- Personal Mobile Device: Download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store, the Google Play Store, or from the links at <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>. Use your new login information to access your account. Select Attendance to report an absence. If you would like to receive attendance notifications directly to your mobile device, please enable Push Notifications in the Settings section of the app. The document titled, <u>SchoolMessenger App</u> Parent & Student User Guide provides instructions for using the app.
- 3. **Standard Telephone**: The toll-free number **1-844-287-6287** will allow you to report your child absent without creating an account.

STUDENT ABSENCES & LATE ARRIVALS

It is essential that all student absences and late arrivals are called into the <u>Safe Arrival Program</u> by <u>8:30 am</u> via phone (1-844-287-6287), website or app. These are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You are also able to input future absences in advance if you are aware of an upcoming appointment or vacation. Board and Ministry policy dictates that we must investigate any unreported absences. This can involve calls to places of employment, the emergency numbers provided to the school and, in some cases, the police.

HAVE YOU MOVED OR ARE YOU MOVING?

To any families who have recently moved or will be moving in the near future, please confirm that St. John is your home school at <u>portal.nsts.ca/eligibility</u>. In keeping with Niagara Catholic's home school focus, we encourage all families to ensure that children are enrolled in their home school. This will allow students to establish and maintain meaningful relationships with other students who live in the heart of their community.

NIAGARA STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES (NSTS)

We invite all families who have children riding the bus to visit the Niagara Student Transportation Services (NSTS) website for the most recent updates on bussing. Parents are encouraged to log into the parent portal for specific information pertaining to run times and bus stop locations for their child(ren). Please be advised that NSTS has indicated that at times, school bus delays are possible and do happen, especially as routines are in the process of being established and when weather presents challenges. To receive notifications regarding delay alerts, families are invited to download the BusPlanner Delay app or subscribe for email alerts in the parent portal. Parents not wishing to receive notifications would be required to simply check in by visiting the 'Alert' section of the NSTS website. NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH & RECONCILIATION EVERY CHILD MATTERS

The date **September 30** has been declared the **National Day for Truth & Reconciliation (Orange Shirt Day)** throughout Canada in recognition of the harm done to generations of children by the Indian Residential Schools, and as an affirmation of Niagara Catholic's commitment to ensure that *every child matters* as we continue on our reconciliation journey.

The origin of Orange Shirt Day is based on a story shared by a survivor of the residential school system, Phyllis Webstad, during the Truth and Reconciliation meetings held in Williams Lake, BC in 2013. In response, schools celebrate Orange Shirt Day as affirmation that the sense of worth of every child does matter and the colour orange is the visible symbol of that support.

On **September 30** all members of the St. John Catholic School Community were invited to wear an orange shirt or clothing item in support of Orange Shirt Day. We thank everyone for their participation in this very significant day as we continue on our journey toward truth and reconciliation.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

STUDENTS DEMONSTRATING SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS

If a student becomes sick while at school, the identified emergency contact(s) on file will be called for immediate pick up. Parents and guardians of ill children are encouraged to contact Niagara Public Health and follow their advice. *Anyone who is sick should stay at home until their symptoms have resolved for 24 hours (48 hours for gastrointestinal symptoms)*. We thank everyone for their ongoing cooperation regarding this very important health and safety matter.

NUT ANAPHYLAXIS

The entire school community is working hard to prevent accidental exposure to products that trigger lifethreatening reactions. As a result, we continue to maintain a **PEANUT & NUT SAFE environment**. We would appreciate your cooperation in helping us keep St. John Catholic School safe, by making sure your children do not bring foods to school that may contain any traces of **peanuts** or **nuts**.



MILK ANAPHYLAXIS

Due to a number of students in our care who have a severe anaphylactic allergy to milk, it is asked that parents kindly refrain from sending milk to school with their child out of an abundance of care and consideration for the health and safety of these individuals. Thank you to everyone for their understanding of this very important health and safety matter.

RYAN'S LAW:

ENSURING ASTHMA FRIENDLY SCHOOLS

Ryan's Law (Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools) is an important step to support the health and well-being of students diagnosed with asthma in Ontario schools. During this school year, the Niagara Catholic District School Board has created an Asthma Policy. If your son/ daughter has been diagnosed with asthma, please contact the office at your school to provide information about your son/daughter's asthma medication. You will be required to complete and submit the Niagara Catholic Student Asthma Management Plan for your student. Any student under the age of 16 years will be permitted to carry and administer his/her asthma medication at school with your consent. A student 16 years or older is not required to have his or her parent's or guardian's permission to carry his or her asthma medication. The Ministry of Education website has resources on asthma, as well as other prevalent medical conditions. Families are encouraged to take time to read the content shared on the site. REMINDERS FOR ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Kiss n' Ride Drop-Off: In an effort to keep our students and staff members safe, families are reminded that when using the Kiss n' Ride drop-off, *drivers are asked to please remain in their vehicle* and have child(ren) exit the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk when it is safe to do so. Supervising staff will be present in the parking lot at 9:10 am. Parents are kindly asked to please drop their child(ren) off *between 9:10 and 9:20 am*. We thank you for your support as we strive to welcome our students onto school property in an efficient, yet safe manner.

