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
Classroom Spotlight Grade One

September has been an exciting month for all of our Grade 1 students as they begin their new adventure in school! This year is all about learning new things, following rules, building routines, and making new friends.

In Grade 1, students are learning something new every day. From reading books and writing their first stories to solving math patterning problems and discovering science, there's so much to explore. They're also learning to work with their classmates and how to be independent learners.

All classrooms at St. Theresa are <u>peanut</u>, <u>tree</u>
<u>nut and milk safe classrooms</u>. No peanuts, peanut products, or tree nuts are allowed at any time. We have many students with life threatening allergies to peanuts, tree nuts and peanut products. Please do not send in any food items for class distribution.

We also have a student with **dairy allergies**. We must ensure that we handle all dairy food items carefully.

Students who share the classroom with our student with a dairy allergy have been informed and know that they are to wash their hands after lunches and snacks that contain dairy items. Please ensure that your child has thoroughly washed their hands after eating peanuts, peanut products or dairy products for breakfast/lunch at home. We must make every effort to ensure we do not contaminate our learning environment for these students. Please respect the safety of all students.

Remember how you would want your child protected by their school community if your child had a fatal allergy.

Emergency Practices

Throughout September and October your child(ren) will be participating in three fire-drills and one lock-down drill. Students will be taught their exit routes prior to the fire-drills. The lock down drill will occur on **Oct. 17th**. There will be notice to all parents/guardians prior to the lock-down drill. It is wise for families to talk about the drills and why we must practice at school and at home. Thank you for your support.

Medication

For safety reasons, no child is to bring any form of medication to school. If medication is necessary, there is a form that must be filled out by your doctor to indicate dosage, instructions, etc., and the prescription container clearly labeled with names (child, parent, doctor), phone numbers and must be left at the office. Please contact the school to address individual student needs in this regard.

St. Theresa Spirit Wear

We will be offering St. Theresa Spirit wear for all students this year, including GRAD hoodies for our grade 8 students. Orders will be done directly through Exclusive Imprint. You can order spirit wear at anytime and it will be delivered to the school.

Catholic School Council

Our first Catholic School Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 1st at 6:00 p.m. We are excited to continue the great work that we have been doing over the last few years. We welcome back our previous members and are so excited to see new parents join us. Our meetings are approximately every 6 to 8 weeks, usually run about 90 minutes. Come out, share your ideas and meet fellow parents. Our second meeting is scheduled for November 26th, at 6:00 p.m.

Intermediate Homework Club

We have been approved for a funding grant set aside for students in grades 7 to 12, for homework help and extra reinforcement of skills. The club will run weekly on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 2:50 to 4:15 p.m. in the grade 7 and 8. Ms. DeLuca, Mrs. Rogers and Mr. Trainor will be the staff moderators of the club. As part of the learning students will have access to technology and also use various literacy and numeracy games to reinforce their skills. A letter will be sent home to all intermediate students to confirm participation in our homework club. Homework club will begin on Tuesday, October 8th, 2024 and run until Thursday May 29th, 2025

Cell Phone use for Students

The Ministry of Education has directed schools and school boards to not allow elementary students to have cell phones on them during the school day. To fairly manage this mandate along with parenting decisions made for each of our students; we thank you for respecting the following

compromise. If you are providing your child(ren) with a cell phone as part of their communication and safety tools as they transit from home to school and back, be advised that all cellphones will be placed in the classroom "cell garage" or in each student's backpack for the instructional day. If you are texting your child during the day — please expect them to only get the message at dismissal time (2:50). All communication must go through the main office. If students are using their cells as a personal device for research, teachers will direct them to access their cell phones. If students are required to bring a device for a specific purpose, the teacher will send a message in their digital platforms, such as the "NCVLE-classroom, School Messenger" so parents are aware of the request. Thank you for your support.

Book/Math Buddies

Every Day 5 from 1:50 to 2:30 pm, our students will be engaging in peer learning by having time with their Book/Math Buddies. Students will be practising and modelling reading and decoding strategies, sharing comprehension of texts and playing many math games to build stronger additive reasoning and multiplicative thinking. Our younger students have been paired with older classes for this productive learning time. Watch for posts showcasing this learning time on our Instagram account.

Professional Development Day

Our next PD day is **Friday, October 11th, 2024.** Teaching staff will be participating in our Faith Formation Day. Students will not have school on this day. Students are able to enjoy an extra long weekend.

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Hallowe'en

St. Theresa Catholic students will participate in Hallowe'en activities on Tuesday, October 31st. Students may choose to



wear a costume that allows them to sit in their desk and complete school work. Students will wear costumes all day. Students are also invited to wear black and orange clothing and accessories. Black and orange clothing allows our children to enjoy the Hallowe'en activities in comfortable clothes. Black and orange are typically clothing items that children have and therefore our Hallowe'en activities are hopefully not placing an additional expense on our parent community. Students are to wear their costumes or black and orange clothes for the whole school day. Hallowe'en activities will occur in the afternoon in each classroom.

For safety reasons, students are not to wear full head costumes, facial masks or paint their full faces. We need to be able to see their faces in the event that a child develops an allergy to foods or environmental factors. Thank you for respecting this safety rule and for making any alterations to your child(ren)'s full costume.

Candy and Snacks shared from our homes will be allowed but they will be sent home with each child so parents can decide what treats are to be eaten. Teachers will allow the children to have one to two treats during the day. We must follow the board nutrition policy on these days. We understand our families wanting to share treats for our children, we ask that if you send items that they be things that can be easily sent home with your children's classmates.

School Picture Day

Individual school pictures will be taken on Wednesday, October 23rd, 2024.

The retake date has not been set as of yet. Students are to be in full dress code on picture day. We will use the composite layout for the class photo so we do not miss



any students who are unable to be here on the first picture day. Grade Eight

"Children Helping Children"


