HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Some pointers to keep the trick or treaters safe should parents decide to send their children out on Halloween night:

- · Children under nine years of age should go out with an adult or responsible older child.
- · Be sure your child stops at all curbs, looks left, right and left again for traffic. Remind children to cross at crosswalks, street corners or intersections.
- · Bright coloured costumes will make your child more visible. Face paint instead of masks helps them to see better. Have your child carry a flashlight.
- · When they get home, check all treats carefully. Throw out any treats that aren't wrapped.

Arrival of all Kindergarten students will take place in the Kindergarten gated area. Kindergarten students who are bussed will be met by staff and safely walked from the bus to their gated area upon arrival. The reversal will happen upon dismissal.

NCDSB Elementary Standardized Dress Code

Shirts

- · Navy blue or white oxford-style long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt.
- · Navy blue or white polo-style long-sleeved or short- sleeved shirt.
- · School-designed spirit wear including shirts, sweaters or hoodies.
- · All sweaters must be navy blue or white.

Pants / Skirts

- · Navy blue sweat-pants for students in Kindergarten to Grade 3.
- · Navy blue pants Dress, Cargo, Denim, Kobe, Corduroy style.
- · Navy blue skorts or dresses length must be appropriate and modest.
- · Navy blue walking shorts or capris or Grade 8 students have the option of wearing grey secondary uniform pants.

Shoes

We ask that parents/guardians please ensure that students come to school each day wearing appropriate and comfortable closed-toe footwear (i.e. running shoes with proper ankle support) that they can remain in throughout the duration of the school day. If they wear other forms of footwear that are fashionable at this time; e.g. crocs/sandals; we ask that they bring athletic type





footwear for physical education and other activities that take place. We also ask that if your child is still learning to tie laces that you send slip-on or Velcro shoes.

St. Peter Spirit Wear

Families can order Grad Hoodies and St. Peter Spirit Wear through the Big Bear Spirit Wear Website. Usually, the orders are delivered to the school to hand out to students. All orders are to be done by going to the Big Bear Spirit Wear website.



Lice Protocol

Our protocol is as follows:

- 1. Parents report any cases of lice to the office.
- 2. If lice are found, parents are informed.
- 3. Parents treat them with products available at the Pharmacy.
- 4 If live lice or nits are present, child(ren) will not be re-admitted to class.
