
First Day of School Arrival and Departure

We cannot wait to see all of our students on the first day of school! As we know our parking lot is not easy to maneuver on a regular day, and the first day of school adds a little extra challenge. Adding on a larger school population makes the first-day drop-off even more difficult. BUT, we can do this!

Please see the chart below showing where the classroom teachers will be standing (with sign in hand) to welcome their new class. We ask parents to please stay on the sidewalk and to have only staff



and students on school property. This reduces the volume on school property and helps staff with locating students more easily. For the first few days, the location they meet in the morning will be the location they will be at the end of the day. Once students are comfortable with the location of their classroom, we will resume free entry in the morning.




Dedicated Kiss and Ride Area

The kiss and ride area is for families to drive to a dedicated area in the parking lot and drop their child off who will be directed by school staff to the front of the school. The kiss and ride area allows for the driver to stay in the car, while a staff member assists their child. This is an efficient way for families to drop off their child(ren) at school. For families who prefer to park and walk their child(ren) to the front of the school, there will be a parking area dedicated for you to park. For this to run smoothly and efficiently, we ask parents to *please park in the family parking zones only* (*white lines*).

Parking in no-parking zones creates congestion and increases the risk of a child being hurt.

Please see the diagram below outlining the dedicated areas for Kiss and Ride as well as parent parking. We will have extra staff outside during the morning to assist in this process. **We ask** families to please be patient and <u>SLOW DOWN</u> in the parking lot.






Student Cell Phone use - PLEASE READ

As we continue to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all students, I would like to remind you of the new regulations regarding cell phone use that have been implemented in all Ontario schools.

To minimize distractions and maximize learning, cell phones are only permitted during instructional time when they are being used for educational purposes as directed by the teacher. Outside of these times, students are expected to keep their phones turned off and stored away unless needed for documented learning needs and/or health related requirements. We kindly ask for your support in reinforcing this policy with your children and encouraging them to focus on their studies during school hours.

Hot Lunches



ORANGE SHIRT DAY

September 30th has been declared Orange Shirt Day throughout Canada in recognition of the harm done to generations of children by the Indian Residential Schools. As an affirmation of Niagara Catholic's commitment to ensure that every child matters as we continue on our reconciliation journey, the Niagara Catholic District School Board is acknowledging Orange Shirt Day on Friday, September 30th. The origin of Orange Shirt Day is based on a story shared by a survivor of the Residential School system, Phyllis Webstad, during the Truth and Reconciliation meetings held in Williams Lake, BC in 2013. In response, staff, students and community members of St. Mark



Catholic School are encouraged to wear the colour orange on Monday, September 30th as a visible symbol in support of the notion that every child matters and that we are called to love, respect, and care for one another as children of God.

Orange shirts will be available for student purchase through Pegasus School Images - more information will be provided at a later date.

Celebrating Culture Day

Each month we will be participating in dress-down days. For September, we will be celebrating the many cultural backgrounds in our community by having our first annual Celebrating Culture day. During the month of September, we work hard at getting to know our students and their cultures.

What better way to know our families than to have a day dedicated to culture? On Thursday, 19th, students are encouraged to wear or bring in clothing that represents their cultural background. This can be from colours to traditional clothing. The choice is yours to share a part of your culture with our community.

SUPPORTING CHILDREN AND STUDENTS WITH PREVALENT MEDICAL CONDITIONS POLICY

At the beginning of every school year, we remind all students and parents/guardians of our Board's Policy on supporting students with prevalent medical conditions. At St. Mark Catholic Elementary School we have Emergency Guidelines which clearly state what medical procedures must occur for those students who have various life-threatening medical conditions. We are reminding all students and parents/guardians that we have students in our



school who are known to have a potentially life-threatening allergy called Anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis is a severe life-threatening form of allergic reaction. It may begin with severe itching of the eyes or face; a sense of constriction in the throat, then other symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhea, and difficulty with breathing may develop. This may lead to coma and death. Foods such as peanuts, other nuts, fish, shellfish, eggs, milk, sesame, and wheat as well as insect stings from bees and wasps, latex products, and medication, are the most common allergens that produce anaphylaxis. Anaphylaxis requires immediate first aid response and immediate medical intervention. If your child requires a special plan to ensure their safety, please alert your child's teacher so we can ensure that we are doing all we can to keep your child, and all children, safe.

Safe Arrival for Absences

The Safe Arrival program reduces the time it takes to verify student attendance making it easier for you to report your child's absence and easier for staff to respond to unexplained student absences. The Safe Arrival program allows parents to report their child's absence quickly and conveniently in one of three ways: 1) Use the SafeArrival website, <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account using



your email address. After logging in, select the Attendance tab to Report an Absence. 2) Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app (blue logo) from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). You must register through the website on a computer before you can access the app. Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to Report an Absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications on your mobile device please enable Push Notifications in the Settings area of the app. The document Using the SchoolMessenger app will give instructions for using the App. 3) The toll-free number 844-287-6287 will allow you to report your child absent without creating an account

Dress Code

We ask that all students follow the Dress Code policy that has been in effect since November of 2012 at all elementary schools across Niagara Catholic.

Our dress code consists of **SOLID navy-blue pants, and either a solid white or navy top with a collar.** Spirit Wear can be worn at any time, if it has been purchased through Big Bear Spiritwear or previously from Front Row Sports.

White T-shirts are NOT dress code.


Hoodies/ Sweaters can only be worn if they are navy blue, or spiritwear.
