THE COLD WEATHER HAS ARRIVED!

Cold weather is here! Please ensure that your child comes to school prepared to participate in all activities, especially outdoor recess. All children should have hats, scarves, gloves, warm coats and boots. Labeling your child's clothing saves a lot of stress on their part and expense on yours.

On extremely cold days, we limit the amount of time that students spend outdoors. We obtain our weather information from the Environment Canada Weather Information Line and follow Board

guidelines. With the exception of these occasions, it is our expectation that all children will go out for recess. In addition to proper outdoor attire, indoor shoes are essential to keep our classrooms and hallways safe and to participate safely in physical education classes.

With the number of students in our school, it is imperative that we all emphasize the dangers of throwing snowballs. Please make sure your children are aware of the possible dangers/consequences of throwing snowballs. No one wants anyone to be hurt or injured in any way. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated. The following playground rules are in effect for the Winter Season:

No throwing snowballs, no kicking or throwing snow at other students. No breaking of others' snow forts.

Please be advised that students engaging in these types of behaviours will be dealt with immediately. If this behaviour continues, parents will be contacted and further consequences will come into effect.

'Tis the Season

'Tis the season for colds and flu. Please do not send your child to school if he/she is not well. Children may not be kept in for recesses or lunch time when they are sent to school ill as staff are often involved with meetings and supervision. Allow your child the time to get better before sending him/her to school. This is particularly true this year as everyone is working extremely hard to keep one another safe.

NCDSB Elementary Standardized Dress Code

Shirts

- Navy blue or white oxford-style long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt.
- Navy blue or white polo-style long-sleeved or short-sleeved shirt.
- School-designed spirit wear including shirts, sweaters or hoodies.
- All sweaters must be navy blue or white.



Pants / Skirts

- Navy blue sweat-pants for students in Kindergarten to Grade 3.
- Navy blue pants - Dress, Cargo, Denim, Kobe, Corduroy style.
- Navy blue skorts or dresses - length must be appropriate and modest.
- Navy blue walking shorts or capris or Grade 8 students have the option of wearing grey secondary uniform pants.

Shoes

- In an effort to limit student traffic in hallways and keep students and staff safe, families are advised that students will not require a pair of indoor shoes to start the school year. We ask that parents/ guardians please ensure that students come to school each day wearing appropriate and comfortable closed-toe footwear (i.e. running shoes with proper ankle support) that they can remain in throughout the duration of the school day. We also ask that if your child is still learning to tie laces that you send slip on or Velcro shoes
