B. PRESENTATION

1. Experiential Learning-Technology, Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM), Cooperative Education and Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP)

Superintendent Forsyth-Sells welcomed and introduced Joseph Zaroda, Superintendent of Education and his team to the meeting of the Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee. Superintendent Zaroda, introduced his team: Erin Farkas, Coordinator-Experiential Learning (K-12); Technology; Specialist High Skills Major; Co-op and Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program, Pat Mete-Coordinator of Student Success, Tino Nuccitelli, Consultant-Specialist High Skills Major Certifications, Dual Credits and Experiential Learning and Dino Nardangeli, Experiential Learning (K-12); Technology, Co-op and Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program and thanked the members of the NCPIC for the opportunity to make a presentation. He provided a brief background on the importance of implementing pathway opportunities in alignment with the Niagara Catholic system priorities, and strategic directions to "Advance Student Achievement for All Students". Superintendent Zaroda, stated that these learning opportunities would not be implemented or successful without the support of dedicated teachers, the Director of Education and the Senior Administrative Team.

The team provided a presentation on the various programs offered to students in our Catholic secondary schools to support student achievement and well-being, as they explore a wide range of career options and work towards receiving an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Niagara Catholic offers 15 Specialist High Skills Major sectors, Technology and Skilled Trades programming, Dual Credit courses in partnership with Niagara College, as well as the Ontario

Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP), Cooperative Education and Experiential Learning. All programs offer students hands-on, real-world learning, and experiential learning beyond the classroom, while building on their global competencies.

Erin Farkas also reported that the Ontario government is implementing a new high school graduation requirement to help better prepare students across our province for the jobs of tomorrow. This mandatory high school graduation requirement will empower students with early exposure to technological education and skilled trades. Starting with students entering Grade 9 in September 2024, all students will now be required to earn a Grade 9 or 10 Technological Education credit as part of their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. A brief question and answer period followed the presentation.

F. REPORT FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNATE SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION

1. Niagara Catholic Equity Action Plan

Superintendent Forsyth-Sells reported the Niagara Catholic Equity Action Plan was presented at the Board Meeting of December 19, 2023 and was provided to all NCPIC members for information. Superintendent Forsyth-Sells reported that Niagara Catholic schools, foster, inclusive, equitable and safe school communities where all are welcomed and 'called by name', supporting all students. Niagara Catholic continues to implement equitable and inclusive educational practices to confront racism and discrimination that can negatively affect student learning, achievement, and well-being, to improve student outcomes for all students within a culture of respect, acceptance and a sense of belonging.

The Equity Action Plan 2023-2026, has been developed using a guideline from the Education Equity Secretariat of the Ministry of Education in the following areas:

- School and Classroom Practices
- Data Collection, Integration and Reporting
- Leadership, Governance, and Human Resources Services

Within these areas there are specific actions for implementation in Niagara Catholic schools to meet the needs of all students and staff. The Equity Action Plan was provided for information.

- 2. Proposed Presentation: Niagara Region Public Health Superintendent Forsyth-Sells proposed that Niagara Region Public Health is available to present at the March 7, 2024 NCPIC meeting. Three topics including brief descriptions were provided for consideration:
 - o Option 1-Adolescent Brain and Substance Use Prevention
 - o Option 2-Raising Competent, Confident Kids
 - o Option 3-Youth connectedness Helping Students Thrive

There was a discussion about hosting a parent engagement event to include all topics and a faith formation component for parent participation. Superintendent Forsyth-Sells will follow-up with Public Health and further discussion will take place at the subcommittee meeting.

 Ontario Association of Parents in Catholic Education (OAPCE) Superintendent Forsyth-Sells reported that no applications were received for the position of the Niagara Catholic OAPCE Regional Director.

Superintendent Forsyth-Sells shared that OAPCE will be celebrating 85 years of operation in 2024. The OAPCE Conference will take place on Friday, April 12 and Saturday, April 13, 2024 in Toronto. The theme for the celebration is: "A Celebration of Change, Commitment and Catholic Education" and His Grace Archbishop Francis Leo will preside over the Mass. Further details are to follow.

Superintendent Forsyth-Sells stated at in accordance with the Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee Policy and AOP (800.7), members of the Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee will be reimbursed for pre-approved expenses for conferences attended on behalf of the NCPIC, including accommodation, mileage, parking and meals through the Director's designate/Superintendent of Education.

- Catholic School Council Funding Application Superintendent Forsyth-Sells reported that currently 8 elementary and 2 secondary Catholic School Councils have submitted an application for funding to support parent engagement in their school communities.

- Fr. Paul MacNeil is currently working on a diocesan wide document on sacramental preparation and relationships between the school and the church.
