## INCLEMENT WEATHER/ BUS CANCELLATIONS

As the winter months approach, we would like to take this opportunity to review the procedure:

1. If bus transportation is cancelled in the morning, it means that the children will not be picked up at the end of the day. If you drive your child to school on the day transportation is cancelled, it is your responsibility to pick your child up at the end of the day.

When transportation services are cancelled, only the school remains open, and it is the responsibility of the parent to determine whether or not it is safe for your child to attend school.

If your child is not coming to school, please report the absence using Safe Arrival System. If the entire system is shut down, we will call, email and text your family using School Messenger by 6am to advise you it's a snow day. You do not need to report your child's absence from school, as schools are closed.

Niagara Catholic communicates decisions about bus and/or school cancellations by 6 a.m. You will find the information in the following places:

If your child is staying home due to a bus cancellation or a school closure, they will have the opportunity to participate in asynchronous learning from home. Click here for Kindergarten, Primary, Junior, Intermediate and Secondary literacy, numeracy, and other subjects for students to keep up with work if that is what you choose to do. Please note that participating in this work is voluntary, and should be considered as revising or reach-ahead work, rather than teacher-led new learning.

- 2. Procedures Relating to Inclement Weather AFTER the School Day starts: In this case either:
- a) Transportation is cancelled and school is kept open.
- b) Transportation is cancelled and the school is closed.

The safety of our children is our primary concern; the school will attempt to contact you by phone should an emergency closing be necessary after children have arrived at school. This will be done solely for the purpose of informing you that classes have been cancelled. The option you, as a parent, have chosen on the Emergency School Form will apply to all emergency dismissals.

# **Grade 7 Vaccines Catch Up**

Niagara Region Public Health has completed all fall school-based immunization clinics for the following publicly funded routine school vaccinations:

- Meningococcal
- Hepatitis B
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV)



Grade 7 students who missed their school immunization clinic can receive these vaccines through the following options:

- Niagara Region Public Health vaccination clinics book an appointment at a community clinic by calling the Vaccine Preventable Disease Program at 905-688-8248 ext. 7425
- Family doctor or Nurse Practitioner— Contact your health care provider to discuss vaccine availability. If you do not have one, you can check with a local walk-in clinic.

- 2. They have had episodes of vomiting or diarrhea within the past 24 hours
- 3. They are not well enough to participate in class

## **Snow Safety for Kids**

Embrace the thrill of tobogganing this winter, but remember, safety comes first! Whether your child is racing down the slopes or enjoying a leisurely ride, follow these snow safety tips to make the most of winter adventures:

- 1. Gear Up: Wear appropriate winter gear such as gloves, and sturdy boots to provide protection from the cold.
- 2. Choose Safe Hills: Opt for designated tobogganing hills that are free from obstacles like trees, rocks, or traffic. Avoid hills with steep inclines or crowded areas.
- 3. Follow Etiquette: Be mindful of others on the hill. Encourage your child to wait their turn and choose a clear path to avoid collisions. Respect the space and safety of fellow tobogganers.
- 4. Think Safety: Help your child to sit facing forward on the toboggan with their feet first. Remind tobogganers to hold on firmly and avoid standing or kneeling during the ride.
- 5. Stay Visible: If tobogganing in the evening, ensure visibility. Wear bright colours and consider adding reflective elements to clothing.

### KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM

Children who will be four years of age by December 31, 2025, are eligible to enroll in the Kindergarten. Please supply the following documents for your child:

- Birth
- Baptismal Certificates (if applicable)
- Proof of Address (e.g. utility bill/lease agreement/tax statement)
   (actual copies of all documents will need to be seen by office administration)

Students currently attending first year Kindergarten will be automatically enrolled in second year of September 2025.

Parents/Guardians are asked to register their child online at <a href="www.niagaracatholic.ca">www.niagaracatholic.ca</a>. If you know of any eligible neighbours, friends or relatives, please encourage them to contact us at St. Elizabeth Catholic Elementary School, and enroll their children in a catholic school. Our flourishing community needs active support from its members. Registrations will be accepted at any time throughout the year, however, early registration helps with the necessary planning and preparation for your child. An open house for parents will be held on <a href="Wednesday">Wednesday</a>, <a href="February 5">February 5</a>, 2025.

The Niagara Catholic District School Board is proud to offer parents and students the opportunity to enroll in a French Immersion (FI) Program. This program is designed specifically for students whose first language is not French. French Immersion in the Niagara Catholic District School Board is an **optional** program.

# All 5 French Immersion Catholic Elementary Schools will accept registrations for Grade 1 along with Kindergarten for September 2025.

Listed below are the designated elementary schools that provide the French Immersion Program:

- Notre Dame Catholic Elementary, Niagara Falls Begins in Kindergarten
- Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Elementary, Niagara Falls Begins in Kindergarten
- Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Elementary, St. Catharine's Begins in Kindergarten
- Alexander Kuska Catholic Elementary, Welland Begins in Kindergarten
- St. John Catholic Elementary, Beamsville Begins in Kindergarten

#### **Transportation**

All students enrolled in the French Immersion Program will be provided with transportation to their local Family of Schools designated French Immersion School site in accordance with the Board's Transportation of Student Policy #500.2. Designated Family of Schools French Immersion schools can be located at the following link www.niagaracatholic.ca.

### French Immersion On-line Open Pre-Registration

- On-line open pre-registration window for students **new** to French Immersion in September 2025: **Monday, January 13**th, **2025** at **7:30 a.m.** through to **Friday, January 31**st, **2025** at **4:00 p.m.**
- Pre-registrations outside of this window will **not** be considered.
- There are a limited number of spots available for students wishing to enter the French Immersion Program.
- Pre-registrations are on a first come, first serve basis. Each pre-registration will receive a time-stamp.
- Please visit <a href="www.niagaracatholic.ca">www.niagaracatholic.ca</a> and click the first thumbnail-Registration. Then, click the <a href="Let's get you registered">Let's get you registered</a>! link at the bottom of the page.
- An account must be created first through edsembli CONNECT to access the registration forms. This account can be created ahead of time.

#### **Selection Process**

In accordance with the Board's Admission of Elementary and Secondary Students Policy #301.1, there are a limited number of spots available for students entering the program. Eligible spots will be determined on a first come, first serve basis for each elementary French Immersion school site. Applicants will receive notification by **Monday**, **March 3**rd, **2025** to inform them if their children have been placed in the French Immersion program **OR** if their children have been placed on the school's waitlist. Applicants who have not received notification by **March 3**rd, **2025** are to contact the elementary French Immersion school site directly.
