

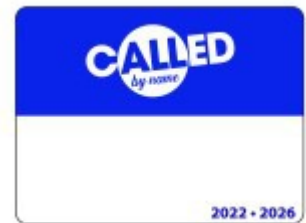

## Weekly Update February 17 - 21, 2025

Dear St. Anthony Family,

The students seem to be really enjoying Kids Helping Kids week. It was fun seeing their different outfits. We have one more week of activities ahead. See the attached Kids Helping Kids Outline below to view the upcoming events of next week. We hope you were able to get through the snow day yesterday. We're sorry many students missed our Valentine's themed day. Any cookies or candy grams ordered will be given out on Tuesday. The portal is still open if you wish to donate to our Kids Helping Kids campaign benefitting the Niagara Children's Centre.

We also had Ms. Lezlie Harper from Niagara Bound Tours visit us this past week. Ms. Harper has a wealth of knowledge and personal history related to the black community in Canada and the Niagara Region more specifically. Ms. Harper spoke with our students in grade 4 - 8, engaging them and inspiring them to ask questions about parts of our history that they were not aware. We look forward to learning more of the rich history the Niagara Region has with regards to black migration into Canada when we welcome Ms. Rochelle Bush from Tubman Tours to speak to our students on February 28th. She will be speaking to three different groups that day and we welcome any parents that may be interested are welcome to join us. We ask that you please check in at the office. We have two presentations that day. The first from 11:30-12:30 and the second from 1:30-2:30.



With yesterday's snow day came a reminder of how important it is that we use the SafeArrival portal for reporting absences. With around 70% of students staying home a good portion of Miss Kim's morning was spent on tracking down absent students. It is quick and easy to access. There is a link below on how to add it to your cellphone or a phone number you can call to submit their absence. If you happen to forget, a phone call will be generated by our system. Please listen to the call and respond accordingly. This will save us a great deal of time and also help us to ensure that your children are safe and accounted for.

The same goes for our online payment portal, SchoolCashOnline. For accounting purposes, this is the best way to keep track of payments and alleviates precious teaching time being interrupted. Almost all purchases must be made through SchoolCashOnline as well as many permission slips and consent forms. This is how we operate all across Niagara Catholic and will be required once entering High School. If you need assistance, please come into the main office and one of us will help to get you signed up. All year end field trips will be posted online, we don't want any student missing out if they desire to attend so please let us know and we can help you.

The report card portal is now up and running. You can access it from the board website or by clicking [here](#) to take you directly there. If it directs you to change your password use your email address as the USERNAME and PASSWORD to get a temporary password that can then be changed again. If you are still experiencing difficulties, please contact the school so that we can ensure we have the same email address on file that you are using. It would be the email address from where you received this weekly update.

Tomorrow is a PD Day and thus no school for students. Monday we all get to spend time with our loved ones as we celebrate Family Day in Ontario. We hope the extra-long weekend allows you to spend cherished moments with your family. We will see everyone back on Tuesday morning.

Please take note of the busy four-day week coming up. There are a great deal of activities going on. Please note that Pita Pit Day that was scheduled for Thursday, February 13 will be moved to Tuesday, February 18. All students who ordered for this week will receive their orders on Tuesday. 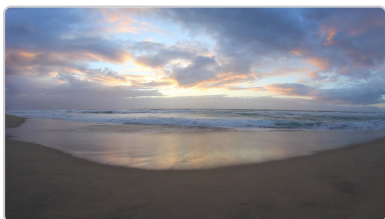

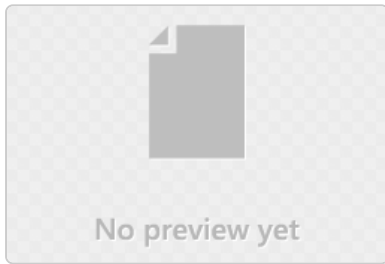
