning supervision begins at the arrival of the first bus at 8:25 AM. Supervision concludes with bus supervision at 3:05 PM.
- · Please do not drop off before 8:25 AM.
- · Remain with your child until supervision begins.
- · All students are supervised during nutrition and activity breaks.
- · Upon arrival, Grade 4-8 students are to enter the school through the front entrance. Kindergarten thru Grade 3 students are to enter through door west of the gym.
- · So we can accurately track student arrival, if any student arrives after the 8:35 AM bell, they are to buzz the office at the front door and pick up a late slip before going to their classroom.

Back to School Bus Transportation Information

On Monday, August 19, 2024 Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) posted preliminary back to school transportation arrangements for each student enrolled, if they meet policy eligibility for transportation, including bus route numbers, stop locations and times. Finalized Transportation information is available as of Thursday, August 29, 2024.

Please visit <u>www.nsts.ca</u> and sign-in to the secure parent portal to get your child's student transportation information. To sign-in to the portal you will need your child's Ontario Education Number (OEN) which can be found on their report card. While signed in, please subscribe to the delay and cancellation module for direct and timely emails regarding student transportation that impacts your child's bus route.

Please complete the Opt-In to Transportation form in the parent portal to notify NSTS if you intend to have your child(ren) ride the bus. If you have Opted-In your child(ren) for student transportation last school year (2023/24), there is no need to Opt-In again for the new school year (2024/25). You can also Opt-Out of Transportation if you do not intend to have your child(ren) ride the bus. Eligibility information is also available through the portal, including pedestrian directions if your child lives within the non-transported zone of the school and is not eligible for bus service. Changes to home, pick-up or drop-off addresses must be made through your child's school. During the summer you may notify NSTS of address changes so we can ensure a bus stop is available for your child to start the school year; however, NSTS is not authorized to change student address

information. With the availability of the secure parent portal, NSTS will not mail student transportation notices (except for kindergarten students or new students to the system **who do not have an OEN** to sign-in to the portal).

Please contact NSTS if you have questions regarding your child's transportation arrangements.

Please note that if you must OPT - IN before August 28th at 3:00 pm in order to receive transportation the first week of school.

Bus Safety

At the Stop - Be 5 to 10 minutes early, and stand on the inside of the sidewalk/ shoulder away from the roadway.

When the Bus Arrives - Line up in a straight line, wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the doors to open, and never touch the outside of the bus.

Getting on the Bus - Get on the bus one at a time, hold the handrail as you climb the stairs, and go directly to your seat and get settled.

Riding on the Bus - Sit with your back to the back of the seat and your bottom to the bottom of your seat with your school bag on your lap, and use your quiet speaking voice so that the bus driver can concentrate on driving.

Getting off the Bus - Stay in your seat until the bus comes to a complete stop, only get off the bus at your school or at your bus stop, look for your parent/ guardian before you get off the bus if that is your routine, and always tell the bus driver if you do not see your parent/ guardian at the bus stop waiting for you if that is your routine or if you missed the stop.

Crossing in Front of the Bus - Watch and wait for the bus driver to signal to you to cross the road once it is safe to do so.

Crossing Guard Safety

Please ensure that you wait to cross the street ONLY after the Crossing Guard sounds her whistle 2 times. When the Crossing Guard sounds her whistle 1 time it means for everyone to stop.

Emergency Medical Protocols

At Mary Ward, we work cooperatively with families in order to provide a safe, inclusive, and healthy educational environment for all students. We recognize that students who are at risk because of medical concerns such as allergic reactions, Diabetes, Epilepsy, intolerances, asthma and/or seizures require an intervention plan for their needs to be met and to reach their fullest potential at school. If your child requires a specific plan of care, please contact the school at your earliest convenience so we can ensure his or her safety during the school day.

Anaphylaxis

At Mary Ward Catholic, we continue to have several students with Anaphylaxis – a severe life threatening condition caused by an allergic reaction to certain food products (i.e.) peanuts, dairy, medications, latex products, inhalers and insect stings from bees or wasps. Residue on any material that has been touched by hands that have not been properly washed may also trigger a severe allergic reaction. Anaphylaxis requires immediate first aid (Epipen) and immediate medical intervention. Classroom teachers who have children with anaphylaxis are working hard to prevent accidental exposure to products that trigger life-threatening reactions. We are requesting that all

parents co-operate by not sending specific foods for lunch or snacks that could trigger a life threatening reaction. Thank you in advance for your co-operation with this life-threatening concern.

Eyes Ready for the School Year!

Proper vision is important for a student's learning and social development. A full eye exam by an eye doctor (optometrist) is the best way to ensure a healthy eyes and good vision.



The Eye See...Eye Learn® program is for students in junior and

senior kindergarten to have a full eye exam (covered by OHIP) with a <u>participating optometrist</u>. If a child needs glasses, they will receive a free pair donated by Plastic Plus, Modern Optical Canada and the participating optometrist. For children aged 19 and under, OHIP covers the cost of a complete annual eye exam and any follow-up assessments that may be required.

