# SCHOOL LOCKDOWN PRACTICE


The simulated lockdown on **Tuesday September 10**<sup>th</sup> **2024** allowed students and staff an opportunity to implement our School and Board Emergency Response Plan to ensure the safety of all students and staff should an emergency lockdown situation occur. # **ELEMENTARY STANDARDIZED DRESS CODE**

As you are aware, Niagara Catholic has adopted an Elementary Dress Code for students. Details regarding the Dress Code can be found on the Board's website or your child's agenda. Highlights include the following:

At a minimum, every student is required to wear one (1) of the following items:

- Navy Blue sweat pants for students in Early Learning Kindergarten to Grade 3 or;
- Navy Blue Pants (Dress, Cargo, Denim, Kobe, Corduroy style permitted) or;
- Navy Blue Skorts or Dresses or
- · Navy Blue Walking Shorts or Capris or;
- Grade 8 students have the option to wear grey secondary uniform pants. At a minimum, every student is required to wear one (1) of the following items;
- Navy Blue or White Oxford shirt (short or long sleeve) or;

- Navy Blue or White Polo shirt (short or long sleeve) or;
- School designed spirit wear polo shirt/t-shirt or hoodie

Running shoes are the recommended footwear and socks must be worn. Please remember that shirts are to be logo free.

### **MEDICATIONS**

The following procedures must be followed when a parent requests that a student be permitted to take medication at school:



- 1. No medication can be administered to students without the consent of a physician. This includes over-the-counter drugs as well as prescription medications.
- 2. All medications for students must be kept in the school's main office and will be administered there, unless the student wears medication on their person or specified to be kept in teacher's desk by parent/physician.
- 3. A Physician's Recommendation for Medication Form must be completed by the physician, detailing the method, amount and time schedule for taking the medication, and signed by the student's parents/guardians. New forms must be completed each school year.
- 4. Medication must be delivered to the school in the container dispensed by the pharmacy and the information on the label must coincide with the physician's order.
- 5. Persons administering the medication must record the date, time, and dosage on the student's medication record.
- 6. Students **MAY NOT CARRY ANY** medication at school, in their backpack, or in their lunch box. All medication must be kept in the Office. This includes inhalers, Aspirin, Tylenol, Advil, decongestants, antibiotics, etc.
- 7. Please inform us IMMEDIATELY if your child has a serious allergy or an anaphylactic condition. It is beneficial for the school to have 2 Epipens if possible (one for the classroom and one for the office).
