# **Bell Let's Talk Day**

Bell "Let's Talk" Day is on **January 22, 2025.** The Bell "Let's Talk Day" helps to promote awareness and action with a strategy built on 4 key pillars: fighting stigma, improving access to mental health care,

### **Bus Cancellations**

On days when there are bus cancellations, parents/ guardians of students who normally ride the bus are to report, using the electronic Safe Arrival program, their child(ren) as absent if they are not sending them to school. It is only if schools are closed, by the Director of Education, due to inclement weather or any other reason that student absences do not need to be reported. Teachers are to mark any student absent who is not in class as they normally would.

The system will then contact parents/guardians who have not reported their child as absent. Please ensure if you do bring your child to school that arrangements are made for dismissal. Students should know the plan for the end of the day. Thank you for your support.

### French Immersion On-Line Open Pre-Registration For September 2025

The Niagara Catholic District School Board is proud to offer parents and students the opportunity to enroll in a French Immersion (FI) Program. This program is designed specifically for students whose first language is not French. French Immersion in the Niagara Catholic District School Board is an optional program.

All 5 French Immersion Catholic Elementary Schools will accept registrations for Grade 1 along with Kindergarten for September 2025. Listed below are the designated elementary schools that provide the French Immersion Program:

- Notre Dame Catholic Elementary, Niagara Falls Begins in Kindergarten
- Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Elementary, Niagara Falls Begins in Kindergarten
- Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Elementary, St. Catharines Begins in Kindergarten
- Alexander Kuska Catholic Elementary, Welland Begins in Kindergarten
- St. John Catholic Elementary, Beamsville Begins in Kindergarten

#### Transportation

All students enrolled in the French Immersion Program will be provided with transportation to their local Family of Schools designated French Immersion School site in accordance with the Board's Transportation of Student Policy #500.2. ### French Immersion On-line Open Pre-Registration

• On-line open pre-registration window for students new to French Immersion in September 2024: Monday, January 13th, 2025 at 7:30 a.m. through to Friday, January 31st, 2025 at 4:00 p.m.

- Pre-registrations outside of this window will not be considered.
- There are a limited number of spots available for students wishing to enter the French Immersion Program.

• Pre-registrations are on a first come, first serve basis. Each pre-registration will receive a timestamp.

- Please visit <u>www.niagaracatholic.ca</u> and click the first thumbnail-Registration. Then, click the Let's get you registered! link at the bottom of the page.
- An account must be created first through edsembli CONNECT to access the registration forms. This account can be created ahead of time.

#### Selection Process

In accordance with the Board's Admission of Elementary and Secondary Students Policy #301.1, there are a limited number of spots available for students entering the program. Eligible spots will be determined on a first come, first serve basis for each elementary French Immersion school site. Applicants will receive notification by **Monday, March 3rd, 2025** to inform them if their children have been placed in the French Immersion program OR if their children have been placed on the school's waitlist. Applicants who have not received notification by **March 3rd, 2025** are to contact the elementary French Immersion school site directly.

# **Skating Grades 4-8**

On Thursday January 16 and Thursday March 27, the students in grades 4 thru 8 classes will have the opportunity to participate in our skating program. Students will be traveling by bus from Mary Ward Catholic School to the Gale Centre. This trip supports the expectations taught this year in the Health & Physical Education curriculum. There is a \$5.00 cost that will help cover the costs of buses and the arena rental. Payment may be made through School Cash Online. Mary Ward staff will assist with skates and watch students on ice. Parents are welcome to join us at the arena, skate



with their son/daughter or watch their child skate from the stands. Any parent able to assist with skate tying is welcome as well.

Students not attending the skating program will remain at school and will complete activities assigned by their classroom teacher.

Students must have the following equipment to participate in the skating field trip: Their own skates (cannot share with another student) and a CSA approved hockey helmet with a chin-strap (a cage is not necessary).

Students are encouraged to bring hockey gloves/mittens/winter gloves and a separate bag in which skates, helmet and gloves can be transported, as the blades of the skates can be sharp.

Immunization Connect is a quick, confidential, and secure system where you can access your child's vaccination record and report vaccines.

Report every time your child receives a vaccine directly to Public Health with Immunization Connect. Health care providers do not do this for you.
