
To date, we have received numerous donations. We are incredibly grateful for the support from our Mary Ward community! Your

Niagara Region Public Health Dental Program

Niagara Region Public Health Dental Program will be offering <u>dental screening</u> to grades JK, SK, 2, 4 and 7 on November 20th & 21st, 2024.

A registered dental hygienist will take a quick look in the child's mouth using a sterilized dental mirror and light. <u>The Healthy Smiles Ontario</u> program may financially assist children who do not have access to dental care.

If you do not want your child(ren) to take part in the dental screening, you MUST complete the online <u>School Dental Screening Opt-Out Form</u> or call the Dental Health Line at 905-688-8248 or 1-888-505-6074 ext. 7399 each school year.

If your child(ren) is not in one of the grades listed above, they may have the opportunity to participate in the dental screening. If you would like your child to be screened, please complete the <u>School Dental Opt-In Form</u>

Grade 7 Immunization Campaign

Niagara Region Public Health's school-based vaccination clinics will begin in September for the following publicly funded <u>routine</u> <u>school vaccinations</u>:



- Meningococcal
- Single dose
- <u>Required for school attendance</u> under the Immunization of School Pupils Act
- Hepatitis B (HB)
- 2 or 3 dose series depending on age and health history
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV)

• 2 or 3 dose series - depending on age and health history

Parents/legal guardians of grade 7 students will receive an information package and instructions on how to submit their completed consent form. Parents/legal guardians must complete the consent form whether their child is receiving **all**, **some**, or **none** of the vaccines. More information will be provided through your child's school.

Kiss'n'Ride Dropoff Area

One of the challenges that we encounter here at Mary Ward is the congestion during drop off and pick up times. In order to ensure the safety of all members of our school community, we need to be reminded that patience will always be required.

A few reminders....

1. Parents who are entering the Kiss n' Ride area to drop off or pick-up their children should remain in their car at all times and be "engaged in the active operation of their motor vehicle" (taken from the Ontario Highway Traffic Act). When the traffic line wraps around onto Dorchester Road, please use the shoulder of the road and keep your car moving in line at all times.

2. Please enter the Kiss and Ride area by staying in the right-hand lane. Students should exit the vehicle as soon as they have access to the designated walking lane. Have students exit the vehicle only on the right hand side. Once students are out of the vehicle, please proceed to the left lane to exit or be patient while other vehicles in front of you ensure the safety of all prior to departing the Kiss and Ride/parking lot.

3. NEW – For additional safety, all students entering via kiss and ride are now required to walk down the path towards the school yard. Entering the school will remain the same – Grades 4 thru 8 (front door) / Grades K thru 3 (Kinder Door).

4. If you are choosing to park in the parking lot adjacent to the Kiss and Ride, please accompany your child/children to the **(NEW) designated walking lane where you can accompany your children down the path towards the school yard and in their designated entry door**.

5. If you are parked in the parking lot, ensure that you are reversing and not driving through the designated walking lane.

6. To limit the number of vehicles in our lot, please see attached map of surrounding streets in regards to parking a safe distance from the school and walking within 5 minute distance. It clearly shows where vehicles can be parked safely and legally. To cross Dorchester Road, please cross at the crossing guard site. 7. It is vital that the staff parking lot entrance and path be clear as this is also the entrance for emergency vehicles if ever required to enter the school.