Kiss n' Ride Pick-Up:

To reduce congestion in the Kiss n' Ride line and along King Street, Kiss n' Ride students will be dismissed from their classrooms at <u>3:20 pm</u>. Parents are asked to please be at the school in a timely manner so students can be dismissed efficiently and without causing disruption to the flow of traffic on King Street.

Park & Pick-Up/Drop-Off:

Families of children in car seats who need to park their vehicles and walk their children to the school sidewalk are asked to please be mindful of oncoming traffic, which includes busses and Kiss n' Ride vehicles. For their own safety, families are reminded of the importance of utilizing designated walkways to access the sidewalks. To avoid congestion in the parking lot and to prevent a back-up of vehicles onto King Street, Park & Pick-Up students will be dismissed from their classes at <u>3:20 pm</u>.

ELEMENTARY STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE SHIRTS:

- Navy blue or white oxford-style long-sleeved or shortsleeved shirt.
- Navy blue or white polo-style long-sleeved or shortsleeved shirt.
- School-designed spirit wear including shirts, sweaters or hoodies.
- All sweaters must by navy blue or white.

PANTS / SKIRTS:

- Navy blue sweat-pants for students in ELKP to Grade 3.
- Navy blue pants Dress, Cargo, Denim, Kobe, Corduroy style.
- Navy blue skorts or dresses length must be appropriate and modest.
- Navy blue walking shorts or capris or Grade 8 students have the option of wearing grey secondary uniform pants.

SHOES:

- We ask that parents/guardians please ensure that students come to school each day wearing appropriate and comfortable closed-toe footwear (i.e. running shoes with proper ankle support).
- Parents are asked to please send their child(ren) to school with a pair of indoor shoes and outdoor shoes. This will allow for cleanliness in our building and for caretaking staff to focus on sanitization of surfaces and touchpoints. Thank you to everyone for their cooperation with this very important health and safety matter.

PERSONAL INFORMATION The Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy

Act (MFIPPA) requires school boards to obtain parent/guardian consent to release students' personal information to school volunteers, parishes, and the Niagara Region Public Health Unit. The Act also requires school boards to obtain consent to the disclosure of personal information, such as creative and academic accomplishments, images/videos/audio recordings, and/or accomplishments to be shared on school or Board websites, social media, or with the media. The updated form also addresses virtual learning in the 21st century.

Parents/guardians are asked to complete the most current **Parent Consent - Student Personal Information** through **'SchoolCash' Online**.


THANKSGIVING - MONDAY, OCTOBER 9

NIAGARA CATHOLIC RESPECTFUL INTERACTION FRAMEWORK

Aggressive or hostile behaviour or language toward, staff, students, or our community helpers will not be tolerated. While we welcome feedback, concerns, and opinions it is the expectation that all staff, students, parents, guardians and community helpers communicate their needs and concerns with one another in a respectful and peaceful manner whether through email, on the phone or face-toface. Adherence to this expectation is vital in order to create a cohesive and cooperative community that helps one another achieve success.

SPECIAL EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SEAC)

The Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) of the Niagara Catholic District School Board is made up of Association representatives and Trustees whose role is to support students with diverse needs and their families. The Committee makes recommendations to the Board with regards to matters relating to educational programs and services to be implemented in schools for our students who meet this criteria. All parents are welcome to attend the monthly meetings and learn about different programs and supports that are available in special education.

Meetings are held at the Catholic Education Centre, 427 Rice Road, Welland, at 7:00 p.m. on the first Wednesday of the month. HALLOWEEN

St. John students will participate in Halloween activities in their respective classrooms, as well as a **Dance-a-Thon** on **October 31**. Due to a number of students in our care who are anaphylactic to nuts, peanuts, and other sources of nuts, **only prepackaged snacks that are clearly labelled as 'nut-free' may be brought in to be shared among students**. Please be advised that nutritional foods are encouraged. Further details will be communicated to families as the date approaches.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Some pointers to keep the trick or treaters safe, should parents decide to send their children out on Halloween night:

- Children under nine years of age should go out with an adult or responsible older child.
- Be sure your child stops at all curbs, looks left, right and left again for traffic. Remind children to cross at crosswalks, street corners or intersections.
- Bright coloured costumes will make your child more visible. Face paint instead of masks that cover the eyes helps them to see better. Have your child carry a flashlight.
- When children get home, be sure to check all treats carefully, and throw away any treats that aren't wrapped.
