NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH & RECONCILIATION (ORANGE SHIRT DAY)

Orange Shirt Day is the story of Phyllis Webstad, an Indigenous woman who shared her experience at an Indian Residential School through the children's book, *The Orange Shirt Story*. By participating in Orange Shirt Day, we recognize the harm done to generations of children by the Indian Residential School system in Canada. The first Orange Shirt Day occurred on September 30th, 2013 as Chief Fred Robbins saw Phyllis' story as a way of bringing together Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. Since that time, Orange Shirt Day has grown into a national awareness among schools, businesses, and communities.

In June 2021, the Federal Government of Canada designated **September 30th** as the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation. While this addresses Call to Action #80 of the Truth and Reconciliations *94 Calls to Action*, it coincides with an established day that was created by Survivors of Indian Residential Schools. As a Board we can acknowledge the Federal statutory day, but for school and student activities, for the present time, it remains "Orange Shirt Day" as a way of respecting the grass root Indigenous movement.

BUS TRANSPORTATION - NSTS

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES & SAFE ARRIVAL

It is an expectation that parents/guardians use the Niagara Catholic Safe Arrival system to

report their child's late arrival or absence for part or all of the school day.

UNREPORTED LATES/ABSENCES

If a student's late arrival or absence is unverified, parents/ guardians will receive an automated communication by phone (home and mobile numbers), and/or text message/e-mail as provided and established in the Parent Portal, seeking verification of the late arrival or absence. Parents/guardians may then indicate the reason for the late arrival or absence through the automated system call-out. If the system does not receive a response from parents/guardians, the school secretary will contact as listed in the student information system the parents/guardians and/or emergency contact(s) to verify a student's absence.

The Tuck Shop is our in-school treat shop that is an initiative of our school Student

Senators and Student Council. Items such as ice cream and popcorn are ordered in advance on SchoolCash Online and are delivered in a safe manner to the students classroom every Friday. When there is a holiday, the Tuck Shop item will be delivered on the Thursday of that week. This year the Tuck Shop will start on **Friday, September 27th** and will run **every Friday** for the entire school year.

Our Milk program will start on **Monday, September 30th** and will run every **Monday, Wednesday, Friday** for the entire school year. If there is a holiday on the Monday or Friday, the milk will be delivered on the Tuesday or Thursday of that week. Parents/Guardians can pre-order milk (white or chocolate) for their child(ren) on a monthly basis using SchoolCash Online. *Please note there has been a slight increase due to the rising cost of dairy.



LUNCH DAYS

Our lunch days will run **every Wednesday**, and will start on **Wednesday**, **September 25th**. You will be able to pre-purchase the lunch using

TERRY FOX SCHOOL RUN/WALK



Terry Fox represented the best that Canadians have to offer. He was an example of courage, humility, determination, and per-

severance. From a young age he exemplified these attributes that made him an inspiration for not only Canada, but the entire world. Terry's personal experience and research led him to a simple conclusion – more money was needed for cancer research. And so, in the modest but motivated style that would prove to be his trademark, Terry started training and planning for his cross-Canada run to raise funds for cancer research. He dipped his artificial leg in the Atlantic Ocean on April 12th, 1980 and proceeded to unite Canadians in a way never before, nor since, seen. The only thing that could have stopped Terry from reaching the Pacific Ocean did. Cancer returned in his lungs and he was forced to stop on September 1st, 1980 after having run 5,373 kilometres.

This year, St. Elizabeth School will take part in our annual Terry Fox School Walk on **Friday, September 27th**. Cell Phone Policy

Niagara Catholic has a standardized dress code for students in all of our Catholic elementary schools. All students wear navy blue bottoms and navy blue or white shirts.

OUR DRESS CODE COLOURS

Tops

- At a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the following:
- Navy or white Oxford shirt (short or long sleeve) or;
- Navy or white collared shirt (short or long sleeve) or;
- School-designed spirit wear

The elementary standardized dress code shirt must be plain (no logos or advertising) and buttoned in a respectable manner. Visible tshirts worn under the elementary standardized dress code top must be either navy blue or white.



Bottoms

- At a minimum, every student is required to wear one of the following:
- Navy sweat pants (Kindergarten Grade 3) or;
- · Navy pants (capri, cargo, denim, kobe or corduroy) or,
- Navy skorts, skirts or dresses or;
- · Navy walking shorts.

Only knee-length shorts, skirts or dresses are permitted. All clothing must be in good repair. Grade 8 students have the option to wear grey secondary uniform pants.



Shoes

For health and safety reasons, running shoes with a full back and closed toe are the recommended footwear. Parents/guardians should provide a pair of indoor shoes for physical education and indoor wear. Socks must be worn with the elementary standardized dress code pants or shorts at all times.