A yearly eye exam is recommended - find an eye doctor near you.

Safely Packing Lunches

- Clean
 - Wash your hands for 20 seconds with soap and water before preparing any meal
 - Make sure you sanitize countertops, utensils and any lunch boxes or lunch bags
 - For surfaces and lunch boxes/bags: mix 2.5 ml (1/2 tsp) of bleach with 1 L (4 cups) of water
 - Apply to surface and let stand briefly.
 - Rinse with clean water and air dry or use a clean towel.
 - Wash raw fruits and vegetables before eating
- 2. Keep Cold Food Cold
 - Meat, chicken, seafood, eggs, and dairy products must stay cold to stay safe. Use frozen packs to keep food at or below 4°C (40 F).
 - Use an insulated lunch bag and place freezer packs between foods that need to stay cold.
 Refrigerate the night before to get your lunch bag off to a cool start.
- 3. Keep Hot Food Hot
 - Hot food must stay hot at above 60°C (140°F). Use insulated containers and keep them closed until ready to eat or take your food cold and reheat it

Grade 7 Immunization Campaign

Niagara Region Public Health's school-based vaccination clinics will begin in September for the following publicly funded <u>routine school</u> vaccinations:



- Meningococcal
- · Single dose
- <u>Required for school attendance</u> under the Immunization of School Pupils Act
- Hepatitis B (HB)
- 2 or 3 dose series depending on age and health history
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV)
- 2 or 3 dose series depending on age and health history

Parents/legal guardians of grade 7 students will receive an information package and instructions on how to submit their completed consent form. Parents/legal guardians must complete the consent form whether their child is receiving **all**, **some**, or **none** of the vaccines. More information will be provided through your child's school.

Active School Travel

Back to school means restarting morning drop off and afternoon pick up routines. This year take the stress out of driving and consider active school travel instead! Active school travel is any



mode of transportation that is powered by humans – walking, biking, and scootering for example. There are several benefits of active school travel for your children:

- More people walking means fewer cars and cleaner air around the school
- Kids who walk, bike, or roll to school arrive alert and ready to learn
- Active transportation to school counts towards daily physical activity needs for your children
- And much more!

To help build confidence and participate in active transportation safely, consider reviewing the resources below:

- <u>Cycle Safety Virtual Bike Rodeo</u> education and training for safe cycling featuring skills like putting on a helmet, using hand signals, and doing shoulder checks

School Messenger

One of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely to school each and every day. School Messenger allows parents to report their child's absence quickly and conveniently using a mobile app, a web site, or an interactive toll-free phone line to report an absence, late arrival or early departure, in advance.

As a result, it will take the school less time to verify student attendance, and less time to begin to notify parents and guardians of absences that were unexpected or unplanned. This time savings makes it faster and more efficient to account for all students and their safety.

If your student is marked absent and the absence hasn't been explained in advance, our SafeArrival system will be able to rapidly contact you by automated phone call, text message, email, or mobile app push notification to get a reason for the absence. Calls and contacts will continue until you choose an option to explain the absence.

PLEASE continue to call and advise the school of your child's absences, late arrival or early dismissals by using the mobile app, online https://go.schoolmessenger.ca/#/home or by calling 1-844-287-6287. It'll be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to make it convenient for you to report future absences.

Student Information Forms

On the first day of school, you will be receiving a copy of the student information sheet, which the school keeps on file for all children in our building. The information provided should be current and up to date, as it is critical that we have a means of contacting you during the day should there be a need. Please return these with changes indicated in the space provided by Friday September 13, 2024.

Should there be any changes during the school year, please keep us informed. It is imperative that we have accurate and complete information on file. If you have a current email address, please be sure to add it on the form in the space

Standardized Dress Code

A friendly reminder that all schools within the Niagara Catholic District School Board follow a standardized dress code. Simplified, the dress code requires students to wear a white or navy shirt with a collar and navy bottoms - pants, shorts or skirts. For specific requirements, please contact the school with any concerns. It is our goal to work with you and to support and alleviate any concerns you may have.



Niagara Catholic has a standardized dress code for students in all of our Catholic elementary schools. All students wear navy blue bottoms and navy blue or white shirts.

OUR DRESS CODE COLOURS

Tops

a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the following

- Navy or white Oxford shirt (short or long sleeve) or;
- Navy or white collared shirt (short or long sleeve)

The elementary standardized dress code shirt must be plain (no logos or advertising) and buttoned in a respectable manning



Bottoms

- At a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the following:
- Navy sweat pants (Kindergarten Grade 3) or;
- · Navy pants (capri, cargo, denim, kobe or corduroy) or;
- Navy skorts, skirts or dresses or,
- Navy walking shorts.

Only knee-length shorts, skirts or dresses are permitted. All clothing must be in good repair. Grade 8 students have the option to wear grey secondary uniform pants.



Shoes

For health and safety reasons, running shoes with a full back and closed toe are the recommended footwear. Parents/guardians should provide a pair indoor shoes for physical education and indoor wear. Socks must be worn with the elementary standardized dress code pants or shorts at all times.
