Denis Morris

- The Special Education Department at Denis Morris is honoured to announce that one of our students will be presenting the Board wide message for Autism Awareness Month taking place in October. Our student is an inspirational young man with Autism who has transformed the quality of his life and his experience at Denis Morris though targeted supports, love, empathy and self-awareness.
- He is now able to transition to and from class independently. He has joined three cocurricular activities (Art Club, Anime and Best Buddies). He has completed a Co-operative Education placement at Sobeys and is now working with Jobs Niagara to find a part-time job. He responds to his sensory needs through on-going communication with his support network at school and at home and he self-regulates using his 5-point frustration scale. He advocates for his needs and the needs of others and was instrumental in transitioning a group of Grade 8 students with sensory needs to Denis Morris. He discussed with them the need to have a "safe-zone", a "go-to person" and to communicate their needs to others to find strategies and supports. He has volunteered to lead an awareness initiative at Denis Morris during the month of October to raise awareness and inspire others with exceptionalities with his message of hope.

Holy Cross

• Busy and buzzing is how we can describe the Special Education class at Holy Cross Catholic Secondary School. We are still getting to know our new students and they are starting to know the routines better than we do. Our active listening "chatting chair" has allowed us to learn more about each other and we enjoy having guests come and sit in the chair to help us learn more about each other. Holy Cross has two students at Walmart working in the cosmetic department and one student working in our cafeteria with Chartwells as he prepares for a future co-op job placement out of the school. STUDENT VOICE CONFERENCE 2014 – LEADING OUT LOUD !

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On Wednesday, November 12th, 2014 approximately 150 Niagara Catholic students gathered at Mount Carmel Spiritual Centre in Niagara Falls to participate in the Board's annual Student Conference entitled - Lead Out Loud! This annual conference is in alignment with the 2014-2015 System Priority to "*Engage Student Voice*".

The Niagara Catholic Student Voice Conference 2014 brought together student leaders from all elementary and secondary schools in our Board. Through the student leadership of our Secondary Student Senate, strong leadership skills were demonstrated as they led and engaged the conference participants to the understanding that each of us has 'more than a single story' to define who we are. It is in listening to and sharing the stories of ourselves and our peers, that we *Witness* Christ in each other.

Following opening comments by our Director of Education, the conference began with the video message, '*The Danger of a Single Story*' by Chimamanda Adichie. Chimamanda explained that her "American roommate had a single story of Africa: a single story of catastrophe. The single story created stereotypes - they make one story become the only story and ultimately rob people of their dignity making our equal humanity difficult."

Following her inspirational message, students engaged in discussion and distilled a message for the day which they shared on a large graffiti wall. The large group then splintered into eight groups and began workshop rotations where they heard stories from other young people; stories of disaster in Haiti, struggles with mental health, autism and cerebral palsy. Additional workshops also provided students with an opportunity to share their own story through poetry and learn active listening skills.

For the 2014 Student Voice Conference, a deliberate attempt was made to present learning using many modalities recognizing that each of us is created in God's image and has a unique learning style. Workshop opportunities included active and interactive learning. Through live and online stories students shared the personal experiences that made them who they are. The multi-modalities also provided students with examples of how they could gather and share their stories of their school communities.

At the conclusion of each workshop, student Senators used guiding questions to extract the message. Students continued to share their learning on a graffiti wall. As the day progressed, the learning journey was recorded for all and it was apparent that all student participants had *Witnessed* Christ in themselves and each other.

The culmination of the day was a discussion as to how our Niagara Catholic student leaders would gather and celebrate the stories of their own school communities and *Witness* our faith to the world.

As part of this Board report, our Student Trustees and Co-Chairs of the Student Senate will share a visual presentation to capturing the images of Lead Out Loud 2014 Student Voice Conference.

2ND ANNUAL NIAGARA CATHOLIC CULTURE OF LIFE CONFERENCE 2014

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Church has used terminology to reflect the philosophy of Culture of Life since its earliest days. The Didache, a first century document included in the Magisterium of the Church, refers to the "way of life" and the "way of death." Pope John Paul II in Evangelium Vitae (Gospel of Life) stated "In our present social context, marked by a dramatic struggle between the culture of life and the culture of death, there is the need to develop a deep critical sense capable of discerning true values and authentic needs."

In more recent years the term has been used extensively, often in political arenas, to defend or fight specific life issues such as abortion, euthanasia and stem cell research, with these battles often placing these concerns in very narrow silos.

When we return to the root of this concept, however, we can see that this philosophy is actually much broader, that all the elements of Catholic Social Teaching build the Culture of Life and should be a way of life that weaves through our entire day, a perspective that helps us fight against abortion but also helps us choose to be kind, fight bullying, and preserve the dignity of every human person. Giving students an opportunity to gather and learn in greater depth about the culture of life can provide much needed articulation around this important subject, and strengthen the student voice as we witness to our faith.

2nd Annual Culture of Life Conference 2014

On Thursday, November 13^{th} , 2014, Niagara Catholic hosted its 2^{nd} Annual Culture of Life Conference at Mount Carmel Spiritual Centre in Niagara Falls. Approximately 160 students from all eight of our Catholic secondary schools gathered for the day to learn some essentials in apologetics, and to hone their skills in verbally defending the dignity of all human life.

