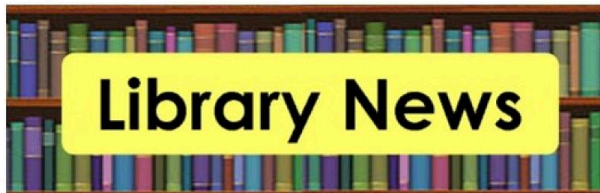
CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS

PARKING LOT AND KISS AND RIDE SAFETY



For the safety of our students, parents/guardians are reminded to please leave the bus lane open before and after school. The bus lane is closest to the school and marked with diagonal white lines. The middle lane is for kiss and ride where students can be dropped off and picked up. At the end of the day parents/guardians in the kiss and ride lane are asked to stay in their car while staff bring children directly to them. The Kiss and Ride lane has been extended and now wraps around the school near the NSTS entrance. Please continue to move your car forward once space has been made ahead of you. It is imperative that we keep the cars out of the intersection of Kalar Road and Thorold Stone Road. The third lane (closest to Kalar) is to drive through once children have been picked up. Please do not block the through lane or the cross walk. All families are always welcome to park their cars at the south end parking lot if they wish to get out of their cars to pick up their children at their respective doors. Please continue to hold your little ones' hands as you walk to your parked vehicles in the parking lots. Thank you for keeping our children safe!

Direction of School Support

School Support Designation

As a property owner in Ontario, you are required to support a school board, even if you do not have children or your children are not currently attending school. By default, your school support is directed to your municipality's English Public School Board.

In the case of a residential property occupied by tenants, they can direct the school support for that property.

Property owners, occupants, and tenants can select which school board they choose to support. Additionally, you will be able to vote in the next municipal election for trustees for the school board that you choose to support.

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is legislatively required to collect school support information and provide it in the assessment roll to every municipality and school board.

Changing your school support online



Based on your eligibility, property owners and tenants registered with MPAC can view and update the school support designation online.

To learn more about eligibility requirements or change your school support designation, please visit mpac.ca/schoolsupport or scan the QR code.

What if I have difficulty updating my school support online?

A step-by-step guide is available on mpac.ca which will help users navigate MPAC's school support portal. Alternatively, you can obtain the Application for Direction of School Support (ADSS) Form from mpac.ca or from your school board's office. 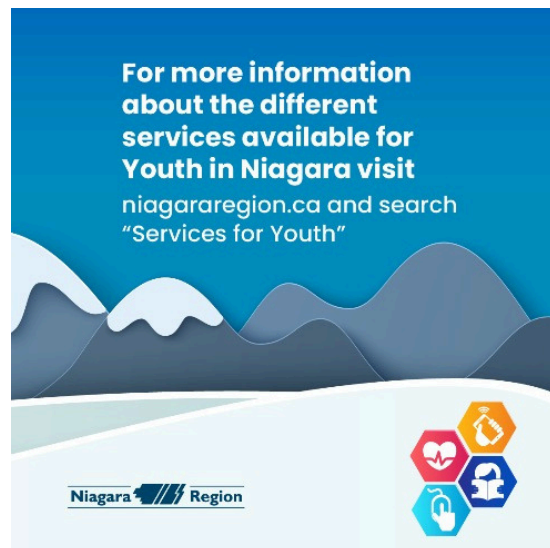
