- 8. School Organization and New Staff Members We have increased from 10 classrooms to 11. 3 Kindergarten, 1, 1/2, 2/3, 3, 4/5, 5/6, 6/7, 8
- 9. Niagara Nutrition Partners Our program is up and running. This organization provides snacks on a daily basis. It based on the schools' needs.