Our keynote this year was Christina Alaimo, a University of Toronto Masters student in Health Care Ethics who has been passionate about the pro-life cause from an early age. As a former intern at Campaign Life Coalition, she has learned the ins and outs of all areas of the pro-life movement. She has supported women through the decision process as well as caring for those who decided to keep their babies at the last minute. Her skill in providing logical and scientific basis for the defense of all human life was evident as students engaged in conversations and role play to strengthen their own skills.

Mass was celebrated in the beautiful Mount Carmel Chapel, with Fr. Michael Wastag, O Carm. presiding.

In keeping with Niagara Catholic District School Board's Vision 2020 Strategic Plan and the Strategic Direction to *Build Strong Catholic Identity and Community to Nurture the Distinctiveness of Catholic Education*, feedback from both staff and students indicate that the Culture of Life Conference 2014 was a meaningful experience that provided much understanding and many tools to do just that.

Please place this memo on the agenda of a meeting of your board for consideration and decision. <u>A response is required by January 16, 2015</u>

Under the new Amended and Restated OCSTA By-Law Number 2014-01, the Selection Process for Regional Directors has changed considerably from past practice.

The following section no longer exists under the new By-Law.

Additional Qualifications for Candidacy

Where a Region consists of more than one (1) Member Board, a Trustee Member is not eligible to be a candidate for nor hold the office of Regional Director if:

- another Trustee Member of the same Member Board is a candidate for or holds the office of Regional Director; or
- the President, Vice President or Past President is a Trustee Member of the same Member Board;

The related section in the Amended & Restated By-Law Number 2014-01 states:

7.4 Selection Process for Regional Directors

No particular manner or method is prescribed for how each Region selects its Regional Director. The CDSBs comprising each Region, therefore, shall devise and adopt a fair, equitable and democratic process by which their Regional Director is selected, in accordance with Board guidelines, provided however, that:

- 7.4.1 Regional Directors from CDSB's described in Section 6.1.1 shall be selected in odd numbered years, and Regional Directors described in Sections 6.1.2 and 6.1.3 shall be selected in even numbered years; and
- 7.4.2 the selection process once adopted may not be altered more frequently than every second year, and in any event not later than one hundred and eighty (180) days prior to the second Annual Meeting following the previous use of the process.

Catholic District School Boards comprising each Region may choose to:

- devise and adopt a process by which the regional director(s) are selected (as outlined in s.7.4) or
- conduct elections as per past practice with a call for nominations by the Association and elections by ballot held, if required, at the Annual General Meeting.

Regions are not all required to follow the same process for the Selection of Regional Directors.

- Each region is required to submit their decision regarding the Selection Process for Regional Director to OCSTA by January 16, 2015
- For regions choosing to conduct elections as per past practice, OCSTA will distribute nomination forms with a submission deadline of <u>April 2, 2015</u>.
- Regions choosing other methods will facilitate and conduct a fair and equitable selection process and submit their selection to OCSTA by <u>April 2, 2015</u>.

The following section of the OCSTA By-law applies if any region is unable to agree on a process.

7.5 Failure to Agree Upon Regional Director Selection Process

In the event that the CDSBs comprising a Region are unable to reach a consensus as to the process to be adopted for that Region for the selection of its Regional Director, any CDSB within that Region may refer the selection process to the Board; and upon referral:

7.5.1 the OCSTA Board shall give notice to the other CDSBs within that Region, requesting each to make representations to the Board within thirty (30) days after the notice, as to the selection process to be adopted;

7.5.2 within a further thirty (30) days, the Board shall consider all representations received from the CDSBs within that Region, and determine the process by which such Regional Director is selected;

7.5.3 such determination by the Board shall be final and binding for such Region and from which there is no right of appeal, but without prejudice to the right to adopt a new selection process subject to the limitations described in clause 7.4.2.

We encourage you to discuss this at a meeting of your board and to initiate communications with other boards in your region about the selection process for OCSTA Regional Directors.

Writing this letter is important to me and it took much thought and courage on my part and coming to face all of you after the election was difficult. But then I was quickly reminded of why I became a Trustee: to help kids that struggle and to be a voice where there may not be one—these reasons, along with the fact that I am a huge advocate for Catholic Education, which I will continue to fight for in my own way.

And so I am completing my term and wish to finish what I started by setting an example for any student that has not succeeded in what they originally set out to do. I share similar feelings to the student who has had to overcome meanness and bullying and left feeling horrible—as if they failed.

During my four-year term as a Trustee I discovered friendships in people with great dedication and a fervent and authentic Catholic faith. Unfortunately, this is not a fairy tale story and it has not always been easy. I was threatened and bullied by some of my peers and I found myself on the receiving-end of many emotional parents. This is the reality that some of our students face and I am truly sorry this happens. Although I am not a student any longer *per se*, I am still disappointed and sad at the malicious behavior exhibited by a few, but I trust, as I end my term, that things can get better.

Catholic Education and its tremendous supporters make it better. Over the last four years, I relied on family and friends of course, but John Crocco and his team are the best we have. They are smart, immensely competent and better yet they exhibit a certain kindness and good nature that any leader within Catholic Education should have. I want to thank my peers Kathy, Moe, Ted, Ed for being there for me. They always took the higher road and should be very proud of that.
